Proclamation

WHEREAS: Memorial Day serves as a day of remembrance, and people will gather in small towns and big cities for one purpose: to remember our fallen, pay homage to their sacrifices and courage, and to recognize the selflessness of military service; and

WHEREAS: Across the nation and in the State of Minnesota, we thank those who undertake the great responsibility of defending our liberties and protecting democracy; and

WHEREAS: Today, we honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for this great nation; and

WHEREAS: The United States of America and the State of Minnesota honor the spirit, courage and tenacity of generations of Armed Forces members and their families. As we pray for peace in our world, let us never forget those who have served on our behalf.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, May 30, 2016, as:

MEMORIAL DAY

in the State of Minnesota, and do hereby order all United States flags and Minnesota flags to be flown at half-staff at all state and federal buildings in the State of Minnesota, from sunrise until noon on Monday, May 30, 2016, in honor of those who have served on our behalf.
