

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Proposed Rules

Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Introduction. The Department of Agriculture intends to repeal obsolete rules under the rulemaking process in the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.3895. You may submit written comments on the proposed repeal of obsolete rules until October 28, 2016.

Subject of the Repeal of Obsolete Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed obsolete rules cover three different program areas within the Pesticide and Fertilizer Management Division of the MDA. The proposed obsolete rules are no longer enforced by the MDA. The MDA wishes to remove these rules in order to provide clarification to regulated parties. The agency identified the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed in its annual obsolete rules report under *Minnesota Statutes* section 14.05, subdivision 5. The statutory authority to repeal the obsolete rules is found in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.3895. A copy of the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed is published in the *State Register*.

Comments. You have until **4:30 p.m. on Friday October 28, 2016**, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed repeal of obsolete rules and any part or subpart of the repeal. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. The Department encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of

the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed addressed and the reason for the comment. In addition, you are encouraged to object to the repeal of any part or subpart. You must also make any comments on the legality of the proposed rules during this comment period.

Request for Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. You must make your request in writing and the agency contact person must receive it by **4:30 p.m. on Friday, October 28, 2016**. Your written request must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed repealed rules to which you object or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it for determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

- **Effect of Requests.** If 25 or more people submit a written request, the agency will have to meet the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.131 to 14.20 for rules adopted after a hearing or the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.22 to 14.28 for rules adopted without a hearing, including the preparation of a statement of need and reasonableness and the opportunity for a hearing.

Modifications The agency might modify its choice of these designated rules or parts proposed for repeal (e.g. fixing a typo or deciding not to repeal a rule because the rule is discovered not to be obsolete), based on comments and information submitted to the agency. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the State Register, the agency will publish a notice of adopting the repealers in the State Register. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the State Register, the agency must publish a copy of the changes in the State Register. If the proposed repeal of obsolete rules affects you in any way, the agency encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Repeal and Review of Obsolete Rules. If no hearing is required, the agency may repeal the obsolete rules at the end of the comment period. The agency will then submit rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review for legality. You may ask to be notified of the date that the agency submits the rules. If you want to be so notified, or want to receive a copy of the repealed obsolete rules, or want to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

1505.0960 REEXAMINATION PROCEDURES.

If any applicant fails to achieve a passing score on any examination, ~~he/she the applicant~~ shall be eligible to retake the examination after 15 days from the date of notification of failure of the first examination. ~~If any applicant fails to achieve a passing score upon retaking an examination, he/she shall be eligible to retake the examination after 30 days from the date of notification of examination failure.~~ A failing applicant may retake an examination no more than three times in one year. Upon submission to the commissioner in writing of specific reasons within 30 days from the date of notification of failure of third retaken examination, an appeal of the score may be made.

D. Records must be submitted to the commissioner no later than December 1 of the calendar year in which they occur.

1505.3070 LOADING AREAS.

Subpart 1. **Containment for liquid bulk pesticide loading sites.** An area used for the loading of liquid bulk pesticide into fixed storage containers, mobile containers, or pesticide application equipment at a bulk pesticide storage facility must be provided with a means of containment that is elevated above the surrounding area, constructed of reinforced concrete or other commissioner-approved material, and designed and constructed for the intended purpose. The means of containment must not contain a drain and must comply with either item A or B.

B. A sloped surface that contains a sediment trap must comply with subitems (1) to (3).

(1) The perimeter of the area must be curbed three inches in height to prevent runoff and must form a liquid-tight containment area.

(2) The area must be sloped to a sediment trap used only for the temporary collection of spilled or released pesticides. The sediment trap may not be greater than two feet deep ~~or hold more than 109 U.S. gallons.~~

(3) The area must contain a minimum of 1,000 U.S. gallons.

1513.0140 MARKINGS OF NONREFRIGERATED CONTAINERS AND SYSTEMS OTHER THAN DOT CONTAINERS.

Subpart 1. **Nameplates.** Each system nameplate must be made of a noncorroding metal permanently attached to the system ~~by continuous welding around its perimeter~~ and located so as to be readily accessible for inspection. Nameplates must be maintained in legible condition and include markings as prescribed in subpart 2.

