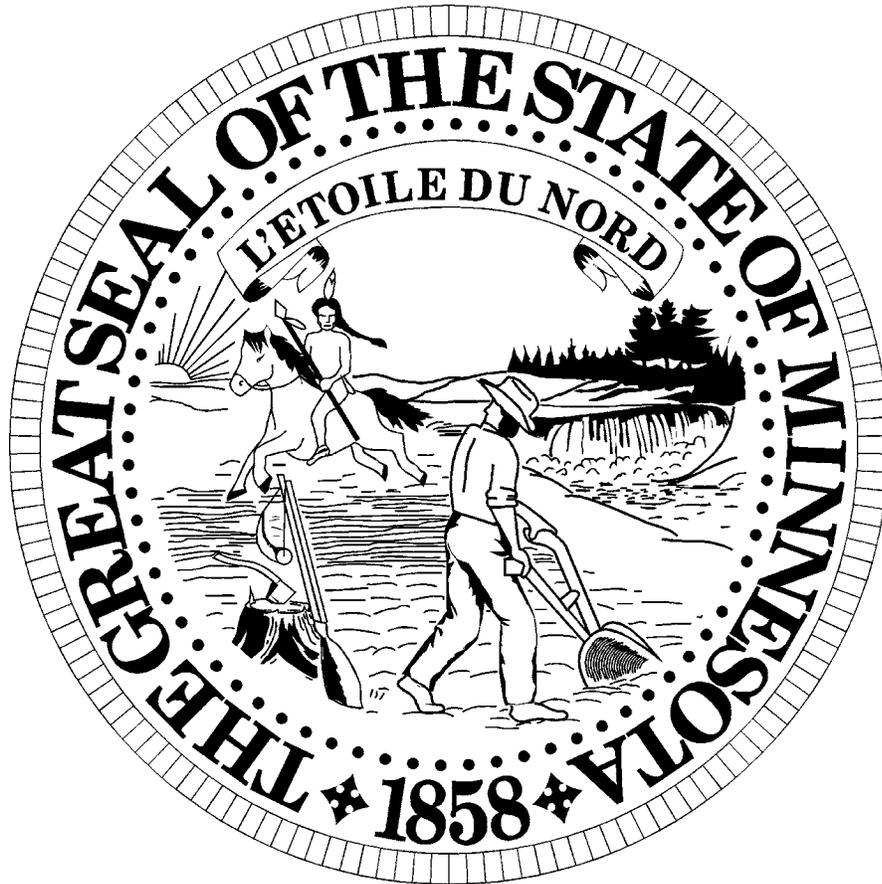

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). An annual subject matter index for rules was separately printed usually in August, but starting with Volume 19 now appears in the final issue of each volume. Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Office of the Governor

Emergency Executive Order 19-03: Declaring a Peacetime Emergency and Providing Assistance to Stranded Motorists

I, **Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota**, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, issue the following Executive Order.

On February 7, 2019 a powerful winter storm with heavy snowfall, strong winds, and dangerously cold temperatures created blizzard conditions across western Minnesota, closing roads and threatening public safety.

These dangerous driving conditions resulted in many stranded vehicles, placing lives and property at risk. The resources of affected local and county governments are inadequate to meet the demands caused by these severe winter weather conditions.

The Renville County Sheriff requested the Minnesota National Guard assist with the rescue of stranded motorists and provide the local armory as an emergency shelter.

For these reasons, I declare a peacetime emergency and order that:

1. The Adjutant General order to state active duty on February 7, 2019 the people, equipment, and facilities needed to provide assistance.
2. The Adjutant General is authorized to procure the goods and services needed to accomplish the mission.
3. The costs of this assistance shall be paid from the general fund as allowed by Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 192.52.

This Executive Order and declaration of peacetime emergency is effective immediately under Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 4.035, subd. 2, and it remains in effect until the emergency conditions caused by the winter storm subside or it expires in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 12.31, subd. 2.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Proposed Amendment to Rules Governing *Mycoplasma* Requirements of Turkeys, *Minnesota Rules*, Parts 1721.0270, 1721.0280, 1721.0290, 1721.0320, 1721.0344, 1721.0300, 1721.0310; Revisor's ID Number RD4533

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Board of Animal Health is requesting comments from affected or interested parties on proposed amendments to rules governing *Mycoplasma* requirements for turkeys. This is the first opportunity for public comment and input on this rules project.

