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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-13 inclusive; issues #14-25 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-38 inclusive (issue #39, cumulative for issues #1-39); issues #40-52 inclusive, with final index (#1-52, or 53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Management Hunt for Chronic Wasting Disease in Deer Permit Area 346

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to the Commissioner's authority set forth in Minn. Stat. § 84.027, subdivision 13 (b) to set hunting seasons and Minn. Stat. § 97A.045, subd. 11 to take action necessary to prevent or control wildlife disease, the Commissioner is adopting the following rule to assess and prevent the spread of chronic wasting disease (CWD) among the deer population in deer permit area 346, which includes portions of Fillmore, Houston and Winona counties. This rule is adopted as an emergency rule pursuant to the authority granted to the commissioner to adopt emergency rules in Minn. Stat. § 97A.045, subs. 2(b), 11. The emergency rule is necessitated by the presence of CWD in wild deer harvested within and beyond our disease management zone (permit area 603) during the 2018 regular deer hunting seasons. Because of potential damage that CWD could do to the wild deer population in the time it would take to use the Chapter 14 rulemaking process to adopt this rule, the DNR is using its emergency rulemaking authority pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 97A.045, et. seq.

CWD has been detected in or adjacent to deer permit area 346. Because CWD infectious agents are extremely resistant in the environment, transmission may be both direct and indirect. Concentration of deer in certain areas likely increases the risk of transmission between individuals. Reducing the number of deer reduces the risk of transmission between individuals and likely removes some of the infected deer. Therefore, the DNR will hold a special hunt in deer permit area 346. All hunters will be required to present deer taken during the special hunt to the DNR for testing. By testing harvested deer, the DNR is able to track the spread of the disease and determine whether the risk to the wild deer herd is increasing and whether further action may be necessary.

To provide as much hunter access to the area as possible, the DNR is opening a state park and Scientific Natural Area (SNA) that are not normally open to hunting. The agency is impartially limiting the number of hunters in Great River Bluffs State Park and King's and Queen's Bluff SNA in deer permit area 346 to prevent hunter overcrowding by requiring a free Disease Hunt Surplus permit that will be available by telephone, online and at license vendors throughout the state on a first-come, first-served basis. The number of hunters who will be allowed in these areas will be consistent with past special hunts held to reduce deer numbers for resource management. If the SNA and Great River Bluffs State Park were not open to hunting, deer could become concentrated in these areas to avoid hunting pressure. By opening the SNA and Great River Bluffs State Park to hunting, the DNR is providing as much hunter access to the CWD zone as possible to lower overall deer numbers and deer density. This increases the likelihood of achieving the overall goal of reducing the risk of CWD transmission between deer and removing as many potentially CWD positive deer as possible. Because the hunts occur at a time of year when public use and agency operations on the SNA are minimized, they will not interfere with the normal function of the SNA. Hunters must be qualified for these hunts by being legally eligible to purchase a deer hunting license and must meet any firearms safety requirements.

Subp. 8. **Deer taken during disease management hunts.**

A. Deer taken during the disease management hunts described in part 6232.1600, subpart 8, must be presented for mandatory registration and testing for chronic wasting disease at a department-staffed testing station within 24 hours of being harvested or no later than 10:00 a.m. the Monday after the hunt ends, whichever is sooner.

B. The restrictions in part 6232.0350 do not apply to the hunts authorized in part 6232.1600, subpart 8.

6232.1600 SPECIAL HUNT PROCEDURES.

Subp. 8. **Disease management hunts.**

A. Except as specified in items C to E, deer permit area 346, as described in part 6232.4700, subpart 99, is open January 25 through January 27, 2019, and February 1 through February 3, 2019, for taking an unlimited number of either-sex deer by firearms, muzzleloader, and archery.

