Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. 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Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Notice of the List of Analytes Available for Accreditation Related to Minnesota Statutes, 144.98, Governing Environmental Laboratory Accreditation

This notice is given to meet requirements in Minnesota Statutes 144.98, Subpart 3a(b).

Every six months, the Minnesota Department of Health reviews the list of analytes available for accreditation and publishes revisions to the list. The department revises the list based on recommendations from the state and federal agencies utilizing the environmental laboratory accreditation program. The department reviewed the list of analytes and added Anthanthrene (CAS # 191-26-4), Available Cyanide, Benzo[c]fluorine (CAS# 205-12-9), Cyclopenta[c,d]pyrene (CAS# 27208-37-3), Dibenzo[a,l]pyrene (CAS# 191-30-0), 5-Methylchrysene (3697-24-3), 6-Nitrochrysene (CAS# 7496-02-8) and Residual Range Organics to the list previously published.

Public Notice of Maximum Allowable Costs of Medical Assistance Outpatient Prescribed Drugs

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients, providers of services, and to the public of additions to the state Medical Assistance maximum allowable cost (state MAC) list for certain outpatient prescribed drugs.

The United States Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, publishes a federal upper limit (FUL) payment schedule for many commonly prescribed multiple-source drugs. The federal upper limit is set at a rate equal to 175 percent of the weighted average of the most recently reported monthly AMPs for such multiple source drugs using the least costly therapeutic equivalent that can be purchased by pharmacists. This FUL payment schedule constitutes the federal MAC list. For many multiple-source drugs that are not on the federal MAC list, the Department establishes a state MAC list. Additionally, the Department imposes a state MAC for many multiple-source drugs that are on the federal MAC list, as long as the aggregate savings are at least as much as the savings would be using the federal MAC list.

The Department requires Medical Assistance pharmacy providers to submit their usual and customary costs. Pharmacy providers are reimbursed at the lower of: 1) the state MAC or the estimated acquisition cost determined using wholesale acquisition cost, plus a dispensing fee; or 2) the submitted usual and customary charge to the general public.

No earlier than April 25, 2017 the Department may add the following outpatient prescribed drugs to the state MAC list:

These additions are made to bring Medical Assistance reimbursement to pharmacists more closely in line with the actual

acquisition cost of the drugs listed above. The Department estimates that there will be a state savings of \$16,000 for State Fiscal Year 2016 (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017).

Notice of Proposed Changes Affecting Recreational Trails and Off-Highway Vehicle Use within Beltrami Island State Forest

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is considering changes to recreational trails and within Beltrami Island State Forest in Beltrami, Lake of the Woods and Roseau Counties.

The proposed changes include: designating new motorized trail segments; designating new hunter-walking trails; designating new minimum maintenance roads; and undesignating segments of existing minimum maintenance roads.

Beltrami Island State Forest is classified as "managed" with respect to motorized use, which means forest roads are open to motor vehicle use unless posted closed, and forest trails are open to motor vehicle use unless posted closed. The DNR does not propose to change the "managed" classification.

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.19, subdivision 2 governs designations of forest trails and changes to existing designations.

The DNR will hold an open house to present information and receive public comments on the proposed changes. The open house is scheduled for June 28, 2017, from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM at the DNR Warroad Forestry Office, 804 Cherne Drive NW, Warroad, MN 56763.

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources Notice of Proposed Motor Vehicle Classification and Roads Designation in Centennial State Forest

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is considering a limited motor vehicle use classification for the Centennial State Forest. The DNR is also proposing system forest roads and minimum maintenance roads for the forest.

Minnesota Rules, part 6100.1950, subpart 1, section B defines a limited classification as an area where “a person may operate a motor vehicle only on forest roads that are not posted and designated closed and on forest trails or areas that are posted and designated to allow motor vehicle use, subject to the limitations and exceptions in this part.”

Minnesota Statutes, section 89.71, subdivision 1 governs designations of forest roads and changes to existing designations.

The DNR will hold public meeting to present information and receive public comments on the proposed changes. The open house is scheduled for June 26, 2017 from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM at the Walker Community Center, Rotary Room, 105 Tower Avenue, Walker, MN 56484

Notice of Intent to Conduct an Annual Intercity Bus Industry Consultation and Application Solicitation

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) Office of Transit will conduct an Annual Industry Consultation and application workshop in support of the Minnesota Intercity Bus Program on May 10, 2017 from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m. at the MnDOT Central Office, 395 John Ireland Boulevard, Saint Paul, Minnesota.

The industry consultation is the primary opportunity for potential applicants and other interested parties to learn more about the program and provide input on issues affecting the industry. At a minimum, the consultation will involve discussion of the following topics:

- 1) An overview of the upcoming intercity bus funding application, to be awarded for calendar year 2018 in August 2017.
- 2) The May 10, 2017 launch of the application solicitation period for calendar year 2018 (prospective grantees may make application for projects spanning from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018).
- 3) A discussion of interest in expanding service to new markets via the development of additional ICB feeder networks around the state?

The Office of Transit administers State and Federal funding (including funds provided under 49 USC 5311(f)), to support intercity bus transportation services to non-urbanized communities of Minnesota. Public, private, and non-profit entities are eligible to apply for operating, capital, and marketing assistance.

We would like interested parties to RSVP at least one week prior to the consultation meeting (by May 3). An application workshop will also be held on May 10 following the industry consultation. A teleconference option will be offered for those who are unable to attend in person.
