Agenda Item 1: Call to Order and Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by Board President Subbarao Inampudi, M.B., B.S., FACR. Roll call was taken by Board staff.

Agenda Item 2: Minutes of the November 14, 2015, Board Meeting

The minutes of the November 14, 2015, Board meeting were received and approved as circulated.

Additional Agenda Item: New Health Licensing Boards' Advisory Attorney

Dr. Inampudi informed the Board that Jason Pleggenkuhle, J.D., Assistant Attorney General is transferring to the Consumer Fraud Division of the Attorney General's Office and will no longer provide legal support to the health licensing Boards effective February 1, 2016. Mr. Pleggenkuhle introduced the Board's new legal support, Assistant Attorney General Brian Williams, J.D. The Board gave a round of applause to Mr. Pleggenkuhle and Mr. Williams.

Agenda Item 6: Policy and Planning Committee Report, December 8, 2015

Policy & Planning Committee Chair V. John Ella, J.D., presented the December 8, 2015, Policy & Planning Committee minutes and provided a report to the Board.

- Name on License
The Policy & Planning Committee passed a motion to recommend that licenses be issued in the applicant's full legal name.
- Delegation to Staff to Issue License/Registration
The Policy & Planning Committee passed a motion to recommend the Board delegate authority to Licensure staff to issue credentials when the credential is not subject to disciplinary action. This issue is deferred to a future Board meeting.
- Potential Changes to the Medical Practice Act
The Policy & Planning Committee discussed potential changes to the Medical Practice Act and decided to pursue changes during the 2017 legislative session rather than the abbreviated 2016 legislative session.

Agenda Item 7: Delegation of Authority to Approve Confidential Monitoring Plans

At the November 14, 2015, Board meeting, the Board delegated authority to the Executive Director to sign and fully execute Confidential Monitoring Plans, developed pursuant to Minnesota Statute §214.23, Subdivision 2, relating to regulated persons infected with HIV, HBV or HCV.

For clarification purposes, the Board is asked to also delegate authority on its behalf to the Licensure and Complaint Review Committees to approve and enter into Confidential Monitoring Plans on behalf of the Board.

After a brief discussion, a motion was made and passed unanimously to delegate authority on its behalf to the Licensure and Complaint Review Committees to approve and enter into Confidential Monitoring Plans with regulated persons, established pursuant to Minnesota Statute §214.23, Subdivision 2.

Agenda Item 8: Executive Director's Report

Ms. Martinez provided a summary of the Executive Director's Report.

- State Opioid Oversight Project (SOOP) Work Group
The Board participates in regular meetings of the SOOP work group. Most recently, the Board initiated an invitation to the Minnesota Hospital Association and the Minnesota Alliance for Patient Safety to engage with the group on public relations efforts.
- Interstate Collaboration in Healthcare Group
Regular conference calls on specific topics of interest continue, specifically on the topic of the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC). Representatives from the Collaboration have attended the first two IMLC Commission meetings.
- The National Governor's Association (NGA) Health Care Workforce Technical Assistance Program
Minnesota's proposal for the National Governor's Association State Health Care Workforce Technical Assistance Program (NGA-TA Program) on advancing scope-of-practice policy has been accepted. The tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Pharmacy and Nursing (Boards), along with the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), National Center for Interprofessional Practice & Education at the University of Minnesota, HealthForce Minnesota, Governor's office, and Minnesota Legislature are represented on the Core Team. Minnesota's proposed goals include development of a consensus framework for evaluating scope-of-practice proposals at the Legislature, support of scope-of-practice changes recently enacted, and identify needs and opportunities for future scope-of-practice changes. Ms. Martinez will keep the Board informed.

- Immigrant International Medical Graduate (IIMG) Stakeholder Advisory Group
Board representatives Molly Schwanz and Ruth Martinez are currently participating on a Licensure Study work group and a Non-physician Pathways work group. Ms. Schwanz attended the larger stakeholder group on January 5, 2016, at which time the work groups summarized their activities.

Ms. Martinez stated that the IIMG Stakeholder Advisory Group meetings are public. Some Board members have expressed interest in attending the IIMG Stakeholder Advisory Group meeting. Board members are welcome to attend. Ms. Martinez will forward notices of the meetings to all Board members.

Ms. Schwanz provided a summary of the January 5, 2016, IIMG Stakeholder Advisory Group meeting.

A discussion ensued regarding why the IIMG Stakeholder Advisory Group was created, concern about proposed apprenticeship programs that would bypass accredited clinical training requirements and possible changes to the Medical Practice Act.

- MN Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) Advisory Task Force
The PMP Advisory Task Force supports legislation again this session including expanded access to the PMP by health licensing boards when an investigation is pending. As previously noted, plans to embed a link to PMP registration in the Board of Medical Practice on-line renewal processes is underway and expected to be completed in March 2016. Several of the other Health Licensing Boards are also planning to embed a link to PMP registration.
- MN Physician Publishing
An article by Dr. Jon Thomas was recently published regarding the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC). Also, Dr. Hafner-Fogarty wrote an article on Physician Burnout that was published in June 2015. The tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy are working together to finalize an article on regulatory collaboration for publication this spring.
- Outreach
Representatives of the health licensing boards and the Health Professionals Services Program met with Governor Dayton's policy advisor to discuss upcoming legislation. Executive Directors of the Board of Medical Practice, Board of Nursing and the Minnesota Alliance for Patient Safety (MAPS) met to discuss how we can continue to collaborate on patient safety efforts. Board staff met by teleconference with Carol Clothier from the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) to discuss Minnesota's position on maintenance of certification.
- Conferences and Meetings
Dec. 18, 2015: Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Commission (IMLCC) Meeting
Commissioners Thomas and Martinez attended the second meeting of the IMLCC in Salt Lake City, Utah. Prior to the IMLCC meeting, Dr. Thomas and Ms. Martinez participated in a number of committee meetings addressing bylaws and rules, funding and technology. Minnesota will host the next meeting of the IMLCC on March 31 – April 1, 2016, at the Department of Revenue, Stassen Building. The meeting is open to the public. Board members and other interested parties are invited to attend. Details will be forthcoming.
- Staffing
On December 2, 2015, Elizabeth Larson was welcomed to Board staff as a Licensure Specialist.

- Legislation

Board staff continues to meet with legislators regarding the upcoming 2016 “short” session, paving the way for legislative action on the following bills:

- SF 454: Physician assistant housekeeping modifications; temporary suspension process alignment;
- HF 1923: Osteopathic physician housekeeping modifications

Representatives in the House were encouraging that these bills may pass this session.

- Other Items not in Executive Director's Report

1. The Office of Administrative Hearings(OAH) 40th anniversary Celebration

OAH is hosting a reception on January 21, 2016, at Mitchell Hamline School of Law. Any interested Board member may attend. Board staff will forward the invitation to Board members.