B. To participate in the hunt authorized in item A, hunters must purchase a disease management permit according to part 6232.1980 or possess a 2018 Minnesota landowner license, youth or adult firearm license, youth or adult muzzleloader license, youth or adult archery license, or early-season antlerless license. During the hunt authorized in item A:

(1) hunters may tag deer of either sex with disease management tags or unused tags from a 2018 landowner license, youth or adult firearm license, youth or adult muzzleloader license, or youth or adult archery license;

(2) only antlerless deer may be tagged with bonus tags or early-season antlerless tags. Bonus tags and early-season antlerless tags may not be used on any deer having at least one antler three inches or more in length;

(3) firearm hunters may use only legal shotguns loaded with single-slug shotgun shells, legal muzzle-loading long guns, legal handguns, or legal crossbows for taking deer; and

(4) the blaze-orange requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply, including for hunters of unprotected wild animals, such as coyotes. Coyote hunters may not take deer while hunting coyotes.

C. To participate in the special hunts authorized in items D and E, hunters must obtain a free disease-hunt surplus permit from an electronic license system agent, the Department of Natural Resources License Center, or other authorized agents. Permits are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Hunters may select only one hunt from the special hunts described in items D and E. During the special hunts authorized in items D and E:

(1) hunters may tag deer of either sex with disease management tags or unused tags from a 2018 landowner license, youth or adult firearm license, or youth or adult muzzleloader license. Only deer may be taken during the special hunts authorized in items D and E;

(2) only antlerless deer may be tagged with bonus tags or early-season antlerless tags. Bonus tags and early-season antlerless tags may not be used on any deer having at least one antler three inches or more in length;

(3) firearm hunters may use only legal shotguns loaded with single-slug shotgun shells, legal muzzle-loading long guns, or legal handguns for taking deer; and

(4) the blaze-orange requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 97B.071, paragraph (a), apply.

D. Great River Bluffs State Park and King's and Queen's Bluffs Scientific and Natural Area in Winona County are open January 25 through January 27, 2019, for taking an unlimited number of either-sex deer by firearms. This is special hunt 805.

E. Great River Bluffs State Park and King's and Queen's Bluffs Scientific and Natural Area in Winona County are open February 1 through February 3, 2019, for taking an unlimited number of either-sex deer by firearms. This is special hunt 806.

6232.1980 TAKING DEER BY ANY WEAPON USING DISEASE MANAGEMENT PERMITS.

Subpart 1. **Purchase.** ~~An unlimited number of disease management permits may be purchased by a person who has purchased a valid deer license. Disease management permits may be purchased for \$1.50 from an electronic license system agents agent, the Department of Natural Resources License Center, and or other authorized agents.~~

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Spring Turkey Hunt, State Game Refuges, and Wildlife Management Areas

Notice is hereby given that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13 (b). The statutory authority for the contents of the rule is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 86A.06; 97A.091 subd. 2; 97A.045 subd. 3, 5, 6 and 9; 97A.137 subd. 1 and 2; 97A.435 subd. 1 and 2; 97B.111; 97B.605; 97B.721; 97B.723, 97B.731 subd. 3.

The conditions that do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, are as follows: that distribution of licenses for the turkey season are subject to modification on an annual basis as the Department of Natural Resources refines the manner by which the season is conducted to provide high-quality hunting opportunities and assure equitable distribution of harvest. Turkey population and harvest data used for selecting hunters and setting quotas and areas is gathered annually and analyzed in late summer. Adjustments to permit area boundaries and license quotas are based on annual and long-term population data as well as input from the public.

Expedited Emergency Rules

The St. Michaels Meadows Wildlife Management Area is an integral part of a wetland restoration project but cannot sustain firearms hunting due to its proximity to a large residential housing development.

Changes to the Carlos Avery Wildlife Management Unit Sanctuary improve opportunities for youth or disabled hunters who are participating in special hunts. Changes to Cross Lake and Camp Ripley Game Refuges in Crow Wing and Morrison counties, respectively, provide additional hunting opportunity on refuges where there is a harvestable surplus of wild turkey.

The crow season is being amended to continue to meet the maximum federal crow season specified in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97B.731, subd. 3.

