**ORDER OF  
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE**

The Minnesota Board of Psychology (hereinafter "Board"), having convened on January 13, 1995, to review the petition of James M. Alsdurf, Ph.D., L.P. (hereinafter "Licensee"), for reinstatement of an unconditional license to practice psychology, determines that:

a. Licensee has engaged in ethical consultation, completed a course in the diagnosis and treatment of psychopathology, and has practiced under supervision as required by the terms of a November 3, 1989 Consent Order of Restricted and Conditional License.

b. Licensee also has completed a course in professional boundaries training and the Board has received a report from the instructor of the course. The report supports the conclusion that Licensee has demonstrated knowledge of boundary and ethical issues encountered in practice and the ability to appropriately handle boundaries issues in his practice, including the ability to resolve conflicts in his practice and the ability to recognize and deal with transference issues.

c. Based on the foregoing, the Board concludes that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled the order issued by the Board on November 3, 1989, and hereby issues the following ORDER:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that an unconditional license to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota be conferred upon Licensee, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.
