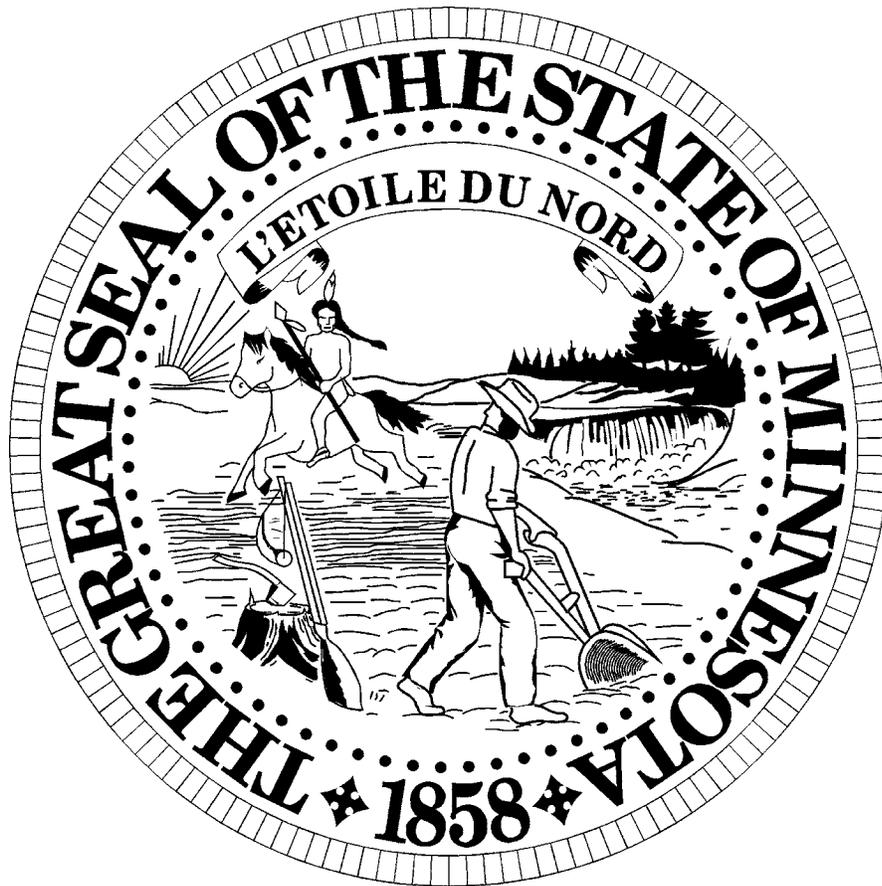

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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

## NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The *State Register* also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

### Notice of Vacancy for State Designer Selection Board – Public Citizen Member

The State of Minnesota, State Designer Selection Board has a public member vacancy. Application information is available on the Minnesota Secretary of State Open Commissions & Appointments website at <https://www.sos.state.mn.us/boards-commissions/>. Applications are due by **March 31, 2020**.

The State Designer Selection Board (SDSB) selects the primary designer on building construction or remodeling projects as requested by state agencies, the University of Minnesota and Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MN State) on all projects with an estimated construction cost greater than \$2,000,000, and on planning projects with estimated fees greater than \$200,000. The state Designer Selection Board consists of seven individuals, the majority of whom must be Minnesota residents. Each of the following four organizations shall nominate one individual whose name and qualifications shall be submitted to the commissioner of administration for consideration: the Consulting Engineers Council of Minnesota after consultation with other professional engineering societies in the state; the AIA Minnesota; the Minnesota chapter of the Associated General Contractors after consultation with other commercial contractor associations in the state; and the Minnesota Board of the Arts. The commissioner may appoint the four named individuals to the board but may reject a nominated individual and request another nomination. The fifth member shall be a representative of the user agency, the University of Minnesota, or the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities, designated by the user agency. The remaining two citizen members shall also be appointed by the commissioner. Meetings are held on Tuesdays at 8:30 a.m. at 116B Administration Bldg. ## Department of Human Services

### Economic Assistance and Employment Supports Division MFIP Transitional Standard with Cash increase for February 1, 2020

Minnesota Statute 256J.24, Subd. 5a requires the Commissioner of Human Services to adjust the food portion of the Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) Transitional Standard in order to maintain compliance with the federal waiver from the United States Department of Agriculture. The statute also requires the Commissioner publish the adjusted Transitional Standard for assistance unit sizes one to ten. The Transitional Standard consists of a cash and food portion. 2019 Minnesota statute 256J.24, Subd. 5(b) mandated a cash grant increase of \$100 per month per household. The MFIP Transitional Standard and cash and food portions effective February 1, 2020 are listed below and reflect the cash grant increase.