Subp. 2. **Participation in application drawings.** A person may not apply more than once for a hunt, whether as an individual or as a member of a group. Qualifying individuals may apply for the resident landowner-tenant turkey drawing. All of the information in items A to G H must be supplied on the application forms.

E. The application deadline for the spring season is the ~~second~~ fourth Friday in January.

F. Youth age 17 and younger may purchase a wild turkey hunting license to hunt all ~~eight~~ six spring turkey time periods. A wild turkey hunting license under this item is separate from the normal lottery process and is valid for hunting in any wild turkey permit area.

G. A person who has not applied for a wild turkey license through the lottery or who applied for a license and was unsuccessful in the lottery may ~~purchase a wild turkey hunting license to hunt the spring turkey season during the~~ third, fourth, fifth, or sixth, seventh, or eighth time period. A wild turkey hunting license under this item is separate from the normal lottery process. Firearms hunters who purchase a license under this item must choose and hunt in one time period of the third, fourth, or fifth periods. Archery hunters who purchase a license under this item may hunt throughout the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth time periods. Any licensed hunter may also hunt during the sixth period.

H. Persons who are being mentored in an official state-sanctioned adult-mentored turkey hunt or who hunt in a sanctioned disabled hunt do not need to apply in the normal lottery process to receive a license. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

ORDER ADOPTING AMENDMENT OF RULES

Adoption of Permanent Exempt Rule Governing Combined Group Franchise Returns: Amending Minnesota Rules, Part 8019.0405, subpart 2, and repealing subpart 9

WHEREAS:

1. The rulemaking provision of Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14, are unnecessary and impracticable when amending or repealing a rule to incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required.
2. The attached Findings and Statement of Supporting Reasons justify a good cause exemption from rulemaking, and are hereby incorporated by reference.
3. All procedural requirements in Minnesota Statutes, section 14.388, and Minnesota Rules, part 1400.2400, and other applicable law have been complied with.
4. The Office of Administrative Hearings received no written comments on the rules.
5. A certified copy of the rule is attached, as required by Minnesota Statutes, section 14.386, paragraph (a), clause (1), and Minnesota Rules, part 1400.2400.

IT IS ORDERED that the above-captioned rule, in the form certified as approved by the Office of the Revisor, is adopted pursuant to authority vested in me by Minnesota Statutes, SECTION 270C.06, WHICH PROVIDES THAT THE

FINDINGS

In 2009 and 2013, the Minnesota Legislature enacted significant changes to the state’s corporate franchise tax. The statutory changes in Minnesota Statutes, section 290.17, affect how unitary businesses subject to tax in Minnesota calculate their apportionment factor of Minnesota’s corporate franchise tax. Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, governs how unitary business groups file their Minnesota corporate franchise tax return. Two amendments and one repeal are required to bring Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, up to date with the 2009 changes to Minnesota Statutes, section 289A.08, and the 2013 changes to Minnesota Statutes, section 290.17. The amendments and repeal will not affect how Minnesota taxpayers file their taxes. Rather, the amendments and repeal will bring the rule into conformity with the statutory changes. As explained in the findings below, the amended or repealed rules from Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, are inconsistent with state statutes.

- 1. Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, subpart 2(B), is currently inconsistent with Minnesota Statutes, section 289A.08.** Under the current version of Minnesota Statutes, section 289A.08, a corporation that is part of a unitary business group is not required to be subject to tax in Minnesota in order to be the designated member on the corporate franchise tax return of a unitary business group. However, the definition of designated filer under Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, subpart 2(B), requires that the designated filer be subject to tax in Minnesota. Therefore, the definition of designated filer is obsolete and should be amended to reflect current law.
- 2. Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, subpart 2(C), is currently inconsistent with Minnesota Statutes, section 289A.08.** Under the current version of Minnesota Statutes, section 289A.08, a member of a unitary business group is not required to be subject to tax in Minnesota in order to be a member on a unitary business group’s corporate franchise tax return. The definition of member is obsolete and should be amended to reflect current law.
- 3. Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, subpart 9, is obsolete because in 2013 the Minnesota Legislature amended Minnesota Statutes, 290.17.** The current version of Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, subpart 9, directs the designated member of a unitary business group to apportion each member’s Minnesota corporate franchise tax liability separately and then combine each member’s liability on the group’s Minnesota corporate franchise tax return. This is inconsistent with the version of Minnesota Statutes, section 290.17, passed in 2013, which holds that a unitary business group must combine all of the sales to Minnesota into the sales apportionment factor for the unitary business group, including the sales of unitary subsidiaries that do not file in Minnesota. Therefore, subpart 9 is obsolete and should be repealed to reflect current law.