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Board of Animal Health (“the board”) requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing *Mycoplasma* requirements for turkeys. Under the current rules, testing for *Mycoplasma gallisepticum* and *Mycoplasma synoviae* is required for all turkey hatcheries and breeding flocks. Similar rules also apply to poultry dealers, those attending community sales and exhibitions, and those importing turkeys into Minnesota. The proposed rule amendments would restrict the *Mycoplasma* testing and/or *Mycoplasma* clean classification requirement to commercial turkey producers, consistent with the requirements for commercial egg-type chicken and commercial meat-type chicken hatcheries and breeding flocks.

With the amendment the rules will continue to focus the *Mycoplasma* surveillance and control programs on high risk, high consequence commercial premises while allowing small backyard/exhibition turkey producers to obtain unusual or rare breeds of birds from flocks that may not be participating in similar *Mycoplasma* surveillance programs. The amended rules would also better align with the testing expectations for backyard/exhibition turkeys in other states.

Persons Affected. The amendment to the rules would likely affect poultry producers in Minnesota, specifically small backyard and exhibition producers with an interest in raising unusual, rare or exotic breeds of turkeys, and the people outside of Minnesota that wish to import the same types of turkeys into Minnesota.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 35.03, authorizes the Board of Animal Health to adopt rules to protect the health of Minnesota domestic animals and carry out the provisions of this chapter. The board shall make rules necessary to protect the health of domestic animals.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing or orally until Monday, April 22, 2019. The board will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules in the *State Register* until at least 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The board does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

Metropolitan Airports Commission (MAC)

Notice of Second Public Comment Period and Hearing for Proposed Final Flying Cloud Airport (Fcm) Zoning Ordinance

The Joint Airport Zoning Board (JAZB) for Flying Cloud Airport (FCM) has developed a *Proposed Final Airport Zoning Ordinance* for land uses around FCM. The *Proposed Final Airport Zoning Ordinance* is based on the *Draft Airport Zoning Ordinance* that was presented to the public in February 2018, but incorporates revisions based on comments received from the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT). This airport zoning process is being conducted as required by Minnesota Statutes 360.061 – 360.074 and Minnesota Rules 8800.1200 and 8800.2400. The *Proposed Final Airport Zoning Ordinance* was approved by MnDOT on January 17, 2019. Maps that are part of the *Proposed Final Airport Zoning Ordinance* show the boundaries for its application and associated restrictions.

The *Proposed Final Airport Zoning Ordinance* would:

- Limit the height of structures and vegetation out to approximately 2 miles to the west of FCM, and out to approximately 1.5 miles in all other areas around the airport. In most cases, however, the airport zoning height limitations would be less restrictive than maximum heights allowed in the municipal zoning code. There are no changes to the height restrictions that were proposed in the *Draft Airport Zoning Ordinance*.
- Prohibit the development of structures or land uses that bring together an assembly or persons in JAZB Safety Zone A, which is mostly contained to airport-owned property. The extents of JAZB Safety Zone A have been expanded from the *Draft Airport Zoning Ordinance*; however, no privately-owned residential or commercial zoned property is included within the expanded JAZB Safety Zone A.
- Implement, in JAZB Safety Zone B, land use controls to ensure low-density development and prohibit the construction of places of public or semipublic assembly or other features which might attract waterfowl or other birds. The extents of JAZB Safety Zone B have been modified to exclude all privately-owned residential and commercial zoned property, along with four (4) airport-owned parcels expected to support non-aeronautical commercial development.
- Remove the requirement from the *Draft Airport Zoning Ordinance* to require a contiguous open space within JAZB Safety Zone B.
- Prohibit, in JAZB Safety Zones A, B and C, the use of land that creates or causes interference with the operations of radio or electronic facilities on FCM or with radio or electronic communications between FCM and aircraft, makes it difficult for pilots to distinguish between Airport lights and other lights, results in glare in the eyes of pilots using FCM, impairs visibility in the vicinity of FCM, or otherwise endangers the landing, taking off, or maneuvering of aircraft in the runway approach areas. The ordinance does not seek to prohibit the use of rooftop solar panels on homes or restrict the use of FCC-approved amateur radio stations.