2. The Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board Notice

The Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board have sent letters notifying Board members to review their Statements of Economic Interest annually and make any modifications necessary. Board members are required to review and recertify even if nothing has changed. Ms. Martinez noted that there is a \$10.00 penalty if the January 25, 2016 deadline is missed.

Agenda Item 9: Federation of State Medical Boards' (FSMB) Annual Meeting Issues

The FSMB informed Ms. Martinez that space has been reserved for the Minnesota Welcome Reception and will be included in the main agenda for the FSMB 2016 Annual Meeting. The Reception will be held on Wednesday evening, April 27, 2016. Ms. Martinez encouraged Board members to attend the Reception at the FSMB. The Reception is very well received and grows every year.

Ms. Martinez reminded Board members that if they have comments on the FSMB Model Policy, to submit them soon.

Ms. Martinez informed Board members that if they wish to participate on any FSMB Committee, please notify the FSMB. If Board members are appointed to a FSMB Committee, please contact Executive Assistant Cheryl Johnston for tracking national activities and reporting in the Board's Biennial Report.

A motion was made and passed unanimously to accept the above 2016 Board Committee Appointments.

Agenda Item 12: Appointees to Advisory Groups

The following representatives were appointed to the below advisory committees, taskforces and workgroups:

- Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) Advisory Taskforce
Former Board member Alfred V. Anderson, D.C., M.D., is currently representing the Board on the PMP Advisory Taskforce. Dr. Inampudi noted that Dr. Anderson has done a great job and the Board appreciates it. Dr. Inampudi thought it more appropriate that a current Board member serve on the committee rather than a previous Board member. Dr. Inampudi appointed Mark Eggen, M.D., as the Board's representative to the PMP Advisory Taskforce. Dr. Inampudi called for a volunteer to serve as the alternate representative on the PMP Advisory Taskforce. Allen Rasmussen, M.A., was appointed as the Board's alternate.
- Health Professionals Services Program (HPSP) – Program Committee
Dr. Eggen is currently representing the Board on the HPSP Program Committee and Mr. Kaplan currently serves as the alternate. Dr. Inampudi proposed that Mr. Rasmussen represent the Board on the HPSP Program Committee. Mr. Rasmussen currently serves as Chair of the HPSP Program Committee representing the Board of Dentistry. Mr. Rasmussen's term on the Dentistry Board will end this year.

Mr. Rasmussen was appointed as the Board's representative to the HPSP Program Committee. He recommended that executive directors of the health licensing Boards should also serve on the HPSP Program Committee since they understand how the Board and Program interact and how it impacts the Board's budget. Mr. Rasmussen recommended that Ms. Martinez serve as the alternate to the HPSP Program Committee. Mr. Kaplan agreed and Ms. Martinez was appointed as the Board's alternate.

- Immigrant International Medical Graduates Stakeholder Group
Ms. Schwanz will remain the representative of the Board to the IIMG Stakeholder Group. Dr. Inampudi noted Ms. Schwanz is doing a great job. Dr. Inampudi requested that all Board members receive notice of the IIMG Stakeholder Group meetings, which are open to the public.
- State Opioid Oversight Project Work Group
Currently Dr. Eggen and Ms. Martinez are representing the Board on the State Opioid Oversight Project Work Group. Charles Moldow, M.D., expressed interest in representing the Board. After a brief discussion, Ms. Martinez and Dr. Eggen were appointed to represent the Board on the SOOP Work Group. Ms. Martinez will send notices of the meetings to Dr. Moldow to he can attend the SOOP Work Group. The SOOP Work Group encourages additional engagement.
- Council of Health Boards
Dr. Inampudi and Ms. Martinez will represent the Board on the Council of Health Boards. The Council hasn't meet in the past four years. The Council usually convenes when there is a new license type being considered for regulation and then it reports back to legislators on its findings.

Agenda Item 13: Educational Sessions for Board Meetings in 2016

- Dr. Inampudi reviewed a listing of past requested educational sessions.

Educational Sessions Already Presented:

- Landscape of the Corporate Practice of Medicine presented by Mr. Pleggenkuhle on September 12, 2015;
- Misdiagnosis and Missed Diagnoses as Identified in Malpractice Cases was presented by Laurie Drill-Mellum, M.D., M.P.H., on July 18, 2015.
- Previously Requested Educational Sessions, Not Yet Presented:
 - Naturopathic Doctor Duties

Dr. Thomas recommended an educational component on the role and duties of Naturopathic doctors. Ms. Martinez suggested that Helen Soley, N.D., Chair of the Registered Naturopathic Doctor Advisory Council, provide the presentation. Ms. Soley was instrumental in gaining licensure for Naturopathic doctors in Minnesota. Educational components on other non-physician professions regulated by the Board may also be of interest.
 - The Non-Valid use of HCG for Weight Loss

Mr. Kaplan previously suggested a presentation on HCG for weight loss by a Florida physician who stated that he is an expert on this subject and who volunteered to provide a presentation to the Board. Mr. Leach contacted the physician but presentation arrangements were not formalized. The Joint CRC Committee met and decided against the presentation because of the bias represented by a special interest. The Board may reconsider a presentation on the non-valid use of HCG for weight loss at a future date.
 - Role and Responsibilities of Medical Directors

Mr. Kaplan suggested a presentation on hormone injection providers, who are not physicians. Ms. Martinez suggested the presentation be more broadly based on the role and responsibilities of a medical director, how a medical director uses his or her medical license and how he or she delegates duties to other licensed and unlicensed personnel.
 - Department of Corrections Healthcare System

Mr. Kaplan suggested a presentation by the Department of Corrections to talk about its healthcare system. Since they last presented to the Board, they have obtained a different healthcare vendor.
 - Polygraph Demonstration

A polygraph demonstration was presented by Mike Sommer on May 12, 2012. The Board will determine if they'd like to have another polygraph demonstration.
 - Minnesota Medical Association (MMA) Role as it Relates to the Board of Medical Practice

The presentation on the Minnesota Medical Association (MMA) role as it relates to the Board of Medical Practice was originally suggested by Dr. Eduardo T. Fernandes.

At the current Board meeting, Dr. Hafner-Fogarty believes this is a broader issue than just MMA. Dr. Hafner-Fogarty suggested that it be addressed in a form of a discussion of the different advocacy and regulators. The real policy issue is the roles of advocacy and regulation. Dr. Inampudi agreed and suggested it be assigned to the Policy and Planning Committee.
 - Physician Wellness Services

Dr. Hafner-Fogarty suggested a presentation from Physician Wellness Services that provides services for disruptive behavior, stress, and burn-out.

