

Hey Snowbird!

Make sure you count in your hometown by filling out your 2020 Census form as a Minnesota resident. Doing so will ensure that the funds that are distributed based on the census count - for things like roads, school, and health care - find their way to your hometown.

U.S. Census Bureau rules say you should be counted where you live and sleep most of the time. That means snowbirds who are away now, but live in Minnesota for most of the year, should be counted in Minnesota.

Here's how to make sure you are counted as a Minnesotan in the 2020 Census:

- Go online to my2020census.gov to fill out your form to-day. **DO NOT use the Census ID that the Census Bureau sends to your winter address.** Instead, use your Minnesota address to identify yourself.
- If you're more of a phone person, call 844-330-2020 today and give your answers over the phone. *Again, make sure you give your Minnesota address when you call.*
- If you like paper and pencil, you can wait until you return to Minnesota to fill out your paper form.
