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
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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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# Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the *State Register*. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

#### Proposed Exempt Permanent Rules Adopting Federal Occupational Safety and Health Standards by Reference; Request for Comments

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Department of Labor and Industry, Occupational Safety and Health Division (Minnesota OSHA) proposes to adopt the following revisions to the Department of Labor and Industry, Occupational Safety and Health Rules, as authorized under Minnesota Statutes §182.655. This notice proposes the adoption of Occupational Safety and Health Standards already proposed and adopted by the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (Federal OSHA).

All interested or affected persons have 30 days from the date this notice is published in the *State Register* to submit, in writing, data and views on the proposed amendments to the rule. Comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments are encouraged. Each comment should identify the portion of the proposed amendment addressed, the reason for the comment, and any proposed change.

Any person may file with the Commissioner written objections to the proposed amendments stating the grounds for those objections and may request a public hearing. A public hearing will be held if 25 or more persons submit written requests for a public hearing on the proposed amendments within the 30-day comment period. Requests for hearing must include the name and address of the person submitting the request, define the reasons for the request, and discuss any proposed changes. If a public hearing is required, the Department will proceed according to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §182.655 and Minnesota Rules 5210.0020 to 5210.0100.

# Exempt Rules

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## SUMMARY OF CHANGES

The following is a brief and partial summary of the proposed amendments. To review the complete *Federal Register* notice referenced below, visit [www.osha.gov](http://www.osha.gov).

**(A) “Standards Improvement Project – Phase IV, Final rule.** On May 14, 2019, Federal OSHA published this final rule in the *Federal Register*. In response to the President’s Executive Order 13563, “Improving Regulations and Regulatory Review,” and consistent with Executive Order 13777, “Enforcing the Regulatory Reform Agenda,” OSHA is removing or revising outdated, duplicative, unnecessary, and inconsistent requirements in its safety and health standards. The current review, the fourth in this ongoing effort, the Standards Improvement Project-Phase IV (SIP-IV), reduces regulatory burden while maintaining or enhancing worker safety and health, and improving privacy protections.

By this notice, Minnesota OSHA proposes to adopt the final rule as published in the *Federal Register* May 14, 2019.

**(B) “Cranes and Derricks in Construction; Operator Qualification; Final rule.”** On November 9, 2018, Federal OSHA published a final rule in the *Federal Register* clarifying requirements for crane operators, and maintaining the employer’s duty to ensure that crane operators can safely operate the equipment. Under the final rule, employers are required to train operators as needed to perform assigned crane activities, evaluate them, and document successful completion of the evaluations. Employers who have evaluated operators prior to December 9, 2018, will not have to conduct those evaluations again, but will only have to document when those evaluations were completed. The rule also requires crane operators to be certified or licensed, and receive ongoing training as necessary to operate new equipment. Operators can be certified based on the crane’s type and capacity, or type only, which ensures that more accredited testing organizations are eligible to meet OSHA’s certification program requirements. The final rule revises a 2010 requirement that crane operator certification must specify the rated lifting capacity of cranes for which the operator is certified. Compliant certifications that were already issued by type and capacity are still acceptable under this final rule. The final rule is effective at the federal level.

By this notice, Minnesota OSHA proposes to adopt the final rule as published in the *Federal Register* November 9, 2018.

## Department of Natural Resources (DNR)

### Commissioner's Order #1 ML 2019: Amending walleye limits to manage fisheries in the 1837 Ceded Territory (Mille Lacs)

**Date:** September 3, 2019

**Statutory authority:** *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97C.005, subd. 3

**Supersedes:** The possession and size limits for walleye in part 6264.0400, subp. 4, item F, of Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rule: Mille Lacs Lake Fishing as published in the May 6, 2019, *State Register* (43 SR 1297).

#### BACKGROUND

Each year a harvest surplus is set for walleye in Mille Lacs Lake by a joint management process between the state of Minnesota (State) and the eight Chippewa Bands (Bands). The harvest surplus is the volume of fish that can safely be removed from Mille Lacs Lake while ensuring sufficient remaining walleye in the lake for a healthy fishery. The harvest surplus is then divided between the State and the Bands. The harvest surplus for the 2019 fishing season (December 1, 2018 through November 30, 2019) was set at 150,000 pounds. The State's allocation was 87,800 pounds, with the Bands receiving the remaining balance. Negotiations with the Bands also allowed for a 10% overage, meaning that an additional 8,780 pounds could be taken by State anglers, bringing the State's maximum total take to 96,580 pounds.

During the winter walleye season and through the month of May (December 1, 2018 through May 31, 2019), regulations allowed for limited harvest. Beginning June 1, 2019, regulations for walleye changed to catch and release only. Through June 15, 2019, the harvest rate (which includes fish caught and removed from the lake, as well as fish that were caught, released, and then died) was consistently near predicted levels. Based upon those results, the total harvest was expected to be below the State's 87,800-pound allocation for the twelve-month period from December 1, 2018 to November 30, 2019.

The State's creel report by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) estimates walleye harvest, releases, and mortality for two periods per month. Beginning with the June 15 through June 30, 2019 period, creel reports showed dramatic increases in the harvest rate due to higher than expected angling pressure and walleye catch rates. Angling pressure and walleye catch rates have remained higher than predicted throughout the summer. These factors—combined with higher mortality rates for fish caught and released when water temperatures are warm—have led to a higher than predicted harvest.

As a result, the State is now approaching its annual harvest allocation of 87,800 pounds. The State is committed to not exceed the allocation plus overage amount of 96,580 pounds. Pursuant to the United States Supreme Court decision in *Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa v. Minnesota*, 119 S. Ct. 1187 (1999), the State is legally required to abide by the limit agreed upon with the Bands for each year.

#### ORDER

**Now, Therefore,** It is hereby ordered that:

1. The Mille Lacs Lake state recreational walleye fishery will close at 12:01 a.m. on September 6, 2019, and remain closed through 12:01 a.m. on December 1, 2019. The DNR will provide public notice of the walleye fishing

closure on Mille Lacs Lake by issuing a statewide news release, posting notices at access points, and posting information on the DNR's website at least 24 hours before initiating the closure.

2. The existing regulations for all other species, including muskellunge, northern pike, bass, perch, and panfish continue unaffected by this order.

## Department of Labor and Industry Request for Proposals for Youth Skills Training Grants

The Youth Skills Training (YST) Program at the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry announces the availability of \$1.5 million in grant funding for the implementation and coordination of YST Programs in the State of Minnesota under *Minnesota Statutes* § 175.46. The performance period for five grants will be Feb. 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021. The performance period for 10 grants will be July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2022.

### I. Purpose

The YST Program supports the implementation and coordination of partnerships between schools and employers that result in safe, healthy and meaningful paid work experience for student learners ages 16 and older. The grant funding will support the establishment and development of self-sustaining partnerships.

### II. Objective

The YST Program encourages, promotes and supports the development of local partnerships between schools, employers and community organizations. 