STATEMENT OF SUPPORTING REASONS

An agency has to meet one of the criteria of Minnesota Statutes, section 14.388, to have a rule adopted under the good cause exemption procedures. The third clause, “to incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required,” applies in this instance.

Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, is no longer consistent with Minnesota Statutes, sections 289A.08 and 290.17, because of statutory amendments (see Findings). Since the statutory authorities for the rules have been amended, no interpretation of the law is required in amending or repealing these portions of the rule.

Furthermore, the amendments do not involve substantive policy issues. The amendments reflect the statutory changes to Minnesota Statutes, sections 289A.08 and 290.17. Because the public had the opportunity to comment on the statutory changes, amending Minnesota Rules, 8019.0405, through the full rulemaking process would be repetitive and unnecessary.

DISABILITY DETERMINATION SERVICES PAYMENT

The following boxed paragraphs apply to the Disability Determination Services (DDS) *only*.

INCENTIVES TO SUBMIT TIMELY REPORTS:

Psychiatric and psychological exams – DDS will pay providers 100% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 100% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less, if the report is received from 1 to 10 days from the date of the examination (i.e. the day after the date of the examination is day 1). Reports received from 11 – 18 calendar days will be paid 90%.

Reports received 19 – 30 days from the date of the examination will be paid at a 75% rate.

Official Notices

For reports received 31 or more calendar days from the date of the examination, the DDS reserves the right to cancel the CE authorization invoice. Should the DDS decide to pay for such late evidence, the DDS will pay providers no more than 50% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 50% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less.

All other consultative examinations:

Reports received by DDS 1-18 calendar days from the date of the examination (i.e. the day after the date of the examination is day 1), the DDS will pay providers 100% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 100% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less.

Reports received by DDS from 19 – 30 days from the date of the examination will be paid 75%.

For reports received by the DDS 31 or more calendar days from the date of the examination, the DDS reserves the right to cancel the CE authorization invoice. Should the DDS decide to pay for such late evidence, the DDS will pay providers no more than 50% of either the usual and customary amount billed or 50% of the agency fee maximum, whichever is less.

Payment will not be issued until receipt of the signed CE report.

1. CEs performed by treating physicians/psychologists;
2. Limited CEs and office calls performed by regular CE providers; nor for
3. Reports from treating sources summarizing medical evidence of record.

LABORATORY AND X-RAY FEES

The subheadings are self-explanatory. The CURRENT PROCEDURAL TERMINOLOGY CODE corresponds to the American Medical Association's Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes, which are used by most sources providing medical services. These may also be used for easy in-agency identification of a particular procedure. When ordering and authorizing a particular laboratory or x-ray study, however, describe the test or x-ray to be done. Do not authorize by the CPT code.

X-ray charges may be presented in two possible formats: one combines the technical (the x-ray, itself) and professional (the physician's interpretation) components when these are provided by the same facility; the other format separates the technical and professional components when these services are provided by separate facilities.

For example: For a PA Chest X-ray, single view, one would find:

71010	Chest single view, PA	\$ 55.00
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This would be the acceptable maximum for an x-ray and interpretation at a single facility; however, when the **professional component** is billed separately, the procedure may be identified by adding the modifier **-26** to the usual CPT code. When the **technical component** is billed separately, the procedure may be identified by adding the modifier **-TC** to the usual CPT code.
