ORDER APPROVING CERTIFIED 911 SYSTEM COSTS

BACKGROUND

On October 4, 1983, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (the Commission) approved Clay County's final plan for the establishment of a 911 Emergency Telephone Services System.

On February 21, 1984, the Commission approved the actual costs Northwestern Bell Telephone Company incurred for placing a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Clay County.

On May 27, 1987, the Commission approved the actual costs Felton Telephone Company (the Company) incurred for placing a portion of a 911 Emergency Telephone Service in Clay County.

On November 13, 1987, the Commission approved the actual costs Twin Valley-Ulen Telephone Company incurred for placing a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Clay County.

On March 8, 1988, the Commission approved the actual costs Red River Rural Telephone Association incurred for placing a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Clay County.

On March 16, 1988, the Commission approved the actual costs Norman County Telephone Company incurred for placing a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Clay County.

On August 3, 1988, the Commission approved the actual costs Northwestern Bell Telephone Company incurred for placing a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Clay County.

On June 2, 1994, the Commission approved the actual costs Red River Rural Telephone Association incurred for installing interexchange circuits for tandem based E911 Emergency Services in Clay County.

On March 9, 1999, the Commission approved the actual costs Barnesville Municipal Telephone Company incurred for installing a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Clay County (central office equipment and related equipment was installed November 1, 1986 but not certified until this filing).

On May 1, 2000, the Commission approved actual costs Felton Telephone Company incurred for installing Automatic Location Identification (ALI) data for the Felton and Hitterdal Exchanges.

CURRENT FILING

On December 1, 1999, Barnesville Municipal Telephone Company (the Company) installed ALI data updates for the Barnesville Exchange.

On January 20, 2000 the Company certified the actual costs it incurred for the provision of a portion of ALI services.

The Company is now requesting Commission approval of the actual ALI system costs. Commission approval is necessary before the Department of Administration (DOA) will make payments for 911 system costs.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

Minn. Stat. Section 403.11, subd. 3 states:

Subd. 3 (METHOD OF PAYMENT; CERTIFICATION.) A public utility incurring reimbursable costs under subdivision 1 or 2 shall certify those costs to the commissioner of administration. The certification shall be in a form as prescribed by the commissioner after consultation with the public utilities commission. If the commissioner and the commission approve the certified costs as appropriate and accurate, the commissioner shall pay the certified costs from money appropriated for that purpose within 90 days following receipt by the commissioner of the certified costs. The commissioner of administration shall estimate the amount required to reimburse public utilities for the state's obligations under subdivisions 1 and 2 of this section and the governor shall include the estimated amount in the biennial budget request.

Barnesville Municipal Telephone Company has certified, in writing, that the elements of 911 services and associated costs indicated on Attachment A, reflect only charges for services actually rendered in the direct provision of 911 service in Clay County.

All charges listed on Attachment A are in accordance with the Company's tariffs.

The Commission finds that the costs for 911 Emergency Telephone Service in Clay County which have been certified by the Company are appropriate and accurate.

2. This Order does not approve payment of any 911 system costs. Any possible future approval of payment for system costs shall be granted by the Commissioner of the Department of Administration in accordance with the provisions of Minn. Stat. Section 403.11.
3. This Order shall become effective immediately.
