In the Matter of Citizens Telecommunications Company of Minnesota, Inc. Election of a Federal High-Cost Universal Service Support Disaggregation Plan

The above entitled matter has been considered by the Commission and the following disposition made:

Approved proposed plan for disaggregation and targeting of universal service support.

The Commission will retain continued oversight of the plan. The Commission may require, on its own motion, upon petition by an interested party, or upon petition by Citizens Telecommunications Company of Minnesota, Inc. the disaggregation and targeting of support in a different manner at any time.

The Commission will consider the level of disaggregation of support in any such certification proceedings within Citizens' service area.

The Commission will assert its authority to determine and rule upon a disaggregation and

targeting method for state universal service funding independently of any method approved in the current docket.

This docket is hereby closed.

This decision is issued by the Commission's consent calendar subcommittee, under a delegation of authority granted under Minn. Stat. § 216A.03, subd. 8 (a). Unless a party, a participant, or a Commissioner files an objection to this decision within ten days of receiving it, it will become the Order of the full Commission under Minn. Stat. § 216A.03, subd. 8 (b).

The Commission agrees with and adopts the recommendations of the Department of Commerce which are attached and hereby incorporated in the Order.
