**ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL
LICENSE**

1. The Minnesota Board of Physical Therapy ("Board"), having issued an Order of Suspension on February 9, 2016, pertaining to the license of Shane E. McComas, P.T.A. ("Respondent") to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Minnesota, at this time considers additional information and the process within the original Order to declare an unconditional license, based on the following:
2. The Minnesota Board of Physical Therapy ("Board") is authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 148.65 through 148.78 (2014) to license, regulate, and discipline persons who apply for, petition, or hold licenses to practice as physical therapist assistants in the State of Minnesota and is further authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 214.10 and 214.103 (2014) to review complaints against licensees and initiate appropriate disciplinary action.
3. Shane E. McComas, P.T.A. ("Respondent"), has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board from which he holds a license to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Minnesota.
4. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 214.101, subds. 1 and 4 (2014), the license of a physical therapist assistant must be suspended if the licensee is found by a court, administrative law judge, or public authority to be in arrears in child support or maintenance payments or both.

5. On or about January 22, 2016, the Board received a Notice to Suspend Occupational or Professional License(s) from Hubbard County Social Service Center, Park Rapids, Minnesota, which advised the Board that Respondent was not in compliance with a court order for child support; and that under Minn. Stat. § 518A.66 (2014), the Board must suspend Respondent's license to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Minnesota.
6. Respondent's license to practice as a physical therapist assistant was suspended effective January 22, 2016. According to the Order, the suspension was to remain in effect until such time as the Board received notification from the court, administrative law judge, or public authority that referred this matter to the Board confirming that Respondent is in compliance with his court order for child support.
7. The Board has now received notification from Hubbard County Social Services indicating that Respondent is in compliance, and allowing the Board to remove the suspension on Respondent's license.
8. The authority to sign orders suspending licenses pursuant to a Notice to Suspend Occupational or Professional License(s) has been delegated to the Executive Director of the Board.

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ORDER

1. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the JANUARY 2016 suspension of Respondent's license to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Minnesota shall be **RESCINDED**, and have no future force or effect.

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an unconditional license to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Minnesota be conferred upon Respondent, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.
