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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Proposed Permanent Rules Relating to Teacher Shortage Loan Forgiveness Program; Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules Without A Public Hearing

Proposed Rules Governing Teacher Shortage Loan Forgiveness Program, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 4830.9100-4830.9130; Revisor’s ID Number RD4373

Introduction. The Minnesota Office of Higher Education intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. You may submit written comments on the proposed rules and may also submit a written request that a hearing be held on the rules until Tuesday, January 3, 2017.

Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules are about “The Teacher Shortage Loan Forgiveness Program” that was newly enacted during the 2015 legislative session, effective August 1, 2015, *Minnesota Statutes* 136A.1791. The Teacher Shortage Loan Forgiveness Program is designed to provide student loan debt relief to teachers working in identified shortage areas established by the Minnesota Department of Education Commissioner’s “Teacher Supply and Demand Report.” This report identifies the teacher licensure fields and economic development regions that are experiencing teacher shortages.

Proposed Rules

The loan forgiveness program was created as an incentive to encourage qualified licensed teachers to work in identified teacher shortage area classrooms and to reduce the number of school districts that are unable to hire fully licensed teachers in particular license fields. The statute establishes the maximum amount of loan forgiveness a teacher can receive, how many awards they can receive, how the award will be disbursed to eligible participants, and any penalties if a teacher submits a false or misleading application.

The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, section 136A.791 Subd. 10. A copy of the proposed rules is published in the *State Register* and attached to this notice as mailed.

Comments. You have until **4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 3, 2017** to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules and any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and the agency contact person must receive it by the due date. The Department encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed and the reason for the comment. You are encouraged to propose any change desired. Any comments that you have about the legality of the proposed rules must also be made during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the Department hold a hearing on the rules. Your request must be in writing and the agency contact person must receive it by **4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 3, 2017**. Your written request for a public hearing must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it when determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, the Department will hold a public hearing unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to effect the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Modifications. The Office of Higher Education may modify the proposed rules as a result of public comment. The modifications must be supported by comments and information submitted to the agency, and the adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules, unless the agency follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the Office of Higher Education encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. The statement of need and reasonableness statement contains a summary of the justification for the proposed rules, including a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rules. It is now available from the agency contact person or view at the Office of Higher Education's web site <http://www.oh.e.state.mn.us/mPg.cfm?pageID=2168>. You may review it or obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person.

Lobbyist Registration. *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A, requires each lobbyist to register with the State Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board. Adoption and Review of Rules. If no hearing is required, the Office of Higher Education may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The Office of Higher Education will then submit the rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review for legality. You may ask to be notified of the date the Office of Higher Education submits the rules to the Office of Administrative Hearings. If you want to be so notified, or want to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or want to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the Office of Higher Education contact person listed above.

Proposed Rules

4830.9100 TEACHER SHORTAGE LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM; SCOPE.

Parts 4830.9110 to 4830.9130 govern the teacher shortage loan forgiveness program.

4830.9110 DEFINITIONS.

Subpart 1. **Scope.** For the purposes of parts 4830.9120 and 4830.9130, the terms defined in this part or in Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.1791, have the meanings given them.

Subp. 2. **Employed.** “Employed” means an individual currently providing classroom instruction.

Subp. 3. **Qualified educational loan.** “Qualified educational loan” means a loan, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.1791, subdivision 1, that is not one of the following:

A. PLUS loans made under the Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) program or Federal Direct Loan programs to parents of dependent undergraduate students;

B. Federal Consolidation Loans or Federal Direct Consolidation Loans that repaid a parent PLUS loan; or

C. federal, state, commercial, or foundation loans that are in default.

Subp. 4. **Teacher shortage area.** “Teacher shortage area” means a licensure field, economic development region, or other shortage area identified by the Minnesota Department of Education. The commissioner of education shall provide an annual notice to the office identifying teacher shortage areas using the data collected for the report required under Minnesota Statutes, section 127A.05, subdivision 6.

4830.9120 ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS.

To be an eligible participant, an individual must:

A. hold a teaching license issued by the licensing division in the Minnesota Department of Education on behalf of the Board of Teaching;

B. be employed by a school district, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.1791, subdivision 1, paragraph (c), to provide classroom instruction in a teacher shortage area;

C. not have received five annual awards from this program;

D. provide a completed application;

E. have outstanding qualified educational loan debt;

F. not submit false or misleading information on any application to this program; and

G. provide verification of the application of previously awarded funds toward eligible qualified educational loans, if the applicant has previously received an award.

4830.9130 APPLICATION AND DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS.

Subpart 1. **Completed application.** A completed application must include the following:

A. a completed application form;

B. an employment verification form completed by a school district representative;

C. verification of the applicant’s qualified educational loans; and

D. verification of the applicant’s income and household size.

Proposed Rules

Subp. 2. **Award amount.** The amount of an eligible participant's annual award shall not exceed \$1,000 or the cumulative balance of the applicant's qualified educational loans, including principal and interest, whichever amount is less.