Introduction. The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) intends to adopt rules under the expedited rulemaking process following the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2410, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.389. Subject of the Expedited Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed expedited rules will correct the rules for omitted names of trout streams designated in *Minnesota Rules*, part 6264.0050. Some trout streams were originally designated in rule using the name of the larger river that they flow into rather than their own names. The proposed corrections list either the actual name of each such stream or, in the case where a stream has no name, list the name "unnamed stream" in the specified township, range, and section. These rule amendments will help to clarify for the public which trout streams are designated as special management waters.

Proposed Rules

The statutory authority to adopt the rules is Minnesota Statutes, section 97C.005. The statutory authority to adopt the rules under the expedited rulemaking process is Minnesota Statutes, section 84.027, subd. 13a (a) (1).

Comments. You have until **4:30 p.m. on Monday, October 3, 2016**, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed expedited rules and any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the DNR contact person by the due date. The DNR encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed expedited rules addressed and the reason for the comment. In addition, you are encouraged to propose any change desired. You must also make any comments that you have on the legality of the proposed rules during this comment period.

Modifications The DNR may modify the proposed expedited rules using either of two avenues: The DNR may modify the rules directly so long as the modifications do not make them substantially different as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.05, subdivision 2, paragraphs (b) and (c). Or the DNR may adopt substantially different rules if it follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the State Register, the DNR will publish a notice of adoption in the State Register. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the State Register, the DNR must publish a copy of the changes in the State Register. If the proposed expedited rules affect you in any way, the DNR encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

B. allow board members and board staff to accompany surveyors on the accrediting site visit if the board chooses to conduct joint visits;

C. submit a national nursing accrediting agency or nursing-related accrediting body self-study to the board;

D. submit a copy of all communication between the program and the national nursing accrediting agency or nursing-related accrediting body; and

E. submit required annual board reports.

Subp. 7. **Approval.** The board must act to continue approval if the program:

A. receives initial or continuing national nursing or nursing-related education accreditation; and

B. is in compliance with all other board rules and statutes.

(1) The purpose of the review panel or hearing is to determine if the deficiency was corrected prior to expiration of the correction order.

Rules 6136.0100 through 6136.0600 shall apply to the above-designated area, except that the following uses will be allowed with such limitations as Commissioner determines are necessary for protection of the values for which the site was designated: a horse trail following a specified alignment under easement and consistent with the horse trail management plan, fishing, hunting, trapping, and dogs under control for hunting purposes during the regular season; also a non-motorized trail may be allowed within 200 feet of County Road 15.

Minnesota Department of Human Services, et al.*, United States District Court File No. 09-CV-1775, and the court decision in *Olmstead v. L.C.*, 527 U.S. 581 (1999);

Whereas, the Minnesota Department of Human Services adopted Minnesota Rules, Chapter 9544 to govern use of positive support strategies, safety interventions, and emergency use of manual restraint in services licensed by the Minnesota Department of Human Services;

Whereas, Minnesota Rules, Chapter 9544 took effect on August 31, 2015;

Whereas, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 14.127, the Minnesota Department of Human Services determined that the cost of complying with Minnesota Rules, Chapter 9544 in the first year after the rule takes effect would not exceed \$25,000 for a small business or a small city;

Whereas, the Administrative Law Judge assigned to review the rulemaking pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 14 disapproved the agency's cost determination under Minnesota Statutes, section 14.127;

Whereas, the Administrative Law Judge's disapproval of the agency's cost determination triggers the application of Minnesota Statutes, section 14.127, subdivision 3, which enables a small business or a small city to claim a temporary exemption from Minnesota Rules, Chapter 9544 until the Minnesota Legislature enacts a law approving the rules;

Whereas, Minnesota Statutes, section 14.127, subdivision 4, grants the governor authority to issue a waiver of the application of Minnesota Statutes, section 14.127, subdivision 3; and

The project now turns to implementation, with these deadlines:

- Nov 1, 2017: 50-foot average width, 30-foot minimum width, buffers must be in place on lands adjacent to public waters and identified and mapped on the buffer map.
- Nov. 1, 2018: 16.5-foot minimum width buffers must be in place on lands adjacent to public ditches as identified and mapped on the buffer map.

The Board of Water and Soil Resources, soil and water conservation districts, and local governments will work with landowners on any questions about buffers or alternative water quality practices.
