
**WHEREAS,** the Developer is a Minnesota limited liability company organized by Minnesota residents; and


**WHEREAS,** the project calls for the development of up to 36 megawatts of wind energy to be produced by up to eighteen turbines; and


The Faribault County EDA, at their last meeting, discussed the positive economic impact the development Windfinity, Inc. could have in western Faribault County.

**RE: Project Area Environmental Scan**

Dear Mr. Thompson:

Big Blue Windfarm, LLC is investigating certain tracts in Faribault County as potential locations of a wind-powered energy facility. While the project is still in the planning and development stage, it is estimated that the facility will consist of approximately 24, 1.5 MW turbines, and a new collector substation and transmission line.

We are consulting the Faribault County Coordinator office for assistance in identifying environmental properties, concerns or issues within the boundaries of the tracts listed that would influence a decision regarding the use of the land for wind electric generation or transmission. We are specifically interested in such information as setbacks to roads, residents, and any other special or sensitive environmental conditions that exist in or near the study area.

While many details, including the exact location of wind turbines and precise route of the transmission line, have yet to be determined, the area shown in the attached figure is the primary focus of our investigation. The project area includes portions of the following tracts:

**Township Range Sections**

T-102N R-28W 16, 17, 26-31

This information will be used as an initial step to help guide project development in a manner that identifies and avoids impacts to sensitive resources where practicable. We have sent similar query letters to other agencies including the Faribault County Planning and Zoning, US Fish and Wildlife Service, MN DNR and US Army Corp of Engineers. We will also conduct a site survey of areas proximal to proposed facilities in order to preliminarily determine the presence of wetlands.

If you are able, we would appreciate a preliminary scan of parcels in your district by June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2006. Please contact me at 507-464-3324 if you have any questions.

Daniel,

I've taken a look at the map and project description. There are no known federally listed threatened or endangered species within your project boundary. As Mark told you previously, there are no Service lands or easements within the action area; however, the Pilot Grove Waterfowl Production Area is located approximately 1.5 miles south of the project boundary. It appears the best way to minimize adverse impacts to migratory birds and bats from the turbines is to leave as much buffer as possible between the outermost turbines and Badger Creek, which feeds into the Blue Earth River at the east of the project boundary.

We appreciate the opportunity to provide preliminary comments on the proposed project. If you need a copy of the Service's guidelines regarding siting and lighting considerations for windpower projects/individual turbines, please let me know. We would appreciate an update on the project once your design and turbine locations/# of turbines proposed is more fully developed.

The Minnesota Natural Heritage database has been reviewed to determine if any rare plant or animal species or other significant natural features are known to occur within an approximate one-mile radius of the area indicated on the map enclosed with your information request. Based on this review, there are no known occurrences of rare species or native plant communities in the area searched.

The Natural Heritage database is maintained by the Natural Heritage and Nongame Research Program, a unit within the Division of Ecological Services, Department of Natural Resources. It is continually updated as new information becomes available, and is the most complete source of data on Minnesota's rare or otherwise significant species, native plant communities, and other natural features. Its purpose is to foster better understanding and protection of these features.

Because our information is not based on a comprehensive inventory, there may be rare or otherwise significant natural features in the state that are not represented in the database. A county-by-county survey of rare natural features is now underway, but has not been completed for Faribault County. Therefore ecologically significant features for which we have no records may exist on the project area.

Please be aware that review by the Natural Heritage and Nongame Research Program focuses only on *rare natural features*. It does not constitute review or approval by the Department of Natural Resources as a whole. If you require further information on the environmental review process for other natural resource-related issues, you may contact your Regional Environmental Assessment Ecologist, Todd Kolander, at (507) 359-6073.

An invoice in the amount of \$75.42 will be mailed to you under separate cover within several weeks of the date of this letter. Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the above project. It has been reviewed pursuant to the responsibilities given the Minnesota Historical Society by the Minnesota Historic Sites Act and the Minnesota Field Archaeology Act.

We believe that there is a good probability that unreported archaeological properties might be present in the project area. Therefore, we recommend that a survey of the area be completed. The survey must meet the requirements of the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Identification and Evaluation, and should include an evaluation of National Register eligibility for any properties that are identified. For your information, we have enclosed a list of consultants who have expressed an interest in undertaking such surveys.

If the project area can be documented as previously disturbed or previously surveyed, we will re-evaluate the need for survey. Previously disturbed areas are those where the naturally occurring post-glacial soils and sediments have been recently removed. Any previous survey work must meet contemporary standards.

