




U.S. Census Bureau, 2016 American Community Survey Highlights


- Minnesotan's real median household income increased to \$65,600 in 2016, up from \$62,300 in 2014.
- Black median household income in 2016 increased to \$33,400, up from \$27,400 in 2014.
- After the Great Recession, economic stability was slow to take hold for some of Minnesota's communities of color, but by 2016 some clear signs of recovery had emerged.
- Full-time, year-round job growth with earnings > \$35,000 grew for all Minnesotans between 2015 and 2016; it grew for Black and Latino Minnesotans as well.

Minnesota's real median household income grew by about \$1,300 between 2015 and 2016



2015 to 2016 change for MN is not significant at the 90% confidence level; 2014 to 2016 change is significant.

Real median household income grew for all race groups in Minnesota since 2010/2011



Differences tested between 2010-2016 at the 90% confidence level. American Indian, Black, Latino and White non-Hispanic median household income grew over that period. Asian median household income grew between 2011 and 2016.




Growing Share of Adults Working

Proportion of adults (16-64) working




Unemployment has fallen significantly since 2010; recovery was delayed for some racial groups

Minnesota, 2006-2016




Full-Time Employment with Higher Earnings (> \$35,000) Grew for Black, Latino and White Workers between 2015 and 2016




American Indian Workers

Minnesota, 2006-2016




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Asian Workers

Minnesota, 2006-2016




Black Workers

Minnesota, 2006-2016




Full-Time Employment with Higher Earnings (> \$35,000) Grew for Black, Latino and White Workers between 2015 and 2016







Latino Workers

Minnesota, 2006-2016




White non-Hispanic Workers
