

Re: MP & GRE HVTL

Dear Mr. Storm:

Yesterday, March 7th, 2007, I received a notice dated 2/27/2007, mailed on 3/6/2007, and containing a 3/9/2007 deadline for citizen comments on the above referenced matter. This lack of adequate notice is obviously intentional.

The notice indicated that alternate citizens' routes were being proposed following the February 13, 2007, Embarrass meeting, and a map was enclosed. However, the map indicates that the above HVTL is still located on the west side of Bergstedt Road in Township 60, Range 15 Section 8.

Since the 1920s, my family has owned the following property, with mineral rights, in section 8:


- ◆ SE1/4 of SW1/4 Twp 60, Rg15, Sec 8 [2007 valuation 27,400]
- ◆ SW1/4 of SE1/4 Twp 60, Rg 15, Sec 8 [2007 valuation 16,400]
- ◆ SE1/4 of SE1/4 Twp 60, Rge 15, Sec 8 [2007 valuation 11,300]

SE1/4 of SW1/4 is mainly highland, contains much pine nearing maturity and is accessible by road on two sides: Bergstedt Road on the east and Saari Road on the south. As you can glean from the 2007 valuation, this is choice property suitable for home sites. SW1/4 of SE1/4 is accessible only on the west by Bergstedt Road and except for a narrow strip of higher land on its southern boundary, consists primarily of swamp. SE1/4 of SE1/4 is even less valuable since it has no road access and is mostly swamp. Unless other motives are involved, it is only reasonable to expect "Big Power" exerting eminent domain to use the least valuable land since its presence devalues property.

In studying your enclosed map, I can see that the proposed HVTL crosses Hwy 135 south of Taylor Road in a northeasterly direction. This route could be extended into sections 16 and 9 and then redirected northerly to meet with one of the routes proposed by the citizens' group. I grew up in section 3, hunted along the former DM&IR tracks and know the area I am proposing consists primarily of inferior properties.

I am aware that MP is the major project of the Allete corporation that is also involved in lands and minerals. And, I am also aware that our properties were drilled in the 1940s by a private company and much mineral exploration has been done in the area, both by plane and on foot. I suspect that the proposed route was selected by MP for undisclosed reasons since inferior public lands exist to the east of the proposed route. I am also aware of the great interest in non-ferrous minerals in the area.

Dear Mr. Storm:

I am writing in response to the disturbing letter we received, dated, February 27th, 2007, concerning the proposed alternative routes for the new transmission powerline. We understand, from the map enclosed, that both of the alternative routes would go thru our property in Kugler Township. We strongly oppose these alternatives as it would greatly de-value our property. The land that it would go thru would be an ideal home building site---but a powerline thru the center of it, would absolutely ruin that and make it un-saleable in the future should we wish to sell it. The route which is located the farthest east would have less impact and be the least objectionable. Another consideration would be that it would encourage even more trespassing thru our property. That has been a constant hassle for us. A cousin, who lives in the Lakeland area has a powerline going thru their land and they said that the snowmobilers in winter and the four-wheelers in summer are constantly trespassing along the power line right of way. Fences don't even keep them out. We were OK with the original plan and would hope that would be the one that is finally agreed upon. We strongly oppose the "alternative route proposal" and sincerely hope you will go with the original plan.

Re: Tower Transmission Project – HVTL Route Comparison Matrix

Dear Mr. Storm,

A week or so ago I received a copy of the Route Comparison Matrix from the SLC Land Department. I assume that this matrix originated with your office. I find several inadequacies in this matrix.

