BOARD MEETING MINUTES

November 7, 2014 – 10:30 a.m.

Minnesota State University, Mankato-Centennial Student Union, Room 245, Mankato, Minnesota

1. Call to Order / Roll Call – Public Session

The public session of the Board meeting was called to order at 10:35 a.m.

Dr. Jackie Lewis welcomed the BBHT to Mankato State University and thanked everyone for their hard work on behalf of the counseling profession. Dr. Lewis recognized Walter Roberts for his dedication to the profession.

2. Approval of Board Meeting Minutes

A. April 25, 2014

Walter Roberts moved to approve the minutes. Marlae Cox-Kolek seconded. All Board members present voted aye, there were no nays, and the motion to approve the minutes carried.

B. June 9, 2014

Duane Reynolds moved to approve the minutes. Bob Schmillen seconded. All Board members present voted aye, there were no nays, and the motion to approve the minutes carried.

C. August 1, 2014

Marlae Cox-Kolek moved to approve the minutes. Freddie Davis-English seconded. All Board members present voted aye, there were no nays, and the motion to approve the minutes carried.

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3. Staff Member Reports

A. Executive Director's Report (Kari Rechtzigel)

1. Welcome to Rebecca Lund, MA, LPCC, New Professional Board Member appointed October 4, 2014. Ms. Lund was introduced to the Board, and she provided information about her background and areas of practice, including being bilingual (English and Spanish) and serving the Latino community. She is also a registered play therapist. Chair Gordon appointed her to serve on the Board's Application and Licensure Committee and Legislative Committee.

2. Farewell to Nona Wilson, PhD, LPCC, Professional Board Member. Departing Board member Nona Wilson announced that she is moving to Evanston, Illinois to teach at Northwestern University.

3. Minnesota Mental Health Workforce Steering Committee, BBHT Representative (Nona Wilson, Freddie Davis-English). Ms. Wilson has served on a Mental Health Workforce Summit Steering Committee since 2013. Legislation passed in 2013 required Minnesota State Colleges and Universities to convene a Mental Health Summit and develop a mental health workforce plan. The plan must address how to increase the number of mental health professionals and practitioners, ensure appropriate coursework and training experience, and increase the number of culturally diverse mental health professionals and practitioners.

Ms. Wilson reported that the group has arrived at 22-23 recommendations, with a focus in three categories: recruitment, education and training, and retention. Recommendation topics include creating career ladders, the role of technology, ensuring cultural competency in the work force, telemedicine, and increasing the number of psychiatrists. The plan is required to be submitted to the Legislature by January 15, 2015. Freddie Davis-English agreed to take over Ms. Wilson's role on this Committee. The next meeting is scheduled for early December.

4. Budget Report (Receipts and Expenditures through October 31, 2014).

Ms. Rechtzigel reported on the Board's receipts and expenditures through October 31, 2014 (four months into the fiscal year). The Board's grand total revenue was \$380,742.28, which represents 47.49 percent of the Board's budget. The expenditures for the same time period totaled \$170,534.19, which represents 23.41% of the Board's budget. Vice Chair Kristen Piper praised the staff for their efforts through the years in managing the budget and commented "it's amazing that we are not in the hole."

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5. Budget Planning for Fiscal Years 16 and 17 (Change Items) (October 15, 2014). Ms. Rehtzigel reported that this item was discussed during the Board's Legislative Committee meeting on October 31, 2014. Ms. Rehtzigel explained the budget planning process that occurs every two years. The Board is part of the Executive Branch and therefore included in the Governor's budget. Budget documents are currently confidential, but Ms. Rehtzigel summarized the items the Board would like addressed in the next biennium: increase the base budget (spending authority) to include funding for another staff position, increase the size of the Board's office space, and fund a move to electronic records. These recommendations are based on the growth in the number of persons the Board regulates. The number of licensees doubled between June 30, 2006 and June 30, 2014. The number of staff persons has not kept pace with the growth in licensees, and the Board would like to continue to provide quality customer service.


