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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Proposed Amendment to and Repeal of Rules Governing Elevators and Related Devices; DUAL NOTICE: Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules Without a Public Hearing Unless 25 or More Persons Request a Hearing, and Notice of Hearing if 25 or More Requests for Hearing Are Received; Revisor's ID Number R-04517

Proposed Amendment to and Repeal of Rules Governing Elevators and Related Devices, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapter 1307

Introduction. The Department of Labor and Industry intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. If, however, 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing on the rules by 4:30 p.m. on February 20, 2020, the Department will hold a public hearing in the Minnesota Room, Department of Labor and Industry, 443 Lafayette Road N., St. Paul, Minnesota 55108. An Administrative Law Judge will conduct the hearing starting at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, March 9, 2020 and continuing until the hearing is completed. To find out whether the Department will adopt the rules without a hearing or if it will hold the hearing, you should contact the agency contact person after February 20, 2020, and before March 9, 2020.

Proposed Rules

Agency Contact Person. Submit any comments or questions on the rules or written requests for a public hearing to the agency contact person. Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules contain modifications to Minnesota Rules, chapter 1307, Elevators and Related Devices, to incorporate by reference the following codes and standards: the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (“ASME”) A17.1/CSA B44-2016 Safety Code for Elevators and Escalators; the ASME A17.3-2015, Safety Code for Existing Elevators and Escalators; ASME A17.5-2014, Elevator and Escalator Electrical Equipment; ASME A17.7/CSA B44.7-2007, Performance-Based Safety Codes for Elevators and Escalators; ASME A18.1-2017, Safety Standard for Platform Lifts and Stairway Chairlifts; ASME A90.1-2015, Safety Standard for Belt Manlifts; ASME B20.1-2015, Safety Standard for Conveyors and Related Equipment; and ASME A17.4-2015, Guide for Emergency Personnel. The incorporation by reference of ASME A17.3-2015, Safety Code for Existing Elevators and Escalators, includes section 3.10.12 that requires existing elevators be equipped with a system to monitor and prevent automatic operation of the elevator with faulty door contact circuits. Modifications are also made to the general requirements of chapter 1307 pertaining to definitions; permits; inspection, tests, and approvals; special provisions; existing installations; and referenced codes, standards, and specifications. The proposed rule modifies ASME A17.1/CSA B44-2016 provisions of the following topics: pits; clearance between car and hoistway enclosures; general requirements; headroom in machinery spaces, machine rooms, control spaces, and control spaces; hoistway door unlocking device keyway and locked panel; hoistway access switches; illumination of cars and lighting switches; emergency operation and signaling devices; emergency communications; information included on layout drawing; car safeties; application of safeties; elevator inspector qualifications; and periodic inspection and test frequency. The proposed rule modifies ASME A18.1-2017 provisions of the following topics: runways; operating devices and control equipment; emergency signals; standby power; platform guarding; operation; and clearances. The proposed rule also repeals the followings parts: 1307.0047, subparts 8, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14; and 1307.0095. The topics addressed in 1307.0047 subparts 8 and 13 are work required for compliance with ASME A17.1/CSA B44-2010 sections 8.6.5.8 Safety Bulkhead, 8.10.4.1.1(p) (5); Clearance Between Step and Skirt (Load Gap); and 8.10.4.1.1(t) Step/Skirt Index. The topics addressed in 1307.0047 subparts 10, 11, 12, and 14 are work required for compliance with ASME A17.3-2011 sections 2.7.5 Restricted Opening of Hoistway Doors and Car Doors on Passenger Elevators; 3.11.3 Firefighter’s Service; 4.3.3 Hydraulic Elevators; and 5.1.11 Step/Skirt Performance Index. Part 1307.0095 amends chapter 30, Elevators and Conveying Systems, of the 2012 edition of the International Building Code (“IBC”). Chapter 30 of the 2018 edition of the IBC is amended in Minnesota Rules, chapter 1305, Minnesota Building Code.