- 1) The routing factor “Private parcels crossed” gives the number of parcels crossed. For the purpose of comparison it would be very helpful to also give miles and acres involved, as is done for the other factors.
- 2) The number of roads crossed, as shown for alternative C, disagrees with both the SLC Plat Book and the USGS map for the area.
- 3) The “Accessibility“ factor is entirely misleading. It would lead one to believe that there is no other road in the area except for Highway 135 in Kugler Township. In fact alternative C crosses Wahlsten, Jeranson, and Sherman Roads. Sherman and Jeranson Roads are less than 2.5 miles apart so there is one point that is not quite 1.25 miles from a road. The rest of the route is progressively closer to one road or the other. For alternative B, the Wahlsten and Sherman Roads are approximately 3.25 miles apart so at one point the route is 1.6 miles from either road and the rest of the route is progressively closer to on road or the other. The distance from Highway 135 is irrelevant, as the route would be accessed from other roads.
- 4) Since the proposed route follows Fuller Creek for part of its route it would give a more complete picture to give miles and acres of designated trout stream within each right-of-way and within 200 feet of each route.

Dear Mr. Storm:

I am writing to express concern about the use of a section of the Iron Ore recreational snowmobile trail as part of the proposed route for a new electrical transmission line from the Embarrass area to Tower. At the meeting held at the Embarrass Township Hall on February 15, 2007, Mr. Lindholm from Minnesota Power, referred to this trail as a public corridor. This is a gross misconception of the actual situation. The Iron Ore Snowmobile trail is similar to approximately 20,000 miles of recreational snowmobile trails in the State of Minnesota, it exists because landowners have partnered with snowmobile organizations allowing for development of non-permanent trails on their lands. Most of these trails legally exist solely during the winter months, December 1 to April 1.

Prior to my retirement, I was Director of the Trails Division for the Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board. As part of my role in that position I was involved in various capacities in the development of recreational trails in an effort to help diversify the economy of Northeastern Minnesota. One of the trails developed and subsequently maintained as part of our efforts was the Iron Ore Snowmobile Trail.

The Iron Ore Snowmobile Trail was developed in the mid 1980's as the result of a collaborative effort of several state and local units of government and property owners with the Vermilion Penguins Snowmobile Club being the lead organization. It was developed under the guidelines of the Minnesota Trails Assistance Program, more commonly referred to as the Grant-In-Aid (GIA) program. For the most part, authorization for use of the properties traversed was in the form of a license/permit which allowed properties to be used for recreational snowmobiling from December 1 to April 1 on an annual basis. Beyond this authorized four (4) month period, no other public use was authorized. Use of this trail is limited to duly licensed snowmobiles. Further, a Trail Permit allowing for use is required since this is a GIA trail. The combination of the type of permit authorizing use of the land, the short duration of the permitted use and the license requirements allowing the participants to use the trail, all suggest that it is not a public corridor in the true meaning of the descriptive phrase, a public corridor.

In regard to winter maintenance of the trail, I was responsible for the overall supervision of the groomer operators and the scheduling of the trail grooming equipment


for the first 14 years of its existence. I found that usable length of the season to be 3 to 4 weeks less than similar trails in the immediate area. This can only be attributed to the type and height of the vegetation growing adjacent to the trail treadway. Through the years, the usable seasonal length of use increased in a direct relationship to the type, age and density of the vegetation adjacent to the treadway. In part this was due to the amount of shade the vegetation provided. Additionally, it was a reflection of the susceptibility of the trail to ground drifting of the snow. In the more elevated and open areas of the trail the snow depths on the treadway was substantially less than other areas of the trail. Consequently, the reduced length of the season. Alteration of existing vegetation growing adjacent to the trail will reduce the length of the current season.

It is my understanding that based on the input received at the February 15th meeting other siting alternatives would allow for utilization of public lands to the east of the initially proposed route and within the identified 6000' wide corridor. Beyond the easterly corridor siting boundary, there appears to be several options for siting of the line on public lands. I am confident that environmental issues are of a concern in the siting of the line. However, these environmental challenges can be addressed and overcome. It is not uncommon to encounter environmental challenges in this area. Power lines are located in similar types of situations within this immediate area. One such line is the powerline from Babbitt to Embarrass which this proposed electrical transmission line will be interconnected with.

