PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On June 28, 1994, Federated Telephone Cooperative (Federated or the Cooperative) filed a request for an extension of time to file its 1994 depreciation study under Minn, Rules, part 7810.7700.

On July 11, 1994, the Minnesota Department of Public Service (the Department) filed its report and recommendation.

On August 2, 1994, the Commission met to consider this matter.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

Companies are required by law to review their depreciation rates annually to ensure that they are still generally appropriate. Minn. Rules, Part 7810.7500.

By previous Order of the Commission, Federated's five-year depreciation study for 1994 was due to be filed July 1, 1994.

In its request for additional time to file these studies, Federated did not explain why it had not filed the studies in a timely manner. The Cooperative has not borne its burden of demonstrating good cause for granting a time extension.

Accordingly, the Commission will deny Federated's request. In conjunction with the filing of its overdue study, the Company will be expected to address the reasons for the tardiness of its filing.

ORDER

1. The request of Federated Telephone Cooperative (Federated or the Cooperative) for an extension of time to September 1, 1994 to file its annual depreciation study is denied.
2. This Order shall become effective immediately.
