

WHO WE ARE



ENERGY ensures that Minnesota homes and businesses receive access to energy services that are reliable, reasonably-priced, efficient, and economically and environmentally sound. We advocate on behalf of the public interest in regulated-utility matters; conduct environmental review of proposed energy facilities; oversee utility energy conservation programs; and administer the federal Weatherization Assistance Program and Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS protects consumers and advocates for the public interest on telecommunications matters in front of the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission. We also provide services and specialized equipment so Minnesotans with hearing, speech, or physical disabilities are able to access phone services.



INSURANCE evaluates insurance products to ensure that all legal requirements are met and that Minnesotans are charged fair rates. We also monitor the financial solvency of insurance companies so Minnesotans can trust that money will be available to pay claims.

LICENSING protects consumers by licensing over 270,000 professionals in more than 20 different industries --including insurance agents and adjusters, real estate brokers and salespeople, property appraisers, collection agencies, and debt collectors.



ENFORCEMENT protects consumers and the integrity of the market by monitoring market conduct and investigating consumer complaints related to insurance, securities, real estate, debt collection, and other industries. The licensed law enforcement officers in our Fraud Bureau also conduct criminal investigations of insurance fraud and related financial crimes.

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS licenses, supervises, and examines state banks, trust companies, credit unions, insurance companies, mortgage lenders, and other financial service companies.



WEIGHTS AND MEASURES has been ensuring accuracy and equity in Minnesota's marketplace since 1885. From gas pumps to grain elevators to grocery scales, we check the accuracy of all commercial weight and measuring equipment in the state, as well as the quality of gasoline and other fuel products.
