**ORDER OF REMOVAL OF
STAY OF SUSPENSION**

This matter came on before the Complaint Review Committee of the Minnesota Board of Veterinary Medicine (“Board”) in accordance with the terms of a Stipulation and Consent Order (“2013 Consent Order”) adopted by the Board on September 11, 2013, which Joseph V. Bisignano, D.V.M. (“Respondent”), agreed to and signed.

Pursuant to the 2013 Consent Order, Respondent’s license was suspended, but the suspension was stayed contingent upon Respondent’s compliance with all terms and conditions set forth in the 2013 Consent Order. In paragraph V.1. of the 2013 Consent Order, Respondent expressly acknowledged and agreed the Review Panel is authorized to issue an Order of Removal of Stay of Suspension (“Order of Removal”) if it has probable cause to believe Respondent has failed to comply with or has violated any of the requirements for staying the suspension of Respondent’s license.

The Review Panel has probable cause to believe Respondent has failed to comply with or has violated one or more of the requirements for staying the suspension of Respondent’s license.

ORDER

1. NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the stay of suspension set forth in the 2013 Consent Order is **REMOVED**, and the license of Respondent as a veterinarian in the State of Minnesota is **SUSPENDED** immediately.

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent’s license as a veterinarian in the State of Minnesota shall remain suspended until the Board makes a final determination in this matter.

3. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent's violation of this Order shall provide grounds for further disciplinary action pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 156.081, subdivision 1(12) (2014).

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Board may, at any regularly scheduled meeting following service of this Order of Removal and a Notice of Removal of Stay of Suspension, Imposition of Suspension, and Hearing upon Respondent in accordance with the requirements of the 2013 Consent Order, take any of the following actions:


a. Dismiss the Complaint Review Committee's allegations and reinstate Respondent's license under the terms of the 2013 Consent Order.

b. Reinstate Respondent's license with limitations placed upon the scope of Respondent's practice and/or conditional upon further reports to the Board.

c. Continue the suspension of Respondent's license.
