Commissioner Johnson moved that the Commission take action on the following dockets as follows:

P-6048/RV-04-443

In the Matter of the Revocation of Telegenius, Inc.'s Certificate of Authority

1. revoke Telegenius, Inc.'s Certificate of Authority;
2. notify all local exchange carriers and interexchange carriers that Telegenius, Inc. is no longer authorized to provide service in Minnesota; and
3. clarify that Telegenius, Inc. remains responsible for any unpaid regulatory assessments or fees;

P-5940,5950/PA-04-783

In the Matter of an Application for Approval of the Transfer of Customers from Cybertel Communications Corp. to Comtec21, LLC d/b/a ComTec21 and the Waiver of Anti-slamming Requirements

P-5950/NA-00-1245

In the Matter of the Application of Cybertel Communications Corporation for a Certificate of Authority to Provide Interexchange Service

1. revoke Cybertel Communications Corp.'s Certificate of Authority;
2. notify all local exchange carriers and interexchange carriers that Cybertel Communications Corp. is no longer authorized to provide service in Minnesota; and
3. clarify that Cybertel Communications Corp. remains responsible for any unpaid regulatory assessments or fees;

In the Matter of the Petition by Garden Valley Telephone Company for Extended Area Service Between the Clearbrook and Gonvick Exchanges

1. dismiss the petitions; and
2. close the docket;

P-571/EM-04-664

In the Matter of the Petition of Gardonville Cooperative Telephone Association for a Suspension or Modification of Local Number Portability Obligations Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. §251(f)(2)

- grant Gardonville Cooperative Telephone Association's request that its petition be considered independently from the Minnesota Independent Coalition's (MIC's) petition in Docket No. P-et al./M-04-707 and that it be given until November 1, 2004 to implement Line Number Portability (LNP);

P-5614/M-04-953

In the Matter of a Petition by WETEC LLC d/b/a Unitel Communications, Inc. for Designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier

1. deny Unitel's request for state ETC designation at this time, and limit its consideration to whether the Company should be granted ETC -designation for purposes of the federal fund;
2. find that Unitel has made a credible showing of its capability and intent to provide and advertise an affordable, quality offering, including the nine federally supported services, throughout its proposed service area;
3. find that Unitel has fulfilled its requirement to provide the following:
 - clear definition of its proposed service area, including a map of its proposed boundaries;
 - a list and description of the facilities used to provide service throughout the service area for which Unitel seeks universal service support;
 - Unitel's detailed universal service offering and pricing plan for inclusion in Unitel's Minnesota tariff;
 - Unitel's plan for advertising the availability of Lifeline and Linkup throughout its proposed service area; and
 - submission of a service quality plan that complies with the Commission's existing service quality standards contained in Minnesota Rules, Part7812;
4. designate Unitel as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier for the purposes of

receiving federal universal service support, throughout its proposed service area;

5. require Unitel, as a post-designation compliance matter, to submit its plan to advertise the availability of its universal service offering throughout its proposed ETC service area.

The motion passed 5-0.

There being no further business before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