6. Biennial Report - July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2014 (October 15, 2014). Ms. Rehtzigel informed the Board that this report is required every two years, and specific information must be included. The report includes a list of Board members, a list of Board staff members, a letter from the Executive Director, the number of licensees, the number of new licenses issued, the number of credentials renewed, complaint data (number of complaints received, number closed, number of disciplinary actions taken), receipt and disbursement information, and a list of fees.

7. Office of the Legislative Auditor – BBHT Audit – Response to Audit Findings due October 15, 2014. (Health-Related Licensing Boards Internal Controls and Compliance Audit July 2011 through June 2014, Report 14-20, October 24, 2014). Ms. Rehtzigel asked Board members if they received the report either by U.S. mail or email. Board members responded they did receive it. Samantha Strehlo reported on the three issues identified in the report and the Board's response. The first item identified was related to continuing education audits and verifying that licensees completed their continuing education requirements. The Board was not performing audits, but going forward the Board's database will generate audit documents to ensure that this function is completed. The second item related to reconciliations of revenue receipts. The Board was performing daily reconciliations, but the recommendation was to perform monthly reconciliations of receipts. There is now a report set up in the database to accomplish this. The third item related to access to the database. All staff members had full access to licensure, complaint, and financial transaction areas of the database when only three staff members needed full access. Access will be limited accordingly.

8. Staff Presentations and Board Member Activities (since last Board meeting).

a. August 6-9, 2014 - National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC) Annual Conference, Greensboro, NC (Rehtzigel, Piper, Roberts, Wilson attended). Nona Wilson reported on her experience as a first-time attendee of the conference. Presentations occurred all day Thursday and all day Friday. Ms. Wilson listed some of the topics which included NBCC goals related to legislation and policy,

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distance counseling, international counseling issues, moving to an electronic platform, creating an ethics depository with information about disciplinary actions in all 50 states, education standards (CACREP), license portability, and credentials or certifications some states accept for licensure by reciprocity. Walter Roberts noted that the BBHT has been around for ten years, and it is his opinion that BBHT is ahead of the curve in comparison to other states and has faced issues some other state licensing boards have not. He attributes the success of BBHT to the members who have served and to the staff for their guidance.


b. September 10-13, 2014 – Council on Licensure, Enforcement & Regulation (CLEAR) Conference, New Orleans, LA (Rechtzigel, Strehlo, Cox-Kolek, Roberts attended). Marlae Cox-Kolek reported that approximately 60 percent of the persons in attendance were from Canada. Many of the break-out sessions were geared toward the Canadian model of regulation. She commented that the key note speaker was a person who is against regulation. Ms. Cox-Kolek stated she learned that some boards have much more money to fund investigations. One example from Canada stood out. An investigation of a dentist allegedly practicing out of his house involved investigators going undercover to obtain services and also going through his trash to find evidence. Walter Roberts noted that six countries were represented at the conference. Dr. Roberts also commented on the key note speaker's presentation related to regulation, her view that it is not necessary in many instances, and that "the market will take care of it." He noted that in the disciplinary process, we have seen the damage done to clients by people who are charlatans. It is disturbing to think of leaving everything to the free market. Samantha Strehlo noted that the key note speaker is an economist and cited some of the work done by Morris Kleiner, an economist at the University of Minnesota. She noted that she and Ms. Rechtzigel have heard Dr. Kleiner speak. Yvonne Hundshamer asked staff to circulate information about the CLEAR conference keynote speaker.

c. October 2, 2014 – Minnesota School of Professional Psychology (Argosy) Advisory Committee Meeting – (LaBrocca, Rechtzigel attended). Ms. Rechtzigel reported that she and Pat LaBrocca attended this activity and participated in discussions related to education programs and licensure requirements for the LADC, LPC, and LPCC licenses.

d. October 10, Minnesota Coalition for Addiction Studies Education (MNCASE) Meeting – Metro State University, St. Paul, MN (Gordon, Strehlo attended).

e. October 24, 2014 – Minnesota Counseling Association (MnCA) Fall Conference Presentation (LaBrocca). Pat LaBrocca attended the conference, provided information about LPC and LPCC licensure, and answered questions from participants. Pat noted that new board member Rebecca Lund was at the conference. Pat is willing to contribute information to the MnCA monthly newsletter. Ms. Rechtzigel recognized Pat's mastery of many complex issues over the course of her short tenure with the Board. Ms. LaBrocca stated she enjoys the licensure side of regulation and noted her past work experience with the Board

