TELECOMMUNICATIONS AGENDA

P-3057,5634/RV-04-682

In the Matter of the Revocation of Dakota Telecommunications Group's Certificate of Authority

Commissioner Reha moved that the Commission-

- revoke TCI Communications, Inc./Dakota Telecommunications Group's certificate of authority;
- find no violation of Minn. Stat. § 237.74, subd. 12 ;
- inform all local exchange carriers and interexchange carriers that TCI Communications, Inc./Dakota Telecommunications Group is no longer authorized to provide service in Minnesota;

The motion passed 4-0.

P-5323,5478/RV-04-635

In the Matter of the Revocation of Ovation Communications of Minnesota, Inc.'s Certificate of Authority

Commissioner Nickolai moved that the Commission-

- revoke Ovation Communications of Minnesota, Inc.'s certificate of authority;
- find no violation of Minn. Stat. § 237.74, subd. 12 ;
- inform all local exchange carriers and interexchange carriers that Ovation Communications of Minnesota, Inc. is no longer authorized to provide service in Minnesota;

The motion passed 4-0.

P-6052/C-04-539

In the Matter of the Complaint of the Minnesota Department of Commerce Against Global Crest Communications, Inc.

Commissioner Reha moved that the Commission issue a Show Cause Order against Global Crest Communications, Inc. directing the company to provide a written explanation withing 30 days explaining why its Certificate of Authority should not be revoked.

The motion passed 4-0.

P-5868/C-04-748

In the Matter of the Complaint Against UKI Communications, Inc.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Commission Issue a Show Cause Order against UKI, requiring UKI to demonstrate within 30 days of the Order

- why the Commission should not find that UKI has violated §§237.661-662 and 237.121;
- why the Commission should not order UKI to fully credit the outstanding charges of customers for whom UKI is not able to provide proof of verification as required by §237.661; and
- why the Commission should not revoke UKI's Certificate of Authority with prejudice.

The motion passed 4-0.

P-999/CI-04-600

In the Matter of Department of Commerce/TAM's (Telecommunications Access Minnesota, formerly TACIP) (DOC/TAM) FY 2005 Proposed Budget and Surcharge Recommendation

Commissioner Reha moved that the Commission-

- approve DOC/TAM's Proposed Budget;
- approve DOC/TAM's proposal to decrease the surcharge from 13 cents to 10 cents per month;

The motion passed 4-0.

P-et.al/M-04-707

In the Matter of the Petition by the Minnesota Independent Coalition for Suspension or Modification of Local Number Portability Obligations Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. §251(f)(2)

Commissioner Nickolai moved that the Commission take the following action:

1. grant MIC's request for suspension of its member companies' federal number portability obligations;
 - the suspension is granted only until July 30, 2004;
2. require Qwest to reconfigure its tandems to accept wireline to wireless traffic from the MIC members at the following interim rates:
 - \$10.00 per month per rural company;

- \$300.00 per month per metro company;
3. If parties do not reach a permanent agreement on rates within 90 days, the issue of the rate is to be sent to the Office of Administrative Hearings for contested case proceedings;
 - require the parties to report back to the Executive Secretary before the end of the 90 days as to whether or not they have reached agreement;
 - the matter to be sent for contested case proceedings is limited to the issue of appropriate pricing for wireless LNP traffic;
 4. The Commission should immediately require the MIC Companies to properly route calls to numbers that have been ported from one wireless carrier to another;
 5. Grant the following petitions to intervene:
 - Sprint Corporation on behalf of its Wireless Division, Sprint Spectrum, L.P., d/b/a Sprint PCS; Rural Cellular Corporation; Midwest Wireless Communications, LLC; Western Wireless Corporation; Local Access Network, LLC; C-I Communications, Inc.; and Kasson-Mantorville Telephone Company;

The motion passed 4-0.