- Requested Presentations at the Current Board Meeting:
 - Drug Screen Process

Mr. Kaplan suggested a presentation from a drug testing laboratory to provide an overview of the drug screen process. Fred Apple, PhD., presented this subject at the July 10, 2010, Board meeting.
 - Providing Healthcare in 2016 – Medical Model

Mr. Ella suggested an education session on large healthcare systems. What are the pressures doctors have in terms of being employed by a large healthcare system? How do the large healthcare systems operate? Dr. Inampudi offered to identify someone from a large healthcare system to give a 30 minute presentation to the Board to provide a snapshot of a large healthcare system.
 - Attorney General's Office Presentation on Physician Owned Surgical, Imaging, and Oncology Centers

Mr. Kaplan suggested that the Attorney General's Office provide a short presentation regarding the growth of privately owned surgical centers by physicians and self-referring to their own surgical center.

Dr. Hafner-Fogarty suggested that the educational session also include imaging centers and oncology centers. Mr. Kaplan agreed.

Dr. Inampudi suggested that, within a couple of weeks, Board staff summarize the topics and distribute to Board members for input.

Agenda Item 14: Corrective and Other Actions

The Corrective and other actions were presented for Board information only.

Agenda Item 15: New Business

- 2016 Joint Statement on the Impact of Health Conditions and Medication Use on the Operation of Vehicles

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) has recommended that healthcare providers discuss with patients the effect their medical condition and medication use may have on their ability to safely operate a vehicle in any mode of transportation.

The Tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy developed a joint statement offering guidance to licensees. Ms. Martinez requests that the Board approve the 2016 Joint Statement on the Impact of Health Conditions and Medication Use on the Operation of Vehicles (included in Board agenda).

Ms. Martinez explained that the Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing, and Pharmacy received a letter from Governor Dayton asking how the Boards will respond to the NTSB guidance request that he received. BACKGROUND:

The Policy & Planning Committee met at 8:00 a.m., prior to the March 12, 2016, Board meeting.

The Committee discussed a bill and amendment regarding licensing of genetic counselors, H.F. 978 (attached). The bill was introduced last session in the House. This year, the bill was introduced in a prehearing session in the House Licensing Subcommittee. Ruth Martinez, M.A., Executive Director provided the Board's comments related to issuance of a "provisional license" pending an applicant being fully certified by the ABGC or ABMG as a genetic counselor. Amended language was crafted in response to the Board's concern (attached). The revised language repeals the provisional license and, instead, creates a licensure exemption for a student or intern working in an educational program under direct supervision, much as physicians are allowed to practice as interns/residents without being required to obtain licensure.

The Policy and Planning Committee will provide an oral recommendation whether the Board should take a position on the bill.

Matthew Bergeron, J.D., Genetic Counselor's Association Lobbyist, will be in attendance at the Board meeting to answer questions Board members may have regarding this bill.

1.14 Subd. 4. **ACGC.** "ACGC" means the Accreditation Council for Genetic Counseling,
1.15 a specialized program accreditation board for educational training programs granting
1.16 master's degrees or higher in genetic counseling, or its successor organization.

1.17 Subd. 5. **Board.** "Board" means the Board of Medical Practice.

1.18 Subd. 6. **Eligible status.** "Eligible status" means an applicant who has met the
1.19 requirements and received approval from the ABGC to sit for the certification examination.

1.20 Subd. 7. **Genetic counseling.** "Genetic counseling" means the provision of services
1.21 described in section 147F.03 to help clients and their families understand the medical,
1.22 psychological, and familial implications of genetic contributions to a disease or medical
1.23 condition.

2.1 Subd. 8. **Genetic counselor.** "Genetic counselor" means an individual licensed
 2.2 under sections 147F.01 to 147F.17 to engage in the practice of genetic counseling.

2.3 Subd. 9. **Licensed physician.** "Licensed physician" means an individual who is
 2.4 licensed to practice medicine under chapter 147.

2.5 Subd. 10. **NSGC.** "NSGC" means the National Society of Genetic Counselors, a
 2.6 professional membership association for genetic counselors that approves continuing
 2.7 education programs.

2.8 Subd. 11. **Qualified supervisor.** "Qualified supervisor" means any person who is
 2.9 licensed under sections 147F.01 to 147F.17 as a genetic counselor or a physician licensed
 2.10 under chapter 147 to practice medicine in Minnesota.

2.11 Subd. 12. **Supervisee.** "Supervisee" means a genetic counselor with a provisional
 2.12 license.

2.13 Subd. 13. **Supervision.** "Supervision" means an assessment of the work of the

2.32 (8) identifying and using community resources that provide medical, educational,
 2.33 financial, and psychosocial support and advocacy; and

2.34 (9) providing accurate written medical, genetic, and counseling information for
 2.35 families and health care professionals.

3.1 Sec. 3. [147F.05] UNLICENSED PRACTICE PROHIBITED; PROTECTED
3.2 TITLES AND RESTRICTIONS ON USE.

3.3 Subdivision 1. Protected titles. No individual may use the title "genetic counselor,"
3.4 "licensed genetic counselor," "gene counselor," "genetic consultant," "genetic associate,"
3.5 or any words, letters, abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying that the individual
3.6 is eligible for licensure by the state as a genetic counselor unless the individual has been
3.7 licensed as a genetic counselor according to sections 147F.01 to 147F.17.

3.8 Subd. 2. Unlicensed practice prohibited. No individual may practice genetic
3.9 counseling unless the individual is licensed as a genetic counselor sections 147F.01 to
3.10 147F.17 except as otherwise provided under sections 147F.01 to 147F.17.

3.11 Subd. 3. Other practitioners. (a) Nothing in sections 147F.01 to 147F.17 shall be
3.12 construed to prohibit or restrict the practice of any profession or occupation licensed
3.13 or registered by the state by an individual duly licensed or registered to practice the

4.17 (2) evidence of graduation from an education program accredited by the ACGC or
4.18 its predecessor or successor organization;

4.19 (3) a verified copy of a valid and current certification issued by the ABGC or ABMG
4.20 as a certified genetic counselor, or by the ABMG as a certified medical geneticist;

4.21 (4) additional information as requested by the board, including any additional
4.22 information necessary to ensure that the applicant is able to practice with reasonable skill
4.23 and safety to the public;

4.24 (5) a signed statement verifying that the information in the application is true and
4.25 correct to the best of the applicant's knowledge and belief; and

4.26 (6) a signed waiver authorizing the board to obtain access to the applicant's records
4.27 in this or any other state in which the applicant completed an educational program or
4.28 engaged in the practice of genetic counseling.

4.29 Subd. 2. **Licensure by reciprocity.** To be eligible for licensure by reciprocity,
4.30 the applicant must hold a current genetic counselor or medical geneticist registration
4.31 or license in another state, the District of Columbia, or a territory of the United States,
4.32 whose standards for registration or licensure are at least equivalent to those of Minnesota,
4.33 and must:

Governance Work Group Meeting Notes January 6, 2016

In attendance: Allen Rasmussen (Program Committee Chair – representing the Board of Dentistry), Steve Gulbrandsen (Advisory Committee Chair – representing the MN Dental Association), Marshall Shragg (Board of Physical Therapy and HPSP Administering Board), Ruth Martinez (Board of Medical Practice), Shirley Brekken (Board of Nursing), Monica Feider (HPSP), and Stuart Williams (Board of Pharmacy representative on Program Committee)

The Work Group discussed the Program Committee's feedback to the proposed governance structure that was presented at the November Program Committee meeting.

