



County Performance Management System

Issue:

- The 2009 Minnesota Legislature created the Steering Committee on Performance and Outcome Reforms to establish a list of essential human services (mandated by federal or state government), establish minimum outcome standards for those services, and develop a uniform data collection and review process.
- The committee also was charged with developing a performance management system for the state-county human services system.

Proposal:

- The governor recommends funding to support the development and implementation of a performance management system for the state-county human services system.
- Funding covers the administration of an advisory committee, development of performance standards and technical assistance to support improvement of low-performing counties.

Impact:

- This proposal is aimed at creating a performance management system that will transform the state-county relationship in the delivery of human services.
- This proposal will re-focus the state supervisory role to ensure, through support and enforcement, that counties are achieving desired outcomes.
- The new system will be a powerful tool for accountability and continuous improvement that can adapt to changing needs over time.

Fiscal impact:

- FY 2014: \$796,250
- FY 2015: \$704,000
- FY 2016: \$608,000
- FY 2017: \$704,000