In closing, I would like to urge that alternative routes be considered and utilized for the siting of this proposed powerline, especially those which utilize public lands. Both recreational snowmobile trails and the resultant tourism generated and the need for electrical power expansion are important for the continued diversification of the economy of Northeastern Minnesota.

We (Ron Norha -- Russ Norha -- Lois Steichen) own 80 acres at 7865 Bergstedt Road.

Our property has numerous 100 year old white and red pines that are within 100 feet of the existing Lake Country power line. The proposed Minn. Power route would require that these trees be cut down and would drastically alter our property. Our proposal is to move the proposed line to the east side of Bergstedt Road starting at the junction of East Saari Road and Bergstedt Road. Run the line north to where it would join the north route along Road 590. This would also eliminate a 90 degree turn at Bergstedt Road and Road 590. Also the existing Lake Country power line could be left as is.

RE: MP and GRE Tower Transmission Line Project

Dear Mr. Storm:

I am against Minnesota Power's (MP) and Great River Energy's (GRE) proposed power line route, and favor one of the two citizen's routes. The power companies route will split eleven (11) private properties in half. Seven (7) of those properties have homes/cabins on them. Most citizens are in favor of a new power line. However, all of the 100+ citizens at the recent public meetings believe routes are available across nearby public lands.

Additionally, the power companies' route will destroy the elevated sections of the Iron Ore snowmobile trail. This is a valuable connecting trail between the Taconite trail and the Laurentian trail. MP and GRE should be required to add the cost of constructing a new snowmobile trail to their power line proposal. This should be part of the environmental assessment for the power companies' proposed route.

Thank you for requiring MP and GRE to meet with the citizen's group. It has helped the group propose two additional citizen's routes. Since that time the citizen's group has met and has found additional routes that could lower MP's and GRE's costs. We know the process needs to end sometime, but we believe MP and GRE did not review the available options. It was not difficult for an inexperienced citizen's group to find viable routes through available public lands. We have created the new routes through the help of the St. Louis County land department and the Tower office of the Department of Natural Resources. We understand that MP and GRE are not required to search out public lands, but it should be in their best interest. If MP and GRE would take a less impacting approach, private citizens would not look at changing eminent domain legislation. Currently the legislation gives a lot of control to power utilities. This helps infrastructure get created. However, if utilities are allowed to run-over private property at will, when public land is available, then new legislation may be needed.

We are also concerned that the final substation location is not part of the scoping process. It is our understanding that the land purchase has not been finalized and that the Substation near Soudan could be a viable location. Should this not be part of the scoping process?

I have attached our arguments for selecting one of the citizen's routes. I hope this helps with your environmental assessment.







Mr. Storm, I want to go on record as opposing the placement of the northern portion of the proposed transmission line on the abandon rail grade. Since its abandonment over twenty years ago the rail grade has turned into a privately owned walking trail. It is not a public route of transportation. The land owners give the snowmobile club permission to use the route for their trail. One point that is very disturbing is the fact that this route cuts through the middle of many private properties. It doesn't follow survey lines or normal edges of property. Cutting through the middle of a forty acre lot is way too much to ask of private landowners, especially when there is an alternate route on public land. There are twelve landowners on the northern end of the proposed route and all of them are opposed to this plan. That's 100%. As you know some of the landowners have negotiated two alternate routes. I believe these routes should be considered because they were developed with the power companies and the local county representatives. At this meeting everyone in the room agreed to some degree that these were viable routes and other then cost there should be no problem with them. This in my mind was an agreement between all parties.

This old rail grade has caught the attention of the power company as a route because of its ease to construct. This is troublesome to the local landowners that fear that more and larger lines will soon follow. In fact a number of the landowners, including myself will not give permission to the snowmobile club next year if the power line goes on the grade. According to the snowmobile club members this will force them to look for funding of an alternate route, and may cause a negative economic impact on the area if no funding is available. We can live with the snowmobile trail, but we can't live with anyone thinking they can use this land for power poles, lines, gas lines, and bike trails just because it's a snowmobile trail.

