Dear Mr. Stoeckman:

Enclosed you will find a copy of EMSRB Orders of Suspension for your First Responder registration # 266597, effective January 20, 2006 (Sibley County Human Services), and effective January 27, 2006 (Minnesota Department of Revenue).

On December 21, 2005, a "Notice to Suspend Occupational or Professional License" was received from Sibley County Human Services. Based upon Minnesota Statutes section 518.551, subdivision 12 and Minnesota Statutes section 214.101, subdivision 1, this Notice requires that the Board suspend your First Responder registration.

On December 29, 2005, our office received notification from the Minnesota Department of Revenue that under Minnesota law (Minn. Stat. 270C.72) the Board must suspend your First Responder registration by January 27, 2006.

Please note the conditions of this suspension:

- Your First Responder registration # 266597 is suspended effective January 20, 2006. During the period of suspension, you may not represent yourself as an First Responder registered by the EMSRB in the State of Minnesota.
- Your certification may be reinstated by the Board upon receipt of clearance from Sibley County Human Services, the Minnesota Department of Revenue, and compliance with the current requirements for reinstatement of your First Responder registration with the EMSRB.

If you have further questions, I suggest you contact Sibley County Human Services and the Minnesota Department of Revenue.

**ORDER  
OF SUSPENSION**

1. The Minnesota Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board (“Board”) is authorized pursuant to Minn. Stat. ch. 144E to register persons as first responders in the State of Minnesota, to review complaints against registered first responders, and to initiate appropriate disciplinary action.

2. Dennis Stoeckman (“Certificate Holder”) has been and now is subject to the jurisdiction of the Board and is registered as a first responder in the State of Minnesota.

3. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 270C.72, subd. 1, the registration of a first responder must be revoked if the Certificate Holder owes the State delinquent taxes, penalties or interest, and the Minnesota Commissioner of Revenue so notifies the Board.

4. On December 29, 2005, the Board received a Notice of License Revocation from the Minnesota Department of Revenue, which advised the Board that the Certificate Holder has an outstanding tax liability, and under Minn. Stat. § 270C.72, the Board must revoke registration as a first responder in the State of Minnesota. The Department of Revenue has informed the Board that, for purposes of Minn. Stat. § 270C.72, the Department of Revenue deems the term “revoke” to mean that the taxpayer’s registration will be suspended until the tax obligation has been satisfied and the tax clearance certificate has been issued.

5. At a public meeting on January 17, 2002, the Board passed a motion delegating to the executive director the authority to (1) sign orders revoking or suspending certificates or registrations pursuant to Department of Revenue tax delinquency notices, and (2) sign orders

reinstating certificates and registration upon compliance with all requirements set forth in the orders of suspension.

**ORDER**

1. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Certificate Holder's registration as a first responder in the State of Minnesota shall be **SUSPENDED** pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 270C.72, subd. 1, effective January 27, 2006. During the period of suspension, the Certificate Holder shall not practice as a first responder in the State of Minnesota.

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Certificate Holder's registration shall be reinstated by the Board upon the Certificate Holder's compliance with the following:

a. The Certificate Holder shall submit to the Board a tax clearance certificate from the Minnesota Department of Revenue indicating that the Certificate Holder does not owe the State any uncontested delinquent taxes, penalties or interest and has filed all required returns; and

b. The Certificate Holder shall comply with the requirements of Minn. Stat. § 144E.28, subd. 8, which also applies to expired registrations.