#### Notice of Proposed Boundary Line Agreement and Conveyance for Description Revision

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Division of Lands and Minerals, proposes to enter into a boundary line agreement and conveyance for description revision, under the authority of *Minnesota Statutes* section 84.0273, to correct boundary line issues affecting the ownership interests of the State and an adjacent landowner, Larkek LLC, a Minnesota limited liability company. The agreement involves land located in the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW1/4 of SE1/4) and the Southeast Quarter of Southwest Quarter (SE1/4 of SW1/4), Section 3, Township 140, Range 30, Cass County, Minnesota. The reason for the agreement is to address an original surveying error of the State land. The State and Larkek LLC wish to update and correct the legal descriptions of the State land and the Larkek LLC land to reflect the actual marked and occupied boundary locations.

### REQUEST FOR COMMENTS on Planned Amendments to Rules Governing Water Quality Fees, *Minnesota Rules*, Chapters 7002 and 7083; Revisor's ID Number R-04476

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) requests comments on planned amendments to the water quality fee rules, *Minnesota Rules* Chapters 7002 (Permit Fees) and 7083 (Subsurface Sewage Treatment Systems Credentialing and Product Registration). Submit comments in writing as described in the Public Comment section below.

**Stakeholder Meetings.** The MPCA has scheduled stakeholder meetings on revising the water quality fee rules. At these public meetings, MPCA will share information about fee revisions and the intent of this rulemaking. **Persons Affected.** The planned rule amendments will likely affect persons required to obtain a permit from the MPCA under Minn. R. 7001.0020, items C to F, and 7090.0030. Permit fees include application fees, annual fees, and additional fees. At this time, the MPCA is not considering increases to construction stormwater and industrial stormwater permit fees.

**Subject of Rules.** The MPCA is planning amendments to the water quality fee rules that would revise permit application fees, additional fees, and annual fees. This includes fees for municipal wastewater and industrial wastewater permits, municipal stormwater permits, feedlot permits, and subsurface sewage treatment systems (SSTS) tanks and licensing. These amendments would also change the implementation of variance fees, though would not increase them.

Water quality fees have not kept pace with costs, so the current fees authorized in rule for water-related permitting do not generate sufficient revenue to administer the associated water quality programs. The MPCA plans to revise fees so that they reflect the Agency's costs to administer state and federal requirements associated with the fee-based water quality programs that protect the state's water resources. Revised fees are also needed to distribute permit costs equitably across affected permittees.

In a previous Request for Comments on this rulemaking published in the June 26, 2017 *State Register*, the MPCA asked for comment on amendments to the water quality fee rules and requested responses to six questions regarding fees. The MPCA Commissioner formed the Water Fee Advisory Committee in late 2017, after considering the comments received in response to that Request for Comments<sup>1</sup>. The Advisory Committee included a broad range of stakeholders to ensure that both fee payers and system operators had input on proposed changes to water permit fees. After multiple meetings with the Advisory Committee, the MPCA prepared a report based on the perspectives, input, and feedback on water fees that the Advisory Committee provided over multiple meetings<sup>2</sup>. The report contains the Advisory Committee's recommendations and preferred options for revising fees.

The Advisory Committee identified an overall target for all water permittees to pay at least 30% of the MPCA water program costs via permit fees. This target would generate approximately \$2 million in additional revenue. For programs in which fees currently exceed 30% of program costs, permit fees would not change. A concept document with more details on funding gaps and a plan to adjust fees is available at

<https://www.pca.state.mn.us/water/amendments-water-quality-fee-rules>. In brief, the MPCA is considering the following adjustments:

- Feedlots:
  - Increased fee for General and Individual NPDES/SDS permits with construction
  - New fee for gap sites
  - New statewide fee for registration sites, using a tiered approach based on animal units.
- Municipal stormwater (MS4): increases to permit fees determined by type of permittee.
  - City or township: tiered fees based on population
  - County: fees based on percentage of urbanized area
  - Nontraditional MS4 (Institutions and MNDOT): fees based on acres of impervious surface
  - Watershed district: flat fee
- Industrial wastewater: increases to permit fees
- Municipal wastewater: increases to permit fees
- Subsurface sewage treatment systems: increases to tank fees and licensing fees
- Salt applicator training: new fee to cover the cost of holding the training
- Variances: tiered fee based on design flow

At this time, the MPCA is not considering increasing fees for:

- Construction stormwater and industrial stormwater (current fees for these permits cover the targeted 30% of program costs).
- Environmental review.