The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 326B.02, subdivision 5, 326B.101, 326B.106, subdivision 1, and 326B.187. A copy of the proposed rules is published on the Department’s web site at: <http://www.dli.mn.gov/about-department/rulemaking/rulemaking-docket-minnesota-rules-chapter-1307>. A free paper copy of the proposed rules is available upon request from the agency contact person listed above.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, February 20, 2020, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comment is encouraged. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed. You are encouraged to propose any change that you desire. Any comments that you have about the legality of the proposed rules must also be made during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the Department hold a hearing on the rules. You must make your request for a public hearing in writing, which the agency contact person must receive by 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, February 20, 2020. You must include your name and address in your written request. In addition, you must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it when determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, the Department will hold a public hearing unless a sufficient number of persons withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests

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for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to effect the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Alternative Format/Accommodation. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request or if you need an accommodation to make this hearing accessible, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Modifications. The Department might modify the proposed rules, either as a result of public comment or as a result of the rule hearing process. It must support modifications by data and views submitted to the agency or presented at the hearing. The adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules unless the Department follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the Department encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Cancellation of Hearing. The Department will cancel the hearing scheduled for March 9, 2020, if the agency does not receive requests for a hearing from 25 or more persons. If you requested a public hearing, the agency will notify you before the scheduled hearing whether the hearing will be held. You may also call the agency contact person at (651) 284-5006 after February 20, 2020 to find out whether the hearing will be held. Notice of Hearing. If 25 or more persons submit valid written requests for a public hearing on the rules, the Department will hold a hearing following the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. The Department will hold the hearing on the date and at the time and place listed above. The hearing will continue until all interested persons have been heard. Administrative Law Judge Eric L. Lipman is assigned to conduct the hearing. To reach, please contact staff attorney Andrew Hart at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 600 North Robert Street, P.O. Hearing Procedure. If the Department holds a hearing, you and all interested or affected persons, including representatives of associations or other interested groups, will have an opportunity to participate. You may present your views either orally at the hearing or in writing at any time before the hearing record closes. All evidence presented should relate to the proposed rules. You may also submit written material to the Administrative Law Judge to be recorded in the hearing record for five working days after the public hearing ends. At the hearing the Administrative Law Judge may order that this five-day comment period is extended for a longer period but not more than 20 calendar days. Following the comment period, there is a five-working-day rebuttal period when the agency and any interested person may respond in writing to any new information submitted. No one may submit new evidence during the five-day rebuttal period.

All post-hearing comments and responses must be submitted to the Administrative Law Judge no later than 4:30 p.m. on the due date. The Office of Administrative Hearings strongly encourages all persons submitting comments and responses to do so using the Administrative Hearings' Rulemaking eComments website at <https://minnesotaoah.granicusideas.com/discussions>. If using the eComments website is not possible, you may submit post-hearing comments in person, via United States mail, or by facsimile addressed to Judge Lipman at the address or facsimile number listed in the Notice of Hearing section above.

All comments or responses received will be available for review at the Department of Labor and Industry or on the agency's website at

<http://www.dli.mn.gov/about-department/rulemaking/rulemaking-docket-minnesota-rules-chapter-1307>. This rule hearing procedure is governed by *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2000 to 1400.2240, and *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. You may direct questions about the procedure to the Administrative Law Judge.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. The statement of need and reasonableness summarizes the justification for the proposed rules, including a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules and an estimate of the

probable cost of the proposed rules. It is now available from the agency contact person. You may review or obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person. Adoption Procedure if No Hearing. If no hearing is required, the agency may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The Department will submit the rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for a legal review. You may ask to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the office. If you want to receive notice of this, to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

Adoption Procedure after a Hearing. If a hearing is held, after the close of the hearing record, the Administrative Law Judge will issue a report on the proposed rules. You may ask to be notified of the date that the Administrative Law Judge's report will become available, and can make this request at the hearing or in writing to the Administrative Law Judge. You may also ask to be notified of the date that the agency adopts the rules and the rules are filed with the Secretary of State by requesting this at the hearing or by writing to the agency contact person stated above.

Proposed Repeal of Obsolete Rules Administered by the Board of Podiatric Medicine; Notice of Intent to Repeal Obsolete Rules

Proposed Repeal of Obsolete Rules Governing Definitions, Temporary Permits, Licensure Requirements, Reinstatement of License, and Continuing Education, *Minnesota Rules*, 6900.0010, subp. 1a; 0020, subps. 6, 7; .0160, subp. 2; .0210 subp. 1 C, D; .0300, subp. 1, 1a, and 3b; Revisor's ID Number 4604

Introduction. The Minnesota Board of Podiatric Medicine ("Board") intends to repeal obsolete rules under the rulemaking process in the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.3895. You may submit written comments on the proposed repeal of obsolete rules until March 23, 2020.

Board Contact Person. You may submit the comments or questions via U.S. mail, personal delivery, or electronic mail.