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of Psychology where she worked in the complaint and compliance area of regulation. It is a more pleasant experience to issue a license. Ms. Rechtzigel noted that Gail Schiff also has significant experience with health-related licensing board regulation. She informed the Board that Pat and Gail are the LPC/LPCC team.

f. October 29, 2014 – Minnesota Association of Resources for Recovery and Chemical Health (MARRCH) Fall Conference Presentation on Tiered Licensure Working Group Activities, RiverCentre, St. Paul, MN (Gordon, Rechtzigel, Strehlo attended). Chair Gordon, Kari Rechtzigel, and Samantha Strehlo did a presentation on tiered licensure.

g. January 7-9, 2015 - American Association of State Counseling Boards (AASCB) Conference, Savannah, Georgia. Walter Roberts moved to approve sending BBHT delegates to the AASCB conference in January. Marlae Cox-Kolek seconded. All Board members present voted “aye,” there were no nays, and the motion carried. Dr. Roberts noted that he has attended an AASCB conference in the past and that the focus was specific to state regulatory boards.

B. LADC Program Update (Samantha Strehlo)

1. Licenses Issued Since Last Board Meeting. Ms. Strehlo provided Board members with a list of persons licensed since the last Board meeting on August 1, 2014. One hundred and eight (108) LADC licenses and thirty-two (32) temporary permits were issued since the last Board meeting. *See Attachment 1 to these minutes.*

2. Report on Program Operations. Ms. Strehlo reported that many students graduated in August which resulted in a large number of license applications and licenses issued in September and October.

C. LPC/LPCC Program Update (Patricia LaBrocca)

1. Licenses Issued Since Last Board Meeting. Ms. LaBrocca provided Board members with a list of persons licensed since the last Board meeting on August 1, 2014. Sixty-five (65) LPCC licenses and thirty-nine (39) LPC licenses were issued since the last Board meeting. *See Attachment 1 to these minutes.*

2. Report on Program Operations

Ms. LaBrocca reported that the numbers of licenses issued since the last Board meeting are down compared to her last report. The large number of LPC licenses issued before August 1 was due to the necessity of meeting the deadline for LPC licensure for LPCC conversion method applicants who wanted to qualify for licensure under the old requirements. The law changed on August 1, 2014, when permanent conversion method requirements became effective. Ms. LaBrocca reported there are a large number of pending LPCC conversion

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method applications as a result. New applications have slowed down in September and October. Chair Gordon reported that the Application and Licensure Committee met on October 31, 2014, and Kristen Piper was elected as chair of the Committee. Rebecca Lund is available to review applications on Tuesday and Thursday mornings.

4. Minnesota Statutes section 148F.11 (Exceptions to License Requirement) and Minnesota Rules part 9530.6450 (Chemical Dependency Licensed Treatment Facilities – Staff Qualifications) - Discussion

Chair Gordon framed the issue. If a person works in a DHS Rule 31 facility and is exempt from licensure under Minnesota Statutes section 148F.11, they must meet requirements to practice in Minn. R. 9530.6450. DHS staff members were present at the Board meeting and reported they have not had any unlicensed person try to work in a Rule 31 facility.

5. Legislative Committee Report (Walter Roberts)

A. Expedited and Temporary Licensing for Former and Current Members of the Military – LPC, LPCC, and LADC Licensure Requirements


A committee motion was offered to accept legislative language drafted by staff. All Board members present voted “aye.” The motion was withdrawn after the issue of multiple levels of licensure was presented. If a state has only one level of licensure (LPC), can a person obtain a temporary LPCC license based on another state’s LPC license? The Board directed the Legislative Committee and staff to address the issue. Walter Roberts moved to delegate to the Legislative Committee and staff the task of drafting language that will address the issue and meet Revisor’s Office and legislative deadlines. All Board members present voted “aye,” there were no nays, and the motion carried.

