In the Matter of **Independent Emergency Services, LLC** 's Request for Approval of Certified Actual Costs Associated with the **Hubbard County** 911 Emergency Telephone Services System

ORDER APPROVING CERTIFIED 911 SYSTEM COSTS

BACKGROUND

On November 18, 1980, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (the Commission) approved Hubbard County's final plan for the establishment of a 911 Emergency Telephone Services System.

On January 11, 1983, the Commission approved the initial costs Northwestern Bell Company incurred for placing a portion of a 911 Emergency Telephone Service in Hubbard County.

On May 24, 1983, the Commission approved the Northwestern Bell Company's revised costs associated with the initial certification approved on January 11, 1983. This certification reflected the elimination of those costs which were inappropriately included in its earlier cost calculations.

On January 9, 1985, the Commission approved the actual costs Northwestern Bell Company incurred for adding interexchange circuits for the La Parte and Becida exchanges in the Hubbard County 911 Emergency Telephone System.

On March 5, 1986, the Commission approved the actual costs incurred by Northwestern Bell Telephone company for adding interexchange circuits for the Nevis/Akeley exchange in the Hubbard County 911 Emergency Telephone System.

On January 14, 1987, the Commission approved the actual costs incurred by East Otter Tail Telephone Company for adding central office equipment for a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Hubbard County.

On March 8, 1988, the Commission approved the actual costs incurred by Paul Bunyan Rural Telephone company incurred for adding central office equipment for a portion of the 911 Emergency Services system in Hubbard County.

On June 28, 2000, the Commission approved actual costs incurred by U S West Communications for adding interexchange circuits for Automatic Number Identification (ANI) in the 911 Emergency Services system in Hubbard County.

CURRENT FILING

On October 19, 1998, Hubbard County contracted with Independent Emergency Services, LLC (IES) for the installation of a portion ANI service in their 911 Emergency Services system.

On March 28, 2000, IES installed incoming trunk ports for 10 digit ANI, from the Turtle River Selective Router (2 each) to the Akeley-Nevis, Becida, Laporte, Park Rapids, and Itasca Exchanges. IES also installed 3 Public System Answering Points (PSAP's) from the Turtle River to the Park Rapids Exchanges for ANI service.

On April 5, 2000, IES certified actual costs incurred in providing ANI to some of the exchanges in the 911 Emergency Services system in Hubbard County.

IES is now requesting Commission approval of the actual costs of providing ANI services to these exchanges. Commission approval is necessary before the Department of Administration (DOA) will make payments for 911 system costs.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

Minn. Stat. Section 403.11, subd. 3 states:

Subd. 3 (METHOD OF PAYMENT; CERTIFICATION.) A public utility incurring reimbursable costs under subdivision 1 or 2 shall certify those costs to the commissioner of administration. The certification shall be in a form as prescribed by the commissioner after consultation with the public utilities commission. If the commissioner and the commission approve the certified costs as appropriate and accurate, the commissioner shall pay the certified costs from money appropriated for that purpose within 90 days following receipt by the commissioner of the certified costs. The commissioner of administration shall estimate the amount required to reimburse public utilities for the state's obligations under subdivisions 1 and 2 of this section and the governor shall include the estimated amount in the biennial budget request.

Independent Emergency Services, LLC has certified, in writing, that the elements of 911 services and associated costs indicated on Attachment A, reflect only charges for services actually rendered in the direct provision of 911 service in Hubbard County.

All charges listed on Attachment A are in accordance with the Company's tariffs.

The Commission finds that the costs for 911 Emergency Telephone Service in Hubbard County which have been certified by the Company are appropriate and accurate.

2. This Order does not approve payment of any 911 system costs. Any possible future approval of payment for system costs shall be granted by the Commissioner of the Department of Administration in accordance with the provisions of Minn. Stat. Section 403.11.
3. This Order shall become effective immediately.