Subject of the Repeal of Obsolete Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed obsolete rules are about temporary permits, licensure requirements, reinstatement of license, and continuing education. The Board identified the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed in its annual 2018 obsolete rules report under Minnesota Statutes section 14.05, subdivision 5. The statutory authority to repeal the obsolete rules is found in Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.3895 and 153.02. A copy of the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed is published in the State Register and attached to this notice as mailed.

The statutory changes that rendered these rules obsolete went into effect on August 1, 2018, so the impact on the licensees and/or the public has already occurred.

Proposed Rules

All of the provisions set to be repealed have been rendered obsolete by Minnesota Statutes, as follows:

- Minnesota Rules 6900.0010, subp. 1a, Definitions, has been rendered obsolete by Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 1(d) (2018). Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 1(d) no longer allows for graduate training to include a preceptorship; it requires a residency. The rule defined “acceptable graduate training” to include a preceptorship.
- Minnesota Rules 6900.0020, subps. 6, 7, Licensure Requirements, have been rendered obsolete by Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 1(d) (2018). Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 1(d) no longer allows for graduate training to include a preceptorship; it requires a residency. The rule allowed for a preceptorship.
- Minnesota Rule 6900.0160, subp. 2, Temporary Permit, has been rendered obsolete by Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 3 (2018). Specifically, Minnesota Statute, section 153.16, subd. 3, allows the board to issue a temporary permit when a podiatrist is engaged in a clinical residency and provides that the permit renews annually until the residency requirements have been met. The rule allowed the Board to issue a temporary permit for only 12 months and then allowed for reissue under certain circumstances.
- Minnesota Rule 6900.0210, subp. 1 C, D, Reinstatement of License, has been rendered obsolete by Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 2(f) (2018). Minnesota Statute, section 153.16, subd. 2(f), requires those applying for reinstatement of licensure to show evidence of participation in the statutorily-required number of continuing education credit during the inactive period. The rule allowed applicants to show evidence of only one-half of the required continuing education.
- Minnesota Rule 6900.0300, subps. 1, 1a, and 3b, Continuing Education, have been rendered obsolete by Minnesota Statutes, section 153.16, subd. 5(a), (b) (2018). Minnesota Statute, section 153.16, subd. 5(a), (b), requires each podiatrist to complete 40 clock hours of continuing education during each two-year renewal period. The rule required only 30 hours.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on March 23, 2020, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed repeal of obsolete rules and any part or subpart of the repeal. Your comment must be in writing and received by the Board contact person by the due date. The Board encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed addressed and the reason for the comment. In addition, you are encouraged to object to the repeal of any part or subpart. You must also make any comments on the legality of the proposed rules during this comment period.

Request for Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. You must make your request in writing and the Board contact person must receive it by 4:30 p.m. on March 23, 2020. Your written request must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed repealed rules to which you object or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the Board cannot count it for determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Effect of Requests. If 25 or more people submit a written request, the Board will have to meet the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.131 to 14.20 for rules adopted after a hearing or the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.22 to 14.28 for rules adopted without a hearing, including the preparation of a statement of need and reasonableness and the opportunity for a hearing.

Modifications. The Board might modify its choice of these designated rules or parts proposed for repeal (e.g. fixing a typo or deciding not to repeal a rule because the rule is discovered not to be obsolete), based on comments and information submitted to the Board. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the State Register, the Board will publish a notice of adopting the repealers in the State Register. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the State Register, the Board must publish a copy of the changes in the State Register. If the proposed repeal of obsolete rules affects you in any way, the Board encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request, please contact the Board contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Repeal and Review of Obsolete Rules. If no hearing is required, the Board may repeal the obsolete rules at the end of the comment period. The Board will then submit rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review for legality. You may ask to be notified of the date that the Board submits the rules. If you want to be so notified, want to receive a copy of the repealed obsolete rules, or want to register with the Board to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the Board contact person listed above.

Department of Education Notice of Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Waivers

In 2019, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) approved four waivers related to the SFSP in Minnesota. These waivers are in effect through April 30, 2020. The Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) will request that USDA renew the SFSP waivers for Minnesota before the 2020 summer program begins. SFSP sponsors do not need to individually request the waivers.

MDE will request the following requirements be waived for Minnesota:

- That *only* school food authorities may use Offer vs. Serve (OVS) in SFSP.
- That school meal pattern rules must be followed when using OVS.
- That *all* SFSP sites receive first-week site visits. SFSP sites that operated the program successfully in the previous summer and have no serious deficiency findings would be exempt from this requirement.
- The regulatory limitations on meal service times. Flexibilities would be allowed.
- That all closed enrolled sites, even if located in an eligible area, must qualify for SFSP based on the income eligibility of children attending the site.




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
