**PROCEDURAL HISTORY**

On July 30, 1993, the Commission issued its ORDER INITIATING INVESTIGATION in the above-captioned docket. In that Order the Commission required the Department of Public Service (the Department) to report on long distance telephone company operations in Minnesota by November 29, 1993.

On November 29, 1993, the Department filed a request for a 30-day time extension for the filing of its report. The Department explained that the additional time would enable it to review long distance company responses to a survey on their operations. The time extension would allow the Department to render a complete analysis in its report.

No party opposed the Department's request for a time extension.

The matter came before the Commission for consideration on December 7, 1993.

**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS**

The Commission finds that the Department's request for a time extension is reasonable and should be granted. No party will be harmed by the delay. The additional time will be used by the Department to generate a more complete report.

The Commission will grant the Department a time extension until December 29, 1993, in which to file its report on long distance telephone company operations in Minnesota.

ORDER

1. The Department of Public Service is granted a time extension until December 29, 1993, in which to file its report on long distance telephone company operations in Minnesota.
2. This Order shall become effective immediately.
