ORDER GRANTING RECONSIDERATION

**PROCEDURAL HISTORY**

On December 2, 1994, the Commission issued its ORDER ADOPTING PILOT PROGRAM AND REQUIRING FURTHER FILINGS in this matter.

On December 21, 1994, TRI-CAP, a Community Action Program agency, and Energy CENTS filed Petitions for Reconsideration and Rehearing of this Order.

On December 22, 1994, the last day petitions could be filed, the Minnesota Community Action Association, Inc. (MCAA) filed a similar petition.

On January 5, 1995, the Commission met to consider this matter.

**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS**

Under Minn. Stat. § 216B.27, subd. 4, petitions are deemed denied if not acted on within 20 days from the date of the filing. The 20 day period for TRI-CAP's and Energy CENTS' Petitions will expire on Tuesday, January 10, 1995 and for MCAA on Wednesday, January 11, 1995.

The Petitions cannot be properly evaluated at this time. Given the complexity of the issues involved in this proceeding, the Commission will grant reconsideration in order to toll the 20 day time period and permit a through review of the Petitions and any responses.

**ORDER**

1. The Commission grants the petitions of TRI-CAP, Energy Cents, and MCAA for reconsideration and rehearing of the Commission's December 2, 1994 Order in this docket.
2. This Order shall become effective immediately.
