



Getting Started

- Before conducting a paddlewheel game with a table, an organization's gambling manager must attend a board-authorized class on the conduct of paddlewheel with table.
- Within 14 calendar days of beginning paddlewheel with table operation the organization must provide the Gambling Control Board with one day's worth of recorded table activity for approval. Failure to receive approval by the end of the 14 calendar days may result in the immediate suspension of table activity.

Video Requirements

- Rail to rail coverage of the table and the operator.
- Real time recording with date and time stamp.
- Clear images of the table and wheel which allows for verification of chip values, bet placement/payouts, the pointer, winning number on the paddlewheel, and the drop box.
- Retention of recorded paddlewheel with table activity equal to 90 calendar days.
- Continuing system maintenance. If at any point the video requirements prescribed by the state are not met, the paddlewheel with table operation must be closed. (7861.0300, subp. 7)



General Information

- If there is a gambling manager change with an organization that is already running a paddlewheel with table operation, the new gambling manager must attend the paddlewheel with table class within 60 days of the effective date of the new gambling manager's license.
- Every week, one day of activity must be reviewed and be documented in a log that shows who conducted the review and when it was conducted.
- The video must be reviewed by an independent person, which does not include the paddlewheel cashier, operator, lessor, or family/employees of the lessor.
- If your organization opens additional tables, the video must be approved within 14 calendar days.
- No more than two tables may be located at a permitted premises.
