Commissioner Nickolai moved to require a follow-up report from interested parties in 9 months.

In the Matter of Wireless Local Termination Tariff Applicable to Commercial Mobile Radio Service Providers That Do Not Have Interconnection Agreements with CenturyTel of Minnesota

Commissioner Reha moved to reconsider the Commission's ORDER REQUIRING

REVISED FILING (November 18, 2003).

The motion passed 3-0.

Commissioner Nickolai moved to do the following:

- Modify the Order to require CenturyTel of Minnesota (CenturyTel) to incorporate the following language into a revised tariff filing:

“This tariff does not apply when an interconnection agreement already exists between a CMRS provider and CenturyTel. Further, this tariff ceases to apply as of the date CenturyTel receives a request from a CMRS provider for negotiation under 47 U.S.C. § 252(b)(1).”

- Clarify that the CenturyTel tariff applies to all intrastate traffic that originates and terminates in Minnesota.

Commissioner Reha asked to amend the motion to include the following:

- Approve CenturyTel's tariff that conforms to the requirements specified in this Order and the prior Order, and
- direct CenturyTel, if it chooses to file a tariff, to make its compliance filing within 30 days of this Order.

Commissioner Nickolai agreed to the amendment.

The amended motion passed 3-0.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
