Settings/services reviewed

Day settings (non-residential):

- **Adult day care** (BI, CAC, CADI): Adult day care service provides supervision, care assistance, training and activities based on the participant's needs. The services are directed toward the achievement of specific outcomes as identified in the community support plan. Services must be designed to meet both the health and social needs of the participants. Adult day service providers must be licensed under Minnesota Rules, parts [9555.9600 to 9555.9730](#). Providers must also meet the requirements and standards in Minnesota Statutes, sections [245A.01 through 245A.16](#), with the exception of 245A.143.
- **Day training and habilitation** (DD): Day services that develop and maintain life skills for people with developmental disabilities or related conditions so they can fully participate in community life. Day training and habilitation providers must be licensed under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 245D](#).
- **Prevocational services** (CADI, CAC, BI): Services that prepare people with disabilities for jobs with competitive pay and help them to achieve greater independence in their communities. Prevocational services teach general work skills and concepts rather than specific work skills for a particular job. Prevocational service providers must be licensed under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 245D](#).
- **Structured day program** (BI): Service designed for people who may benefit from continued rehabilitation and community integration directed at the development and maintenance of community living skills. Structured day service providers must be licensed under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 245D](#).

Provider-controlled residential settings:

- **Foster care** (BI, CAC, CADI): Foster care services include the provision of food, lodging, protection, supervision and household services to a functionally impaired adult in a residence and may also include the provision of personal care, household and living skills assistance or training, and medication assistance. Foster care providers must be licensed under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 245D](#).
- **Customized living** (BI, CADI): Customized living is an individualized package of regularly scheduled health-related and supportive services provided to a person residing in a qualified residential center that is a registered Housing with Services Establishment under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 144D](#). A customized living provider holds a comprehensive home care license as required in Minnesota Statutes, sections [144A.43 through 144A.47](#).
- **Supported living service** (DD): Supported living services are habilitation services provided in the person's residence and in the community, and should be directed toward increasing and maintaining the person's physical, intellectual, emotional and social functioning. Supported living service providers must be licensed under [Minnesota Statutes, chapter 245D](#).