- The Committee did not approve of primarily executive directors overseeing the program
- The ED forum, which is not defined in statute, cannot designate membership to a statutorily required Committee. Suggestion of having the Council of Health Boards designate Committee members makes sense.
- Should all boards participate? Most Program Committee members thought all boards should be represented. In reality, several boards rarely participate and have little investment in the program.

Minn. Stat. 214.32 describes the Program Committee's roles as:

The committee shall designate one board to provide administrative management of the program, set the program budget and the pro rata share of program expenses to be borne by each participating board, provide guidance on the general operation of the program, including hiring of program personnel, and ensure that the program's direction is in accord with its authority. If the participating boards change which board is designated to provide administrative management of the program, any appropriation remaining for the program shall transfer to the newly designated board on the effective date of the change. The participating boards must inform the appropriate legislative committees and the commissioner of management and budget of any change in the administrative management of the program, and the amount of any appropriation transferred under this provision.

Please share any suggestions you have for improving the HPSP Program Committee

- I don't think that it's very clear as to what we have the potential to accomplish. I feel like we need goals, or projects, or something to accomplish that would benefit HPSP and make us feel useful to the program. The proposed committee changes might make that possible.
- Policy work needs to be brought to the Committee. Members of the Committee should be given equal opportunity to serve on the various ad hoc committees or groups. The Board members on the Governance Workgroup were chosen in some fashion that did not allow for any expression of interest on the part of other members. There is a void in leveraging the expertise available at the Committee level when some random process is used to select members. At a minimum the rest of the Committee should be getting regular reports of the work and minutes and meeting notices and agendas. This work is taking place “off line” from the majority of the Committee and from nearly ALL of the HLB's. It is not reported to Program Committee so they can't take it back. If the HLB ED is not on the Governance group then they also have no updates for the policy boards. The HLB members are charged with public protection. Hard to do that when you don't know what is going on behind the scenes. If there are discussions with legislators or others the Committee should be informed and participate if they so choose. This is not a decision staff should be making FOR any HLB member. I think the presentation of WHY the governance was being examined was not fully disclosed to the Committee. Even in the memorandum from the last meeting it was presented as a quorum issue. It's obvious, at least to this member, that the proposed move to the Dept. of Admin was the engine driving the train. That is unacceptable, at least to me. Staff needs to be open and honest with the Committee and provide as much information and background as needed to make a good informed decision. I am not opposed to a staff recommendation or a preferred recommendation out of several but I do oppose hiding the ball. I'm more than willing to attend the legislative hearings and testify.
- I will speak to this as I learn more about the board. As a new member with one meeting under my belt, I do not believe that it would be appropriate to speak to any improvements.

INTRODUCTION

The Health Professionals Services Program (HPSP) is pleased to provide our mid-year report to the Health Licensing Boards, the HPSP Program Committee and Advisory Committees, legislators and the citizens of Minnesota. The document provides readers with information about program participation and activities that took place in the first half of fiscal year 2016 (July 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015).

MISSION AND GOALS

MISSION

Minnesota's Health Professionals Services Program protects the public by providing monitoring services to regulated health care professionals whose illnesses may impact their ability to practice safely.

GOALS

The HPSP goals are to promote early intervention, diagnosis, and treatment for health professionals with illnesses, and to provide monitoring services as an alternative to board discipline. Early intervention enhances the likelihood of successful treatment, before clinical skills or public safety are compromised.

WHAT PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS SAY

Health practitioners are referred to HPSP for the monitoring of a variety of illnesses including substance, psychiatric and other medical conditions. Many practitioners report great shame, fear and/or anxiety when reporting themselves whereas others look forward to the accountability monitoring offers.

HPSP surveys health practitioners following completion and discharge from the program. Many comments describe the structure monitoring provides is a motivating or accountability measure that helps them in following through with various treatment requirements and maintaining their sobriety. A sampling of these comments are listed below:

- *HPSP kept me accountable. I also knew my license was safe as long as I was following HPSP guidelines.*
- *I really felt it was a supportive program rather than one that was punitive. It helped me get a solid foundation in my recovery by helping plant the seed...that will be a part of my future...*
- *The whole program kept me staying on track to my recovery.*
- *Monitoring with screens gave me a period of accountability that was very helpful.*

In addition to the above, practitioners are increasingly asking for more online services. HPSP will focus on this in the coming years.

PROGRAM PARTICIPATION

DEFINITIONS OF REFERRAL SOURCES

HPSP's intake process is fairly consistent, regardless of how licensees are referred for monitoring. The program is responsible for evaluating the licensee's eligibility for services and whether an illness is present that warrants monitoring. If it is determined that a licensee has an illness that warrants monitoring, a Participation Agreement is developed and monitoring is initiated. Practitioners can be referred to HPSP in the following ways:

1. **Self-Referrals:** Licensees refer themselves directly to the program.
2. **Third-Party Referrals:** The most common referrals from third parties are from employers and treatment providers. The identity of all third party reporters is confidential.
3. **Board Referrals:** Participating boards have three options for referring licensees to HPSP:
 - a. **Determine Eligibility (Board Voluntary):** The boards refer because there appears to be an illness to be monitored but a diagnosis is not known.
 - b. **Follow-up to Diagnosis and Treatment (Board Voluntary):** The board has determined that the licensee has an illness and refers the licensee to HPSP for monitoring of the illness.
 - c. **Action (Board Discipline):** The board has determined that there is an illness to monitor and refers the licensee to HPSP as part of a disciplinary measure (i.e.: Stipulation and Order). The Board Order may dictate monitoring requirements.

TRUE SELF-REFERRALS

HPSP measures four types of referrals to the program: self-referrals, third party referrals, informal board referrals (voluntary), and formal board referrals (disciplinary). The category of self-referral has been questioned as to whether we are measuring "true" self-referrals, because some of the self-referred participants seem to have been coerced into reporting to HPSP – whether by a treatment provider, an employer, or a family member. HPSP has received requests to tease out which self-referrals are "true," that is, absent coercion or external motivation. We believe it is not necessary to tease out this information. It is neither easily determined nor relevant to HPSP goals. Problematically, there is no motivational scale to measure whether a self-referral was due to greater internal motivation versus greater external motivation.

In the case of a substance disordered practitioner, questioning the practitioner's motivation for treatment and sobriety assumes a moral component and denies the science of addiction, which is focused on altered brain plasticity. A practitioner whose addiction is severe usually does not have sufficient insight to arrest his or her own disease process alone. There is emerging science showing how the disease of addiction affects the brain. Dr. Nora Volkow of the National Institute on Drug Addiction has coined the following descriptor: "Addiction hijacks the brain." Alcohol and other addictive substances change the structure of the brain which, in turn, affects one's thoughts and behaviors. Brain research suggests that active substance abuse results in a diminished capacity to incorporate new learning and information into memory. Due to this limited consciousness of the destructive consequences, the addict typically comes into treatment only by way of external causes (spouse's threat, job problems, license discipline, legal difficulties) and rarely because of insight into their behavior.

