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Governor Dayton's Budget for Duluth

The Governor's budget proposal is fair, responsible and moves Minnesota forward. For Duluth he has proposed new investments in education from our earliest learners to new investments that will put the dream of higher education within the reach of every Minnesotan. The Governor's proposal also makes our state's tax system more fair for all Minnesotans by asking the richest among us to pay their fair share in taxes.

In St. Louis County, that means asking only 883 taxpayers to pay a little bit more in income taxes. In exchange, the state will be able to afford important new investments in the Duluth community. By asking the 883 richest residents of St. Louis County to pay a little more in taxes, we can provide an additional \$6,887,687 to Duluth schools. This new revenue also allows us to make college more affordable by providing \$1,093,500 in new grant money for Duluth college students.

In total, by asking the 883 richest residents of St. Louis County to pay their fair share in taxes, we can invest **\$10,868,867** in Duluth's students, schools and property tax relief. This is a deal worth making.