I also think the power companies are going to use the added cost of the two alternate routes to disqualify them. This is not right. They should not be allowed to just choose the easiest route for themselves and then claim added costs. This would mean that whatever route they choose first will always win out.

I know you are aware of these issues and I am sending this for you to use as public input and as a matter of record. I thank you for helping out all parties in this issue and find your involvement very professional.



Re: Tower Transmission Project – Environmental Assessment

Dear Mr. Storm,

The following are specific impacts and mitigative measures that should be covered in your environmental review for the Tower Transmission Project.

- 1) The statutory township of Kugler (T 61, R 15) consists of approximately 7,686 acres of privately owned land and approximately 15,354 acres of publicly owned land. The publicly owned land is not parkland. Over 86% of the public land in Kugler is State of Minnesota tax forfeited land administered by St. Louis County (13,240 acres). As suggested by the fact of prior tax forfeiture this is not prime land. The balance of public land is City of Tower (1080 acres), State (820 acres), Town of Kugler (120 acres), Federal (40 acres), and St. Louis County Highway Department (40 acres). The preferred alignment would divide or otherwise impact privately owned parcels of 1,080 acres, 14% of the privately owned land in Kugler Township. What impacts can be expected and how might the route be altered to minimize impacting such a large portion of the property tax base in Kugler Township?
- 2) The preferred alignment follows a recreational trail for approximately 5.5 miles. This existing trail is considered the most likely route for the Mesabi Trail extension to Tower and Ely. The Mesabi Trail is a paved, multiuse trail. Minnesota Power has stated that the existing railroad grade in this portion of the alignment would be a beneficial access to the adjacent proposed power line (2-21-07, DNR-Tower). Since MP/GRE expects to use the grade for maintenance and repairs then the grade must be within the easement area. Heavy utility equipment and a paved trail cannot be expected to be compatible uses of the narrow grade. Therefore the assessment must include a review of the possible use of this corridor for a Mesabi Trail extension and the impacts of the loss of this trail corridor for use as a Mesabi Trail route including additional acquisition and construction costs for an alternative trail location.
- 3) William Storm (DOC) stated that trails, especially mechanized trails, and power lines are not incompatible (2-13-07, Embarrass Town Hall). This sets aside the fact that, while power lines may be very similar, trails differ from one to another in many ways; aesthetics, terrain, openness, the *feel* of the trail. The assessment must include a discussion of possible impacts of an immediately adjacent power line on an existing trail, with the trail being taken up in the easement, including

possible future uses of the trail, through a forested area with a very limited amount of current development impacts.

- 4) It is reasonable to expect that the simple proposal of this power line alignment on this trail corridor has already negatively impacted the process of obtaining trail easements for clubs and government agencies. What increased impacts or additional impacts may be expected on the process and ease of obtaining trail easements from private land owners by clubs and government agencies if approval is granted for the preferred alignment?
- 5) The preferred alignment parallels Fuller Creek, a designated trout stream, for almost a mile and one half as the stream meanders from one side of the grade to the other (T61 R 15, sections 8, 17, & 20). What impacts can be expected on the stream and the watershed from the close proximity for this extended distance, during installation and with ongoing repairs and maintenance?
- 6) The preferred alignment appears to either repeatedly cross or run adjacent to the Pike River (T60 R 15, section 20). What impacts can be expected environmentally, recreationally, aesthetically, and archaeologically and how might these impacts be mitigated?