It is not reasonable to expect one to think logically about the consequences of one's alcohol and drug use when their brain circuitry is impaired.

In contrast to substance use disorders, the average person is less judgmental with other health disorders. We don't assume a practitioner "chose" to be ill or question what motivated them to seek treatment. However, anecdotally these practitioners are as likely to need external motivation to self-refer to HPSP. While substance use disordered practitioners suffer from the phenomenon of denial of the severity of their illness, practitioners with other disorders may feel their illness was thrust upon them and that monitoring is another part of the victimization associated with their illness.

HPSP does collect data as to how the participant learned about the program. This is more helpful to us as we conduct our outreach efforts. We strive for early intervention into illnesses. We assist with educating that particular illnesses can progress to the point of causing patient harm.

Many practitioners first learn about HPSP from their employers or treatment providers. From the employer and treatment provider point of view, our experience is they nearly always prefer that the practitioner self-refer over making a third party referral. Is this coercion? Or is it encouragement with a goal toward insight on the part of the practitioner? We have seen treatment providers "encourage" self-referrals as part of the treatment goal toward developing insight into the illness. We have seen this proved out with substance disordered participants, when after a period of time in HPSP (usually about the time their brain chemistry normalizes) they may express gratitude for the structure of HPSP and how it assisted them in their recovery.

So who are the true self-referrals? They all are. The amount of internal or external motivation is irrelevant. One may self-refer because their employer demands, or because their psychiatrist encourages them to refer, or to avoid reporting the illness to their regulatory board, or because they recognize that the substance use problem has put their health, relationships, and career at risk.

ACTIVE CASES

A total of 535 health professionals were active with HPSP on January 4, 2016. The term *active* refers to persons in the intake process as well as those being monitored. The table below provides the number and percent of active cases by Board on January 4, 2016.

First Referral Sources for Active Cases


It is not uncommon for health professionals to be referred to HPSP by more than one source. *The first referral source* refers to how HPSP initially learned about the practitioner during this enrollment. This should not be confused with practitioners who were referred and discharged and later referred again (these are two separate cases for the same practitioner). For example, we often see self-referrals followed almost immediately by third party referrals or vis-a-versa. Whichever referral came first is considered the *first referral source*.

The first referral sources for the 535 active HPSP cases on January 4, 2016 were as follows:

- Self: 267 (50%)
- Board voluntary: 120 (22%)
- Board discipline: 91 (17%)
- Third party: 57 (11%)

REFERRALS BY FIRST REFERRAL SOURCE

HPSP received a total of 216 referrals in the first half of fiscal year 2016. These referrals represent the number of cases opened during the first half of the fiscal year. The referrals represent practitioners new to HPSP or who returned to HPSP. The chart on the right shows the number and percent of referrals by first referral source.



REFERRALS BY FIRST REFERRAL SOURCE AND BOARD



DEFINITIONS OF DISCHARGE CATEGORIES

1. **Completion**

Program completion occurs when the licensee satisfactorily completes the terms of the Participation Agreement and Monitoring Plan.

2. **Non-Compliance***

Participant violates the conditions of his or her Participation Agreement/Monitoring Plan; case manager closes case and files a report with licensee's board. Sub-categories of this include:

- Non-Compliance – Diversion
- Non-Compliance – Monitoring
- Non-Compliance – Positive Screen
- Non-Compliance – Problem Screens
- Non-Compliance – Treatment

3. **Voluntary Withdrawal***

Participant chooses to withdraw from monitoring prior to completion of the Participation Agreement and Monitoring Plan; case manager closes case and files a report with the licensee's board.

4. **Ineligible Monitored***

During the course of monitoring, it is determined that licensee is not eligible for program services as listed in statute; case manager files report with licensee's board. Sub-categories of this include:

- Ineligible Monitored – Illness too severe
- Ineligible Monitored – License suspended/revoked
- Ineligible Monitored – License went inactive
- Ineligible Monitored – Gave up license
- Ineligible Monitored – Violation of practice act

5. **Ineligible Not Monitored***

At time of intake, it is determined that licensee is not eligible for program services as listed in statute; case manager files report with licensee's board. Subcategories of this include:

- Ineligible Not Monitored – Illness too severe
- Ineligible Not Monitored – License suspended/revoked
- Ineligible Not Monitored – License went inactive
- Ineligible Not Monitored – No active Minnesota license
- Ineligible Not Monitored – Violation of practice act
- Ineligible Not Monitored – Previously discharged to the board

6. **No Contact***

Initial report received by third party or board; licensee fails to contact HPSP; case manager closes case and files a report with licensee's board.

7. **Non-Cooperation***

Licensee cooperates initially, may sign Enrollment Form and/or releases, but then ceases to cooperate before the Participation Agreement is signed; case manager closes case and files a report with licensee's board.


8. **Non-Jurisdictional**

No diagnostic eligibility established; the case is closed.

**Discharge results in report to board and providing data.*

REFERRAL AND DISCHARGE TRENDS

The chart below shows the number of referrals and discharges in the first half of each fiscal year since 2007. You will see that the number of referrals and discharges in the first half of fiscal year 2016 were considerably lower than those of the prior two fiscal years. By the end of fiscal year 2016, we will have a better idea if this trend downward will continue.



DISCHARGES BY DISCHARGE CATEGORY

A total of 212 health professionals were discharged from HPSP in the first half of fiscal year 2016, compared to 290 in 2015. Of those discharged in the first half of fiscal year 2016, a little more than half, 61%, participated in monitoring. Of those monitored, 55% completed the conditions of their Monitoring Plans.





UPDATES

STRATEGIC PLANNING

Background

HPSP staff identified the need for comprehensive strategic planning. HPSP contracted with Management, Analysis and Development (MAD), which is part of the Department of Management and Budget, to facilitate the initial phases of the process. MAD conducted situational analyses of the Program Committee, Advisory Committee, Executive Directors, HPSP staff, and the HPSP Program Manager. A Strategic Planning team was established consisting of four health licensing board executive directors and HPSP staff. A three to five year vision was created for the program along with one to two year strategies. HPSP staff was then assigned to lead the following strategic goals:

1. Measure program effectiveness, led by Mary Olympia
2. Best practices drive the program, led by Monica Feider
3. Develop governance that supports the program, led by Monica Feider
4. Strengthen Board and HPSP staff relationship and understanding of roles, led by Tracy Erfourth
5. Develop, strengthen and maintain efficient processes, led by Marilyn Miller
6. Promote staff well-being and professional growth, led by Kurt Roberts
7. Enhance program outreach, led by Kimberly Zillmer

HPSP staff developed Strategic Plan Work Groups consisting of HPSP staff, board executive directors and staff as well as members of the Program and Advisory Committees. Action plans were developed to create concrete plans to address each strategy. MAD facilitated the initial sessions of the work groups.

