ORDER OF
UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE

The Minnesota Board of Psychology ("Board") convened on September 17, 1999, to review the petition of Elizabeth R. Mitchell, M.A., L.P. ("Licensee"), for removal of the conditions placed on her license by a Stipulation and Consent Order, adopted and implemented by the Board on June 13, 1997 ("June 1997 Order"). Having considered the Complaint Resolution Committee's recommendation that Licensee be granted an unconditional license, the Board determines that Licensee has complied with and fulfilled all conditions set forth in the June 1997 Order, as follows:

1. Pursuant to paragraph 4.a., Licensee successfully completed the individualized professional boundaries training course taught by John Hung, Ph.D., L.P.
2. Pursuant to paragraph 4.b., Licensee submitted a report to the Board addressing dates of attendance, topics covered, knowledge learned, and the future effect on her practice regarding her participation in the professional boundaries course.
3. Pursuant to paragraph 4.c., Licensee caused the instructor of the professional boundaries course to submit a report to the Board regarding Licensee's participation in the course and his assessment of the knowledge Licensee obtained from the course and his opinion as to her recognition of boundary issues and ability to engage in the practice of psychology in an ethical manner.
4. Pursuant to paragraph 4.d., Licensee practiced psychology under the supervision of a supervising psychologist for a period of 18 months.

5. Pursuant to paragraph 4.e., Licensee's supervising psychologist submitted reports to the Board every three months for a period of 18 months addressing Licensee's supervised practice.

6. Pursuant to paragraph 4.f., Licensee submitted reports to the Board every three months for a period of 18 months regarding her participation in supervision.

7. Pursuant to paragraph 4.g., Licensee remitted \$1,500 to the Board for payment of the civil penalty assessed.

Based on the foregoing, the Board hereby issues the following:

ORDER


Licensee shall be granted an UNCONDITIONAL LICENSE to practice psychology in the State of Minnesota, such license to carry all duties, benefits, responsibilities, and privileges inherent therein through Minnesota statute and rule.

The June 1997 Order is superseded by this Order of Unconditional License and shall have no future force or effect.