Alternative routes have been proposed by members of the public. The following may be considered reasons in support of these alternate routes:

- 1) Fully two thirds of the land in Kugler Township (T61, R 15) is public land. The alternate routes utilize this public land to avoid bisecting private holdings and to impact many fewer private landowners and have impacts only at private parcel boundaries. Thus impacts would be reduced on residents, private landowners, and the property tax base.
- 2) The alternative routes eliminate impacts on over 5.5 miles of recreational trail and impact the trail in only two crossings. The trail corridor is also preserved for future use as a paved, multiuse portion of the Mesabi Trail system.
- 3) The alternative routes eliminate impacts on Fuller Creek and eliminates at least 3 crossings, while the preferred route parallels Fuller Creek for over a mile and a half as the creek meanders from one side of the alignment to the other.
- 4) While portions of the alternate routes are a little over a mile from intersecting roads, portions of the preferred route (both North and South) are also over a mile from intersecting roads. In fact the South portion of the preferred route runs cross-country in a fashion very similar to the alternative routes.
- 5) The alternative routes would prevent additional negative impacts on the ability to obtain future trail easements locally, regionally, and statewide.
- 6) The alternate routes can accommodate expansion of transmission line capacity with minimal additional impact and with no impact to human settlement.
- 7) The alternative routes minimize negative effects on; human settlements, public health and safety, land based economies (specifically tourism), archaeological and historic resources, and the natural environment.

Dear Mr. Storm:

I am writing concerning the Embarrass-Tower HVTL project (PUC Docket No. E015/TL-06-1624). I would like to apologize for not getting this to you sooner, but I was just made aware of the routes proposed by the citizens' committee. In looking at these routes I do believe they would be the best option as far as avoiding human conflict as much as possible, though it is my impression that they could be easily dismissed as not being cost feasible because of the added length and the fact that they do not fall into the original proposed corridor for the line. Because of these factors, I am submitting the attached route for consideration.

I believe that the enclosed route would be the best alternative for the landowners and snowmobilers as a whole, while keeping the total length of the line about the same total length as that of the route proposed by the applicants. The route I am proposing would run mostly through public, tax-forfeit property while staying on or near property lines where private property cannot be avoided. It also better avoids the sensitive ecosystems of Fuller's Creek and the adjacent wetlands.

The major objection many have with the applicants' route following the Iron Ore Grant-in-Aid Snowmobile Trail is that it passes through the middle of the private properties affected, nowhere near the property lines. The justification the applicants are using for their route is that is an "established corridor", though it amounts to nothing more than a twenty foot wide snowmobile trail running along an abandoned rail grade. There is no current right-of-way and there would still be a need for significant clearing of forested areas to accommodate the line. The route I am proposing would require little more clearing of forested areas and add little extra total length to the line than that of the current proposed route, while mitigating the negative effects on the landowners involved.

As I am sure you already know, the applicants' proposed route along the Iron Ore Trail has caused a number of the involved landowners to serve notice to the snowmobile club that operates the trail that after this season the club will no longer have permission to pass through their properties. These landowners, who receive no compensation for allowing

the trail, feel that if this trail is going to leave them susceptible to a project such as this proposed line and seemingly any other similar infrastructure project, it makes no sense to continue to give permission to allow a grant-in-aid trail through their properties. Other areas of the same abandoned rail grade that run through private property and have no trail are totally grown over and are barely distinguishable as a former rail grade. I doubt these areas would ever be regarded as an established corridor for a project such as this. Is this how these landowners should be rewarded for sacrificing a part of their properties for public recreation and the betterment of the local economy? Allowing the applicants to use the reasoning that a grant-in-aid trail constitutes an "existing corridor" would set a disturbing precedent that could jeopardize this state's entire grant-in-aid trail system, cause irreparable damage to the local tourism industry, and possibly damage the tourism industry anywhere grant-in-aid trails are a vital part of the economy.

In addition, the route I am proposing would mitigate any possible damage to Fuller's Creek and the adjacent wetlands by moving the route onto the higher ground to the east. The applicants' proposed route closely follows the creek for a distance of over a mile while crossing it up to five times. This is a stream that I have fished trout in since I was a child. I doubt that the construction process and the herbicides used in the maintenance of power lines would have a positive impact on this sensitive ecosystem.

