In the Matter of the Application of Network PTS, Inc. for a Certificate of Authority to Provide Local Exchange Services

The above entitled matter has been considered by the Commission and the following disposition made:

Approved the application for a conditional certificate of authority to provide facilities based and resold local exchange services in the exchanges currently being served by Qwest Corporation, Sprint Minnesota, Citizens Telecommunications of Minnesota, and Frontier Communications of Minnesota;

Granted a variance under Minn. Rules pt. 7829.3200 to the notification requirements in Minn. Rules pt. 7812.0200, subpt. 6;

Approved the proposed tariff as filed on May 27, 2004 and revised on July 22, 2004 contingent upon making the following revisions within 30 days of the date of this Order:

1. The Company must include a reference to the following services with no monthly charges: toll restriction service, per line and per call blocking of information services to residential customers and certain business customers, and blocking of information services. These services are required pursuant to Minn. Rules pt. 7812.0600, subpt. 1E and I.

2. Revise Tariff No. 2, page 23, section 2.5.5 to comply with the requirements of the Commission's rules, which state that a telephone or telecommunications company can only examine the customer's utility credit rating when determining whether a deposit will be required. Minn. Rules pt. 7810.1500 states that a telephone company may only examine a customer's utility credit rating in examining a customer's credit record.

3. Add information to call trace service in compliance with the requirements of Minn. Rules part 7813.0900.

4. Proposed Tariff No. 2, section 7, page 1, part 7.1 states that all references to access service will be included in Minn. Tariff No. 3. Minn. Tariff No. 3 must be filed;

Conditions to receive operational authority for facilities based and resold local exchange services:

- 1. The filing and Commission approval of a 911 plan.**
- 2. The filing and Commission approval of an interconnection agreement.**

3. Compliance with the requirements of Minn. Rules pt. 7812.0300, subpt. 2I. Minn. Rules pt. 7812.0500, subpt. 2 requires that you file a service area map along with your application. In lieu of filing a map, the Commission has permitted a filing of a complete listing of the exchanges to be served. A complete listing of the exchanges served by Qwest, Sprint Minnesota, Citizens Telecommunications of Minnesota, and Frontier Communications of Minnesota can be found in the Department's annual report form at the following website address (see section F of the MN Telecom Carrier Annual Rpt):

The Company must either file a service area map or a complete listing of the exchanges to be served;

The applicant may not provide local services until all conditions listed above have been fulfilled.

This decision is issued by the Commission's consent calendar subcommittee, under a delegation of authority granted under Minn. Stat. § 216A.03, subd. 8 (a). Unless a party, a participant, or a Commissioner files an objection to this decision within ten days of receiving it, it will become the Order of the full Commission under Minn. Stat. § 216A.03, subd. 8 (b).

The Commission agrees with and adopts the recommendations of the Department of Commerce which are attached and hereby incorporated in the Order.