Status

Work on all of the above noted strategic goals is underway. Some of the strategies are time-limited, while others will be ongoing. A full report on the work done to address the strategic goals can be found in the *Strategies and Priorities Update 3* document, which will be provided to the Program Committee and the Executive Directors of the health licensing boards. It is also available upon request.

BUDGET

HPSP's fiscal year 2016 budget is \$850,000. In the first half of the fiscal year, HPSP spending was within expected levels. As of December 24, 2015, HPSP spent 42% (\$354,749.40) the fiscal year 2016 budget. Primary expenses include:

- Salaries and benefits: \$327,306.67
- Rent: \$18,195.16

COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND STAFF

PROGRAM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

The Program Committee consists of one member from each health licensing board. By law, the Program Committee provides HPSP with guidance to ensure the direction of HPSP is in accord with its statutory authority. In 1997 the Program Committee established the following five goals to meet this responsibility:

1. The public is protected;
2. Individual clients are treated with respect;
3. The program is well-managed;
4. The program is financially secure; and
5. The program is operating consistent with its statute.

Health Professionals Services Program *Strategic Planning Update*

February 2016

Background of Strategic Planning Process

In preparation for strategic planning in 2014, the Health Professionals Services Program (HPSP) asked Management Analysis & Development (MAD) to gather stakeholders' views on strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and challenges facing the program. In November 2013 MAD conducted focus group interviews with the HPSP Program Committee, Advisory Committee, staff, and interviewed the HPSP program manager and in December surveyed health licensing board executive directors. Five of 16 executive directors responded to the survey. The following is a summary of HPSP's strategic planning process:

Step 1: Situational Analyses

- Program Committee
- Advisory Committee
- Executive Directors
- Program Staff
- Program Manager

Step 2: Create a Strategic Planning Team

- HPSP staff
- Administering Board ED
- Executive Director volunteers from small, medium and large sized boards: Ruth Grendahl (Board of Podiatric Medicine), Angelina Barnes (Board of Psychology), and Shirley Brekken (Board of Nursing)

Step 3: Review Situational Analyses

The strategic planning team met to review the situational analyses.

Step 4: Develop Strategic Goals Based on Situational Analyses

Based on the review of the situational analyses, the strategic planning group created the following strategies:

- Measure program effectiveness
- Best practices drive the program
- Develop/create governance that supports the mission
- Strengthen board and staff relationship and understanding of roles
- Develop, strengthen and maintain efficient processes
- Support staff well-being and professional growth

Step 5: Create Work Groups to Address Each Strategic Goal

Steps one through five were facilitated by MAD. HPSP staff volunteered to lead each strategic goal. Initial meetings to address each strategic goal were also facilitated by MAD. Work group members were chosen based on their knowledge of the program and specific areas of expertise needed to address the strategic goal. HPSP staff are in the process of addressing the strategic goals and their progress is outlined on the following pages. Since the strategic planning process started, HPSP provided updates to the Program Committee on the strategic planning process in Mid-Year and Annual reports, as well as in more thorough written updates in May and August 2015 and again in February 2016.

Measure effectiveness: Measure the rate of participation by board in fiscal year 2016 and identify if any gains have been made in the under-represented professions.

Strategic Goal 2: Best Practices Drive the Program

Leader: Monica Feider, HPSP Program Manager

Team/Work Group: Mary Olympia, Tracy Erfourth and Jeff Morgan, MD (Addiction Medicine Physician)

The work group focused on identifying best practices with regard to monitoring conditions for persons with substance use disorders, who represent 80% of HPSP participants.

The National Council of State Boards of Nursing's (NCSBN) book titled *Substance Use Disorders in Nursing* and the Federation of State Physician Health Programs' (FSPHP) *Monitoring Guidelines* outline monitoring protocols for health practitioners with substance use disorders. These documents were reviewed and compared by the work group. For the purposes of this report, the NCSBN book will be identified as *NCSBN* and the FSPHP guidelines will be referred to as *FSPHP*.

The NCSBN provides a much more detailed description of monitoring requirements than those outlined by the FSPSP. Even so, the NCSBN and the FSPHP monitoring requirements are fairly consistent with one another as well as HPSP practices. The following are uniformly required monitoring conditions for persons monitored for substance use disorders:

- Abstinence
- Immediately report any use of alcohol or mood altering substances to the monitoring program
- Meet with treatment providers and follow treatment recommendations
- Maintain authorizations between the program and participant providers, treatment programs and work site monitors
- Immediately notify the monitoring program of changes in employment, treatment providers, address, or phone number

Monitoring conditions for persons with substance use disorders differ slightly between the NCSBN, the FSPHP, and HPSP as described below:

Length of Monitoring	
NCSBN	Three to five years for persons with substance use disorders
FSPHP	Five years for persons with a diagnosis of substance dependence and one to two years for persons with a diagnosis of substance abuse
HPSP	Average length is three years for persons with substance dependence and two years for persons with substance abuse. The length may be increased based on a variety of factors (i.e. diversion, risk to patients by profession).
Random Toxicology Screening	
NCSBN	Requires a minimum of two to three per month for first year of monitoring and practice - frequency may be reduced after first year
FSPHP	Requires but does not specify frequency
HPSP	Requires nine screens per quarter (average is three per month) for the first two years – frequency may be reduced to six per quarter in third year of monitoring. Screen frequency may be reduced based on participant's ability to pay and work status. Screen frequency may be increased based on return to access of controlled substances, monitoring compliance and risk to patients.
Attend mutual support groups and provide documentation of attendance	
NCSBN	Requires three per week – documentation is required monthly
FSPHP	Requires but does not specify frequency – frequency of documentation is not indicated
HPSP	Requires a minimum of two per week unless otherwise specified by treatment provider – documentation is required quarterly
Work site monitor that oversees professional performance	

Strategic Goal 4: Strengthen Board and HPSP Staff Relationships and Understanding of Roles

Leader: Tracy Erfourth, Case Manager

Work Group: Mary Olympia, HPSP case manager; Monica Feider, HPSP program manager; Barbara Damchik-Dykes, Board of Nursing; and Elizabeth Huntley, Board of Medical Practice. Barbara Deming (MAD) facilitated initial meeting.

The February and May HPSP and Board staff meetings focused on HPSP and Board staff communications and processes. Also discussed were ways to ensure all boards know and understand the HPSP process. In cases of dual monitoring, HPSP staff will work with the health licensing boards to develop quarterly report forms that are mutually agreed upon to ensure each board is getting the information they need.

