



PMAP, Medical Education and Research Costs (MERC) investment

Issue:

The Medical Education and Research Costs (MERC) fund compensates hospitals and clinics for a portion of the costs of clinical medical training. These funds support clinical training in Minnesota's teaching hospitals, which are vital activities affecting not only the health care community but also the health of every citizen and the economy of the entire state.

Proposals:

The governor's budget proposes, effective July 1, 2013:

- Increasing MERC funding from the Prepaid Medical Assistance Program to \$49.5 million for the FY 2014-15 biennium
- Targeting the additional funding to eligible hospital and clinical training sites
- Modifying the MERC distribution formula to support primary care training and other critical health care workforce needs.

Impact:

This proposal will:

- Ensure sufficient funding for facilities providing medical education and research.
- Prepare Minnesota for future health care workforce needs.
- Generate an equal amount of federal matching funding.

Fiscal impact:

- FY 2014: \$6.40 million
- FY 2015: \$6.40 million
- FY 2016: \$6.40 million
- FY 2017: \$6.40 million
