**NOTICE OF APPLICATION
FOR A PIPELINE ROUTING PERMIT
AND
PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETINGS**

In the Matter of the Application to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission for a Pipeline Routing Permit and Partial Exemption from Pipeline Route Selection Procedures for the Nashwauk Public Utilities Commission, Nashwauk-Blackberry Natural Gas Pipeline Project.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE a public information meeting will be held at the place and time identified below, concerning the application submitted by the Nashwauk Public Utilities Commission (NPUC) for a pipeline routing permit to construct a 23-mile natural gas pipeline in Itasca County originating at a take-off point on an existing Great Lakes Gas (GLG) 36-inch pipeline in Blackberry Township and terminating in the city of Nashwauk. The NPUC submitted the pipeline application to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (PUC) on March 7, 2007. On March 29 the PUC accepted the application as complete, and initiated the public review process.

Staff of the Minnesota Department of Commerce (DOC) will conduct the public meeting on behalf of the PUC and describe the state's pipeline permitting process and how the public may be involved. In conjunction with the DOC information meetings, the NPUC will hold an open house prior to each public meeting to answer questions and provide the public with information about the project.

Project Description

The proposed pipeline will have an outside diameter of 24-inches and an operating pressure of 599 pounds per square inch gauge (psig). The pipeline will be buried underground and run adjacent to existing utilities to the maximum extent possible within Itasca County in the townships of Blackberry, Trout Lake, Iron Range, Greenway and Nashwauk, and the cities of Taconite and Nashwauk.

The NPUC plans to have the pipeline in service by November 2008.

Project Location

The proposed 23-mile natural gas pipeline will begin about 0.6 miles southeast of the GLG block valve station located just south of U.S. Highway 2 near the unincorporated town of Blackberry, Minnesota. The first 2 miles of the route will extend north-northeast to avoid a large wetland bog north of U.S. Highway 2. From there the proposed route will turn due east approximately 2 miles to be aligned directly south of the city of Taconite. The proposed route will extend north from this point about 1.5 miles where it will cross the Swan River and then continue north where it will parallel an existing 8-inch Northern Natural Gas pipeline right-of-way for approximately 0.9 miles and then follow a proposed 230 kV high voltage transmission line (HVTL) route for 4.2 miles. Within this segment, the route will cross the Swan River a second time. The next 1.3 miles of the proposed route will run within an existing HVTL right-of-way north of the city of Taconite. At Taconite the pipeline will turn to the east, where it will proceed eastwards to the termination point within the city of Nashwauk along 9-miles of new route.

PUC Pipeline Routing Permit Requirements

The PUC is reviewing this project pursuant to the requirements of the Pipeline Routing Rules (Minnesota Rules, Chapter 4415). This set of rules contains two different types of review procedures for a pipeline routing permit. The NPUC is seeking review under the shorter of the two review processes, referred to as a partial exemption from pipeline route selection procedures. Both review procedures require the applicant to submit the same information; however, the shorter process does not require the applicant to identify an alternative route and does not require a contested case hearing.

The Department of Commerce (DOC) holds public information meetings to provide information on the permitting process and to receive information to assist the PUC in determining whether to grant or deny the partial exemption application.

In deciding whether to grant or deny the partial exemption, the PUC shall consider comments that are filed with the DOC, the record of the public information meetings, and the information contained in the application relevant to the criteria for a partial exemption. Any person may file comments with the PUC stating reasons why the PUC should grant or deny the partial exemption. If the PUC grants the partial exemption application, it will also issue a pipeline routing permit. If the partial exemption is denied, the applicant may request that the PUC continue processing its application under full pipeline route selection procedures.