It seems to me that the only factor considered by the applicants in their route is cost, regardless of the impact their route would have on area residents and the environment. I believe that if the alternate routes are examined more closely and **all** the factors spelled out in statute 4400.3150 truly are considered, the choice to move to an alternate route will be an easy one. There are many other people who share my feelings about this project and we are prepared to fight for our collective voice to be heard every step of the way. Thank you for your time and consideration.

After much thought about writing a comment letter to you about the proposed power line route, I realize that my original speech given before all the people present at the February 13, 2007 meeting in Embarrass covers my thoughts best. I am enclosing that speech on paper as I presented it that night.

Since our meeting with all parties involved at the DNR Office in Tower, I am left with one big question. I know you gave the citizens group a chance at a second route that night. Our second choice was ½ mile further west than the first proposal. We had another route picked out beforehand that was another ½ mile further west. I am sending you a map of the suggested 3rd citizens route. If cost becomes a critical factor on which route to use, I would like this proposal to go on record as another way of making our citizens routes less costly. I do not trust MP and GRE for supposedly helping us in good faith. They were all too willing to put taped routes on their map knowing that these routes were outside of the proposed alignment corridor and were longer.

May I repeat one more time. We are not against a new power line. Our request is for the power companies to abandon their choice of following the Iron Ore Trail route which is mostly on private land, to a route further east that is on mostly public land.

My name is Gary Skogman and I am the Trail Coordinator for the Vermilion Penguin Snowmobile Club. We are the club that is in charge of the Iron Ore Trail. This is the snowmobile trail that MP and GRE wants to use for their powerline alignment route. We realize that many snowmobile trails are built along power line routes and we thank the power companies.

I would like to give you a little history of this snowmobile trail. During the 1980's many of the snowmobile routes in this area were completed. The Taconite Trail was finished from Ely westward to Grand Rapids. The Babbitt Club connected a trail from the Taconite Trail thru Babbitt to the Giants Ridge area. The Virginia area club had the Laurentian Trail that connected Giants Ridge and went westward until it reached the Taconite Trail north of the Sand Lake area. This created a circle route of 180 miles—a long trip. In the 80's the DM&IR abandoned its railroad between Ely and Embarrass. The land along this railroad route was given back or sold to the adjacent land owners. This land then became private land.

At this time our club pursued the idea of trying to establish a snowmobile route between Tower-Soudan and Embarrass. This 16 mile trail would provide a crosslink making 2—90 mile loops to the previously mentioned trail. With a lot of hard work our club was able to get permission from all the many landowners and establish the Iron Ore Trail. Money for the maintenance of this trail came through the Grant-in-Aid system managed by the DNR and Trails & Waterways Division. For the first 14 years our club contracted with the IRRB trail grooming people to groom this trail. This division of the IRRB was disbanded and we were on our own to continue with the grooming of this trail. We purchased additional grooming equipment so we could take care of this trail. This came at a cost of many thousands of dollars.

Now the need for more power in our area threatens the very existence of our trail. MP and GRE want to use approximately 6 miles of this trail for a new power line. We do not question the need for more power in this area or the construction of a new power line. We question their route selection. By them using the route of the Iron Ore Trail it would make a beautiful trail almost useless. This old railroad grade is built up in the air where it crosses many low land and creek areas. After they clear the route to a width of about 100 feet this trail would no longer hold snow and be windy. It would be like having a trail built on top of the Great Wall of China. Furthermore, the land owners in this area would no longer give us permission to cross their private land.


A very easy solution can be made to all our problems. The route of this powerline could be moved a little further East and be built on all the public land that parallels the Iron Ore Trail. This entire route is on more highland and has been extensively logged over in recent years. It is mostly small growth poplar. Construction of a powerline in this area would not be difficult.

The most important thing to remember about this route is that they would be using public land (our land) and not be taking private land away from our friends and neighbors.