Subp. 3. **Funds availability.** If there are insufficient funds to provide an award to all eligible participants, the commissioner shall not prorate each award. The commissioner shall prioritize the awards to eligible participants based on:

- A. the financial need of an applicant, considering the applicant's income, household size, and total qualified educational loan;
- B. previous awards to the applicant from the teacher shortage loan forgiveness program;
- C. whether the applicant is employed in an economic development region that is a teacher shortage area;
- D. whether the applicant is employed in a teacher shortage area within the applicant's economic development region;
- E. whether the applicant is employed in a statewide teacher shortage area; and
- F. the statewide distribution of funds.

Commissioner's Orders

Various agency commissioners are authorized to issue "commissioner's orders" on specified activities governed by their agency's enabling laws. See the *Minnesota Statutes* governing each agency to determine the specific applicable statutes. Commissioners' orders are approved by assistant attorneys general as to form and execution and published in the *State Register*. These commissioners orders are compiled in the year-end subject matter index for each volume of the *State Register*.

Commissioner's Order #2 ML 2016: Amend Walleye Limits to Make Adjustments to Manage Fisheries in the 1837 Ceded Territory (Mille Lacs)

Effective Date: December 1, 2016

Statutory authority: *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97C.005, subd. 3

Supersedes: Commissioner's Order #1 ML 2016

BACKGROUND

Each year a harvestable surplus is set for walleye in Mille Lacs Lake pursuant to the procedures set forth in the 1996 Stipulated Settlement and Federal Consent Decree adopted by the Minnesota Federal District Court in 1997 and affirmed by the U.S. Supreme Court in 1999. The harvestable surplus is the volume of fish that in most cases can be harvested from Mille Lacs Lake while ensuring sufficient remaining walleye in the lake for a healthy fishery. The harvestable surplus is then divided between the state of Minnesota and the eight Chippewa Tribal Bands.

During the first nine months of December 2015 through July 2016, the state of Minnesota surpassed its annual harvest limit of 28,600. The state closed the Mille Lacs walleye fishing season on September 6, 2016, for the remainder of the allocation year.

The Department of Natural Resources has determined that it can reopen the walleye fishing on Mille Lacs Lake during the winter 2016/17 fishing season, which begins on December 1, 2016 and extends through February 26, 2017. This decision is based upon the results of recent fisheries surveys that indicate that the Mille Lacs walleye fishery can accommodate an ice fishery.

The Department intends to resume regulating fishing on Mille Lacs Lake under the Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rule adopted on May 2, 2016, except that the Department intends to implement a harvest season with a harvest slot limit for walleye, and modify the northern pike size limit. The possession limit for walleye will be one. All walleye in possession must be from 19.0 inches to 21.0 inches in length, inclusive, or 28.0 inches or greater in length. The northern pike regulation will be identical

to the regulation in effect for the winter 2015/16 season, which was a possession limit of five and a provision that a person must take two northern pike less than 30.0 inches in length before possessing a northern pike 30.0 inches or greater in length. Of the five pike possession limit, only one northern pike may be 30.0 inches or greater in length. Department staff will assess Mille Lacs Lake creel data periodically throughout the ice fishing season to inform future management decisions.

ORDER

Now, Therefore, It is hereby ordered that:

Commissioner's Order #1 ML 2016, signed on August 23, 2016, and published in the September 29, 2016, State Register (41 SR 282), expires at 12:01 AM on Thursday, December 1, 2016, after which the Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rule part 6264.0400, subp.4, for species other than northern pike item A and walleye item E, referring to the possession and size limits for northern pike walleye: Mille Lacs Lake Fishing as published in the 2 May 2016 State Register (40 SR 1485), again take effect.

1. From December 1, 2016, at 12:01 a.m., through February 26, 2017, at 11:59 p.m., the possession limit for walleye is one, and walleye in possession must be:

- a. Equal to or more than 19 inches in length and equal to or less than 21 inches in length; or
- b. Equal to or longer than 28 inches in length.

2. From December 1, 2016, at 12:01 a.m., through March 26, 2017, at 11:59 p.m., the possession limit for northern pike is five. A person may possess one northern pike equal to or more than 30 inches in length provided that at least two northern pike less than 30 inches in length taken on the same day from Mille Lacs Lake are in immediate possession, and taken by the same person, before a person may possess a northern pike equal to or more than 30 inches in length. Party fishing rules do not apply when possessing a northern pike more than 30 inches in length.

Fishing for all other species, including muskellunge, bass, perch, and panfish, and the existing regulations for all other species, continue unaffected by this order.