The August HPSP and Board staff meeting focused on reviewing HPSP's monitoring protocols. Monica Feider and Kimberly Zillmer met with staff from the Boards of Medical Practice and Nursing to review HPSP's monitoring protocols in more detail. The protocols appeared well understood and mutually agreeable. Tracy Erfourth facilitated another meeting with staff from the Boards of Nursing and Medical Practice to brainstorm additional ways to enhance communication. HPSP will have an open house in February for Board staff.

Strategic Goal 5: Develop, Strengthen, and Maintain Efficient Processes

Leader: Marilyn Miller, HPSP Case Manager

Work Group: HPSP staff. Barbara Deming (MAD) facilitated initial meetings.

5A. Work flow enhancement through error reduction and efficient information management

HPSP staff has identified issues that contribute to internal work flow problems. Most of these issues are closely related to the need for error reduction. Based on the recent error tracking from the staff, we have discovered most of the obstacles to smooth work flow are related to data entry errors and omissions. A specific list of target errors will be identified for both case managers and support staff. Management will be conducting regular audits over time in the targeted areas and providing feedback to staff for continued improvement.

We have also been maintaining an open dialogue with Board staff regarding improvements in work flow between our programs and have made an effort to incorporate new ideas. We will maintain this as a consistent agenda item in our quarterly staff meetings.

5B. Database enhancement

Database Fixes

The HPSP team has been contributing to a list of database fixes over the last several months. To date a total of 24 items for improvement have been reviewed with the database programmer. We are hopeful that these fixes will be completed by April 2016. We will maintain running lists of other fixes that may be identified in the future.

Electronic Intake

We reviewed intake information collected by other state programs. A work group created a draft of a new electronic intake form. After consulting with the database developer and examining our budget, we are unable to move forward of this goal during this funding cycle. Because we cannot realize our goal of providing a new efficient and comprehensive electronic intake form that connects well with our existing database, the programmer will focus on making minor changes to our existing electronic intake form allowing critical information to connect to the database which is needed for reports.

These activities will be evaluated in January 2017 to see if they should be continued, adjusted or eliminated, and if any new ideas should be considered.

Strategic Goal 7: Enhance Program Outreach

Leader: Kimberly Zillmer, HPSP Case Manager

Team/Work Group: Monica Feider, Mary Olympia, Marilyn Miller with input from Advisory Committee and Board Staff. Barbara Deming facilitated initial meeting.

An outreach tracking document was developed that enables the program to track the number of outreach activities performed, who we are meeting with, and how many people are reached in each presentation. This will create a baseline to prompt additional goals.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

External Stakeholder Groups

State Opioid Oversight Project (SOOP)

The Board continues to participate on the SOOP Work Group, which convenes monthly. Subcommittees of the Work Group are pursuing initiatives, particularly related to Naloxone access, educational efforts related to opioid risks for newborns, and development of messages between health care systems, providers, and patients.

Interstate Collaboration in Healthcare

The Board continues to participate on weekly conference calls with the Interstate Collaboration in Healthcare. The group is continuing to monitor progress of medical and nursing licensure compacts, telemedicine initiatives and other topics of interest to stakeholders.

Health Professionals Services Program (HPSP) Strategic Planning

Board members and staff continue to engage with the HPSP Governance Work Group. Mr. Rasmussen's report of the HPSP Program Committee meeting addresses the efforts of the Governance Work Group.

National Governors' Association (NGA) Health Care Workforce Technical Assistance Program

The Core Team of the NGA Health Care Workforce Technical Assistance Program (NGA-TA Program), of which the tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy are members, continued its efforts to develop a consensus framework for evaluating scope-of-practice proposals. The group reviewed and offered comment on a draft framework and discussed goals for interprofessional collaboration.

Immigrant International Medical Graduate (IIMG) Stakeholder Advisory Group

Board representatives Molly Schwanz and Ruth Martinez hosted and participated in a meeting of the Licensure Study work group.

Office of Administrative Hearings 40th Anniversary Reception: Mitchell Hamline School of Law

Board and AGO staff joined others in a reception to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the Office of Administrative Hearings. Governor Dayton, Chief Administrative Law Judge Tammy Pust, Administrative Law Judge Barbara Nielsen and others addressed attendees and reviewed the history and evolution of the responsibilities of the office. The reception followed investiture of judges and a continuing legal education session.

Board staff also had a private meeting with Chief Administrative Law Judge Tammy Pust on February 17, 2016 to discuss pending legislation relating to temporary suspension of licenses, administrative hearing procedures, and mediations. Chief Pust assisted the Board in drafting language for the pending legislation.

Collaborative Initiatives

- Inaugural Minnesota Tri-Regulatory Symposium. The Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy are finalizing plans to host the first Minnesota Tri-Regulatory Symposium on June 1, 2016, at the Commons Hotel in Minneapolis. The Symposium is modeled after two symposia convened by the national collaborative of the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP), and the National Council of State Boards

of Nursing (NCSBN). Speakers include Doris Gundersen, MD, Medical Director of the Colorado Physician Health Program, and Barbara Brandt, PhD, Director of the University of Minnesota Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education. Panelists include the Chief Executive Officers of the FSMB, NABP and NCSBN, and the Presidents of the Minnesota Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy. Invited guests include Governor Dayton, key legislators, and members and staff of Minnesota's Medical, Nursing and Pharmacy Boards. A draft agenda is attached.

- MN Physician Publishing. The tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy finalized an article on regulatory collaboration for publication this spring.
- On January 29, 2016, the executive directors of the tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy met with representatives from the MN Department of Health (MDH) to discuss a proposal that would allow pharmacists to prescribe oral contraceptives. Although a bill will not be introduced during the 2016 legislative session, it is anticipated that a bill may be introduced in the 2017 legislative session. California and Oregon have passed legislation authorizing pharmacists to prescribe oral contraceptives.
- On February 19, 2016, the executive directors and select staff of the tri-regulatory Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy met with representatives of the MN Department of Health Office of Health Facility Complaints to discuss communication, data-sharing, and joint investigations between the agencies. We plan to continue to meet and discuss how we may enhance collaboration.

Outreach

Representatives of the Board of Medical Practice and the Health Professionals Services Program presented to the Preferred One Credentialing Committee on February 4, 2016. The presentation, which offered an overview of each agency's processes and interactions with each other and with providers, was well-received.

Conferences and Meetings

- January 19, 2016: Minnesota Inter-Agency Antibiotic Stewardship Collaborative. Representatives of Health Licensing Boards joined the Department of Health, Department of Agriculture, Board of Animal Health, Pollution Control Agency, and Department of Human Services to explore the complex issue of antibiotic stewardship. The group heard presentations by speakers on relevant topics related to antibiotic impact, and engaged in small and large group discussions. Future meetings on the topic are anticipated.
- January 27, 2016: Exploring a Collaborative Effort to Address Diagnostic Error in Health Care in Minnesota. The Board will recall the presentation at the July 2015 Board meeting by Dr. Laurie Drill-Mellum, who facilitated the discussion along with representatives from Stratis Health.
- March 31 – April 1, 2016: Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC) Commission Meeting. Minnesota will host a meeting of the IMLC Commission on March 31 – April 1, 2016 at the Stassen Building in St. Paul, Minnesota. The meeting is open to the public. Board members and other interested parties are invited to attend. The meeting notice is attached and is also posted on the Board's website.