[The meeting adjourned at noon and reconvened at 12:30 p.m.]

B. Minnesota Statutes sections 214.077 and 214.32, subdivision 6 – temporary suspension of license

The Legislative Committee moved to delegate to staff the task of monitoring proposed bill language in the 2015 legislative session that will clarify the temporary suspension process for health-related licensing boards. All Board members present voted “aye,” there were no nays, and the motion carried.

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C. Licensure by Reciprocity – Legislative Committee Proposal to Study Reciprocity Licensure in Other States

The Legislative Committee reported they will study reciprocity provisions other states use. For example, the State of Iowa has adopted language allowing licensure to a person who has practiced for five years in another state. The Committee moved the Board to approve a study of reciprocity. All Board members present voted “aye,” there were no nays, and the motion carried.


The Committee further reported they were approached by a group wanting to start a graduate program in counseling. The program cannot achieve accreditation until they have graduates of their program. Students of a non-accredited program cannot meet LPC/LPCC licensure requirements related to degree requirements. The group wanted the Board to create an exception to the requirement that an applicant have a degree from an accredited program or institution. The Committee informed the group they could not support the proposed exception. Kari Rehtzigel recommended that the group members contact Hazelden Graduate School because they completed the accreditation process in recent years and likely faced similar issues.

6. Tiered Licensure Working Group Report (Strehlo)

The Working Group does not have a report draft at this time and is still gathering information and feedback from stakeholders. The Working Group has been studying a practice structure involving associate’s, bachelor’s, and master’s level practitioners. The Working Group recommends no legislation that would change the current LADC licensure requirements. Judi Gordon and Samantha Strehlo reported on the issue at a recent MNCASE (Minnesota Coalition for Addiction Studies Education) educators meeting. Judi Gordon, Kari Rehtzigel, and Samantha Strehlo presented information on the tiered licensure study at the MARRCH conference on October 29, 2014. This presentation involved two hours in a question/answer format. Approximately 200 people were in attendance. Attendees expressed fear of change and a fear of losing something if licensure changes. The Working Group plans to send out a survey to all licensees to gather more information about licensure tiers, hiring and staffing if tiers are established, etc.

Chair Gordon noted the importance of the link between licensure requirements and public protection. She noted that there is a shortage of providers in remote areas of Minnesota and that LADCs can only be reimbursed for services if they work in a licensed facility. One goal of a master’s level license is the ability to be reimbursed for services as an individual provider. The Working Group also noted the importance of addressing diversity issues – who is serving persons of color? The Working Group is aware that reimbursement and the Affordable Care Act will affect any proposed changes to licensing. Kristen Piper stated she still believes tiers are confusing to the consumer. How can a consumer know what the scope of practice is for each level of licensure? How will an employer know what to do with persons in each licensure level? The discussion then turned to

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dual licensure as the practical alternative: having a mental health professional level license (e.g. LPCC) and the LADC license.

7. Termination of LPC/LPCC and LADC Licenses for Nonrenewal

Duane Reynolds moved to approve the termination of the LPC, LPCC and LADC licenses on the list prepared by the Board staff. Kristen Piper seconded. Chair Gordon called for a vote on the motion. All Board members present voted to approve the list of licenses to be terminated. *See Attachment 2* to these minutes for the licenses that were Board terminated.

8. Election of Board Chair and Vice Chair for 2015; Selection of Quarterly Board Meeting Dates and Starting Times for 2015

Barb Carlson moved that Judi Gordon and Kristen Piper continue to serve as Chair and Vice Chair respectively for calendar year 2015. Walter Roberts seconded. All Board members present voted aye, and Judi Gordon was elected Chair of the Board and Kristen Piper was elected Vice Chair of the Board for 2015. The following meeting dates were selected for quarterly Board meetings in 2015: January 23, April 24, July 31, and October 23, 2015. All meetings will begin at 10:30 a.m.

9. Public Comment Period

No commentary was offered.

10. Adjournment of Public Session

Duane Reynolds moved to adjourn the meeting. Judi Gordon seconded. All Board members present voted aye, there were no nays, and the public portion of the Board meeting adjourned at 1:15 p.m.