Some of these fee changes would require changes to statute, which the MPCA would seek.

Per the Advisory Committee's recommendations, the MPCA would phase fees in over a 3-6 year period. The MPCA requests comment on this timeline as well as the concept document located at:

The MPCA will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60-days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The MPCA does not plan to appoint another advisory committee for this rulemaking.

The MPCA requests any information about whether the cost of complying with the rule in the first year after the rule takes effect will exceed \$25,000 for one small city or business under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.127.

The MPCA is interested in whether local governments might be required to adopt or amend an ordinance or other regulation under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.128 to implement these rules, and therefore requests that local governments provide comments including relevant information about their ordinances.

The MPCA also requests any information pertaining to the cumulative effect of the rule amendments with other federal, tribal or state regulations under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.131(8), as related to the specific purpose of the rule. Cumulative effect is the impact resulting from incremental effects of the proposed rule in addition to other state, tribal government or federal agency rules.

## Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Remediation Division Notice of Proposed Update of the State Superfund Priority List

**Notice of Proposed Update** of the State Superfund Priority List (State Superfund List) (also known as the Permanent List of Priorities [PLP]) Among Releases or Threatened Releases of Hazardous Substances or Pollutants or Contaminants.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is publishing for public comment proposed additions to the State Superfund List, which lists releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants for which the MPCA may take removal or remedial actions under the Minnesota Environmental Response and Liability Act (MERLA), Minn. Stat. §§ 115B.01-115B.20.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 115B.17, the MPCA is authorized to take any removal or remedial action which the MPCA deems necessary to protect the public health, welfare or the environment whenever there is a release, or substantial threat of release, from a facility of any pollutant or contaminant which presents an imminent and substantial danger to the public health, welfare, or the environment, or whenever a hazardous substance is released or there is a threatened release of a hazardous substance from a facility.

Minn. Stat. § 115B.17, subd. 13 required the MPCA to establish priority rules regarding releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances, and pollutants or contaminants. These rules, Minn. R. ch. 7044, became effective on April 5, 1993.

Minn. Stat. § 115B.17, subd. 13 also require the MPCA to adopt the State Superfund List and to update the list

annually according to the criteria set forth in the priority rules. Before any update of the State Superfund List is adopted by the MPCA, it must be published in the State Register and a 30-day public comment period must be provided. This notice is, therefore, published to inform the public that the MPCA is proposing to update the State Superfund List and to solicit public comment on the proposed additions.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 115B.17 and Minn. R. 7044.0950, the MPCA is proposing the following changes to the Superfund List.

The MPCA is proposing to add the following four sites (Sites) to the State Superfund List (Hazard Ranking Score assigned pursuant to Minn. R. 7044.0350 follows the Site): 1) 214-220 Ramsey Street (24.07) located at 220 Ramsey Street in the City of Hastings; 2) Gold Eagle Cleaners – Richfield (50.05) located at 1537 East 66<sup>th</sup> Street in the City of Richfield; 3) Gold Eagle Cleaners – Roseville (50.01) located at 1231-1237 Larpenteur Avenue West in the City of Roseville; and 4) Minnetonka Boulevard and Raleigh Avenue South (51.32) located at 5101 Minnetonka Boulevard in the City of St. Louis Park.

All four of the proposed listings are former dry cleaners and no longer located at the above addresses. The contaminant of concern is tetrachloroethylene (PCE) in the soil gas. PCE was commonly used as a dry cleaning solvent and is a hazardous substance under the definition in Minn. Stat. §115B.02, subd. 8. These MPCA sites are being proposed for addition to the State Superfund List as, in each case, State Superfund resources will likely be necessary to complete additional investigations of the soil gas and groundwater, and to implement appropriate response actions.