Legislation

Board staff continues to participate in the 2016 legislative process to advance or monitor progress of the following bills:

- SF 454: Physician assistant housekeeping modifications; temporary suspension process alignment;
- HF 2445: Osteopathic physician housekeeping modifications;
- HF 1652: Expansion of access to prescription monitoring program data;
- HF 978: Authorizes licensing of genetic counselors under the jurisdiction of the Board of Medical Practice. The bill was introduced during the 2015 legislative session and has been brought forward in the 2016 session with amendments to address concerns raised by the Board of Medical Practice. The Board may consider taking a position to support, oppose or remain neutral on the bill.

ORDER FOR
AUTOMATIC SUSPENSION

1. The Minnesota Board of Medical Practice ("Board") is authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 147.001 through 147.37 (2014) to license, regulate, and discipline persons who apply for, petition, or hold licenses to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota. The Board is further authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. §§ 214.10 and 214.103 (2014) to review complaints against physicians, investigate such complaints, and to initiate appropriate disciplinary action.

2. Jonathan Christopher Haas, M.D. ("Respondent") was licensed by the Board to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota on May 15, 2004.

3. Respondent has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board from which he holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota.

4. Minn. Stat. § 147.091, subd. 1(j) provides that the following conduct is "prohibited and grounds for disciplinary action:"

Adjudication as . . . mentally ill . . . by a court of competent jurisdiction, within or without this state. Such adjudication shall automatically suspend a license for the duration thereof unless the board orders otherwise.

5. Minn. Stat. § 147.091, subd. 2(a) provides in pertinent part:

A license to practice medicine is automatically suspended if . . . the licensee is committed by order of a court pursuant to chapter 253B. The licensee remains suspended until the licensee is restored to capacity by a court and, upon petition by the licensee, the suspension is terminated by the board after a hearing.

6. On January 6, 2016, an eighth judicial district court judge, in Kandiyohi County, Minnesota, entered Findings and Order Revoking Order of Stayed Commitment (“Court Order”) concerning Respondent. The Court Order revoked Respondent’s stay of commitment and committed Respondent to the custody of the Commissioner of Human Services as a mentally ill person pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 253B for an initial period not to exceed six months.

7. Accordingly, the Court Order establishes that licensee has been “committed by order of a court pursuant to chapter 253B” for purposes of Minn. Stat. § 147.091, subd. 2(a).

8. The authority to sign automatic suspension orders has been delegated to the Executive Director of the Board.

ORDER

1. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 147.091, subd. 1(j) and subd. 2(a) and based upon the January 6, 2016, Court Order committing Respondent pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 253B, Respondent’s license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota is **AUTOMATICALLY SUSPENDED**, effective immediately. During the period of this suspension, Respondent shall not in any manner practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota.

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent’s license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota shall remain suspended until Respondent “is restored to capacity by a court and, upon petition by [Respondent], the suspension is terminated by the board after a hearing.” See Minn. Stat. § 147.091, subd. 2(a).

Upon receiving a petition for reinstatement of his medical license from Respondent, the Board's Complaint Review Committee ("Committee") shall either schedule a hearing before the Board or at the Office of Administrative Hearings pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 14, as requested by Respondent. Respondent "may be reinstated to practice, either with or without restrictions, by demonstrating clear and convincing evidence of rehabilitation, as provided in section 364.03." *See* Minn. Stat. § 147.091, subd. 2(c).

1. During all times herein, Sean T. O'Grady, M.D. ("Respondent") has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Minnesota Board of Medical Practice ("Board") from which he holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota.

2. By Stipulation and Order dated March 8, 2014 ("2014 Order"), the Board conditioned Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota due to illness. Under the terms of the 2014 Order, Respondent was required, in part, to complete a course in anger management; obtain a primary care treating physician to monitor and/or manage all medical or other care provided to Respondent; obtain a pain management specialist; engage in individual therapy with a psychiatrist, with termination of the therapy at the recommendation of the psychiatrist with the approval of the primary care treating physician; and meet with a designated Board member on a quarterly basis.

3. On or about December 3, 2015, the Board received a written petition from Respondent requesting modification of the 2014 Order to remove the requirement for Respondent to engage in therapy with a psychiatrist. The Board also received reports from Respondent's psychiatrist, primary care treating physician, pain management specialist, and designated Board member in support of Respondent's petition for termination of his therapy.

4. The Complaint Review Committee, having convened on January 7, 2016, to review and consider the above-referenced matter, issues the following:

ORDER

5. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the requirement for Respondent to engage in individual therapy with a psychiatrist shall be removed from the 2014 Order.

6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the remainder of the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and Order of March 8, 2014, shall remain in full force and effect.

7. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Committee Order Amending the Board's Stipulation and Order of March 8, 2014, is hereby adopted and implemented on this 22nd day of January, 2016.







FACTS

1. During all times herein, Kevin Allen Kimm, D.O. ("Respondent") has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Minnesota Board of Medical Practice ("Board") from which he holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota.

2. By Stipulation and Order dated March 9, 2013 ("2013 Order"), the Board indefinitely suspended Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Minnesota due to illness.

3. By Stipulation and Order dated July 12, 2014 ("2014 Order"), the Board reinstated Respondent's license with conditions and restrictions which required, in part, that Respondent participate in the Health Professionals Services Program ("HPSP") and fully comply with all terms and conditions of his HPSP monitoring plan; practice in a pre-approved practice setting and limit his practice to working as an observer under the direct supervision of a pre-approved physician for a minimum of three months from the date of the 2014 Order; petition for removal of the requirement limiting his practice to working as an observer and, following removal of the limitation, obtain an educational preceptor in family medicine and participate in regularly scheduled meetings to review cases, documentation, decision-making, and specific practice topics; and limit his practice to a maximum of 20 hours per week.

4. By Committee Order dated October 16, 2014, the requirement to limit Respondent's practice to working as an observer under the direct supervision of a pre-approved physician was removed from Respondent's 2014 Order.

5. By Second Committee Order dated July 18, 2015, Respondent's practice hours under the 2014 Order were increased to a maximum of 30 hours per week.

6. On or about December 7, 2015, the Board received a written petition from Respondent requesting modification of his 2014 Order to increase his practice hours to 40 hours per week.

7. The Complaint Review Committee, having convened on January 7, 2016, to review and consider the above-referenced matter, issues the following:

ORDER


8. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the maximum number of Respondent's practice hours shall be increased to 40 hours per week.







4. 6. 7. The authority to sign orders suspending licenses and reinstating licenses of respiratory therapists pursuant to notification by a court, administrative law judge, or public authority regarding child support or maintenance payments, or both, has been delegated by the Board to its Executive Director.