Please note that this comment letter does not address the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and 36CFR800, procedures of the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation for the protection of historic properties. If this project is considered for federal assistance, or requires a federal license or permit, it should be submitted to our office with reference to the appropriate federal agency.

Big Blue Wind Farm, LLC is in the process of performing an environmental review for the Public Utilities Commission in order that it may assess the environmental impacts of the construction of a large wind energy conversion system (LWECS). The Project site is located in Faribault County approximately 6 miles west of the town of Blue Earth, Minnesota. The Big Blue Wind Farm will be built a total installed capacity of 36 MW, to be constructed in 2010. The Project will consist of 18 wind turbines, transformers, meteorological towers, access roads, underground and overhead electrical lines, a substation and switchyard. The site boundary encompasses an area of approximately 6,400 acres. However, the land occupied by the wind farm would be less than 1% of this area. 

Big Blue Wind Farm, LLC is applying for a Site Permit to construct a large wind energy conversion system (LWECS), the Big Blue Wind Farm. The Project site is located in Faribault County approximately 6 miles west of the town of Blue Earth, Minnesota. The Big Blue Wind Farm will be built a total installed capacity of 36 MW, to be constructed in 2010. The Project will consist of 18 wind turbines, transformers, meteorological towers, access roads, underground and overhead electrical lines, a substation and switchyard. The site boundary encompasses an area of approximately 6,400 acres. However, the land occupied by the wind farm would be less than 1% of this area. It is anticipated that the area of direct land use for the turbines and associated facilities would be approximately 32 acres and this would include approximately 11 miles of 30 foot wide gravel access roads.

Describe the existing land use of the project site. What types of land cover/habitat will be impacted by the proposed project?  
Currently, the land use is agricultural row crops, scattered rural residences, and animal confinement buildings.

List any waterbodies (e.g., rivers, intermittent streams, lakes, wetlands) that may be affected by the proposed project, and how they may be impacted (e.g., dewatering, discharge, riverbed disturbance).

The predominant surface waters in the vicinity of the site are portions of Little Badger Creek and Judicial Ditch # 12. The Little Badger Creek joins the Blue Earth River. On-site or off-site flooding would not likely result from the construction and grading of roads and other facilities related to the Project. Implementation of environmental protection measures such as installation of adequately-sized and appropriately placed culverts, and avoidance of channels and other areas of concentrated flow, would ensure that such on-site or off-site flooding does not occur. The wind turbines will be built on uplands, and this will avoid streams located in topographically lower positions in the landscape. Wetlands on site will be delineated in the Spring of 2010.

Dear Ms. Kahler Royer,

As requested, the Minnesota Natural Heritage Information System has been queried to determine if any rare species or other significant natural features are known to occur within an approximate one-mile radius of the proposed project. Based on this query, there are no known occurrences of rare species within the search area. Please note, however, that the Minnesota County Biological Survey (MCBS) has identified native prairie remnants outside of the project boundary in the railroad right-of-way in T102N R28W Sections 7 & 8 (GIS shapefiles of MCBS Railroad Rights-of-way Prairies can be downloaded from the DNR's Data Deli website at <http://deli.dnr.state.mn.us/>). Given that more than 99% of the prairie that was present in the state before settlement has been destroyed, and more than one-third of Minnesota's endangered, threatened, and special concern species are now dependent on the remaining small fragments of Minnesota's prairie ecosystem, we feel that all prairie remnants merit protection. As such, the prairies should be considered an avoidance area for any transmission lines or other utilities associated with the wind farm.

The Natural Heritage Information System (NHIS), a collection of databases that contains information about Minnesota's rare natural features, is maintained by the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Ecological Resources. The NHIS is continually updated as new information becomes available, and is the most complete source of data on Minnesota's rare or otherwise significant species, native plant communities, and other natural features. However, the NHIS is not an exhaustive inventory and thus does not represent all of the occurrences of rare features within the state. Therefore, ecologically significant features for which we have no records may exist within the project area.

This letter does not constitute review or approval by the Department of Natural Resources as a whole. Instead, it identifies issues regarding known occurrences of rare features and potential effects to these rare features. Additional rare features for which we have no data may be present in the project area, or there may be other natural resource concerns associated with the proposed project. For these concerns, please contact your DNR Regional Environmental Assessment Ecologist, Kevin Mixon, at (507) 359-6073. Please be aware that additional site assessments or review may be required.