Each MPCA Site has been assigned to Response Action Classes C and D (see Minn. R. 7044.0450). The four response action classes are defined as follows: Class A - Declared Emergency; Class B - Response Actions Completed and Operation and Maintenance/Long-Term Monitoring Ongoing; Class C - Response Actions Necessary or in Progress or First Year Operation and Maintenance at a Site; and Class D - Remedial Investigations and Feasibility Studies Necessary or in Progress.

The MPCA is also proposing to delist the following Sites from the Superfund List: 1) Brainerd Foundry, Brainerd MN; 2) Naval Industrial Reserve Ordinance Plant (NIROP; partial delist), Fridley MN; and 3) Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant (TCAAP, partial delist), Arden Hills MN.

The Brainerd Foundry site was listed on the Permanent List of Priorities (PLP) April 7, 2010. Through bankruptcy proceedings, the site was acquired by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration (EDA) in 1982. The EDA, in coordination with MPCA, identified and removed lead and polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) impacted soils and replaced them with clean fill. During development of an adjoining bike trail, soils containing arsenic, lead, and mercury exceeding soil reference values (SRV's) were detected. The City of Brainerd capped the impacted soils with clean fill and asphalt in 1998.

The Minnesota Decision Document (MDD), dated July 9, 2015, outlined the Residential Tier 1 Soil Reference Values as reasonable and appropriate cleanup levels for the soil contamination. The MDD concluded that groundwater risks associated with the Brainerd Foundry were low, and there were no vapor impacts. MPCA staff recommends that the Brainerd Foundry site be removed from the PLP because all reasonable and appropriate actions related to the identified releases have been taken. The PLP deletion criteria have been met for the site and no further Minnesota Environmental Response and Liability Act (MERLA) response actions are necessary because there is no longer a threat to human health or the environment under the current land use.

NIROP was a five-inch gun mount manufacturing facility and was listed on the PLP October 30, 1984. NIROP was then listed on the National Priority List (NPL) on November 21, 1989. It had been divided into three Operable Units (OU's), only OU3, the soils above the water table underlying the former Plating Shop, is being considered for delisting. Chlorinated solvents, primarily trichloroethene (TCE), were used at NIROP as degreasers for metal parts. The NIROP plant stored and disposed of industrial waste, scrap materials, drummed wastes, and chemicals at the facility. In 1996, drums and containers were excavated from discrete areas. In 2002, a small area with elevated contaminant concentrations was removed. These removals addressed the known locations with unacceptable contaminant risks in near surface soils.

# Official Notices

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Remaining low levels of soil contamination are managed by land use controls (LUCs) implemented on June 17, 2004. The LUCs restrict the NIROP area for industrial or restricted commercial use and prohibit the disturbance of soil deeper than three feet below ground surface in several areas, including OU3. An Institutional Control (IC), or deed restriction, was also recorded with the deed. OU3 was delisted by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) from the NPL on September 17, 2018. MPCA staff recommends that the NIROP OU3 site be removed from the PLP because all reasonable and appropriate actions related to the identified releases have been taken. The PLP deletion criteria have been met for the site and no further MERLA response actions are necessary because there is no longer a threat to human health or the environment under the current land use.

TCAAP was a small arms ammunition manufacturing and testing facility that was listed on the PLP October 30, 1984. TCAAP had been previously listed on the NPL on September 1, 1983. It had been divided into three OU's, only OU2, the on-site soil and surface water that lies within the four square mile footprint of the property is being considered for delisting. TCE was used as a metal degreaser and is the primary contaminant of concern. The United States Department of the Army has completed the soil and surface water cleanup actions required by the OU2 Record of Decision (ROD) and associated ROD amendments.

IC's are in place for certain portions of TCAAP to manage potential risk associated with residual soil contamination at depth, below protective clean soil buffers and caps. OU2 was delisted by the EPA from the NPL on September 23, 2019. MPCA staff recommends that the TCAAP OU2 site be removed from the PLP because all reasonable and appropriate actions related to the identified releases have been taken. The PLP deletion criteria have been met for the site and no further MERLA response actions are necessary because there is no longer a threat to human health or the environment under the current land use.

The MPCA invites members of the public to submit written comments on the proposed four additions and three deletions from the State Superfund Permanent List of Priorities. All written comments with regard to these proposed changes to the Superfund List must be received no later than **4:30 p.m. on February 26, 2020**.
