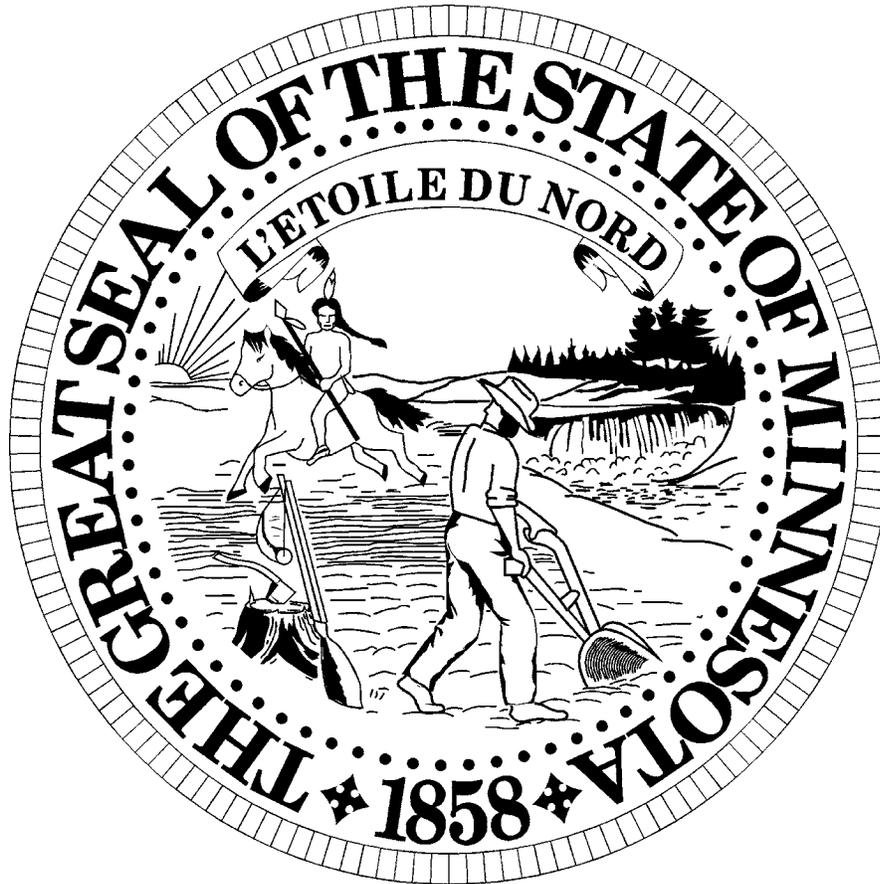

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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Subp. 13. **Largemouth bass and smallmouth bass catch-and-release regulations.** While a person is on or fishing in these waters, angling for largemouth bass and smallmouth bass is limited to catch and release only, whereby any largemouth bass or smallmouth bass caught must be immediately returned to the water. Catch-and-release angling for largemouth bass or smallmouth bass is legal during the open season for largemouth bass and smallmouth bass in inland waters. It is unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any largemouth bass or smallmouth bass while on or fishing in these waters.

Subp. 19. **Northern pike 24-inch to 36-inch protected slot limit.** While a person is on or fishing in the following waters, all northern pike in possession must be less than 24 inches in length or greater than 36 inches in length. All northern pike that are 24 to 36 inches in length, inclusive, must be immediately returned to the water. A person's daily and possession limit may not include more than one northern pike over 36 inches in length.

(3) all northern pike that are from 26 to 44 inches in length, inclusive, must be immediately returned to the water.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Prohibition on Feeding Deer

Notice is hereby given that the following rules are being adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13(b), which authorizes the Commissioner to adopt emergency rules to control wildlife disease. Additional authority for the content of the rule is found in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 97A.045, subdivision 11.

The following conditions do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459: Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) has been detected at multiple cervid farms in central and southeast Minnesota. Prions, the infectious agents that transmit the disease, are shed through saliva, urine, blood, feces, and antler velvet. Prions are highly resistant to degradation and can persist in the environment for decades. Prions spread among individual deer through both direct (animal-to-animal) and indirect (environmental) contact. The use of deer feed and attractants causes deer to concentrate in one area, thus greatly increasing the risk of CWD transmission between individuals.

Deer feeding will be prohibited in seven new counties surrounding two deer farms where new cases of CWD were discovered in late 2019. Wild deer will be tested in surveillance zones around these two farms for the next three years. Deer feeding will also continue to be restricted in Stearns County because it is adjacent to a county where CWD was detected on a deer farm. Counties surrounding a Meeker County deer farm where the disease was detected in 2017 will be dropped from the deer feeding ban on July 1, 2020 because the disease was not detected after three years of testing hunter harvested wild deer. A ban on both deer feeding and attractants will remain in place in 18 counties where the disease has been detected in wild deer.

Because efforts to manage CWD are ongoing, and may end or require modification depending on additional detections of the disease, the 18-month effective time of rules adopted under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13(b) best accommodates this situation.

To further reduce the transmission of CWD, the placement or distribution of deer feed and deer attractants is prohibited in the counties of Aitkin, Cass, Crow Wing, Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Houston, Hubbard, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Mower, Olmsted, Steele, Todd, Wabasha, Wadena, and Winona. The placement or distribution of deer feed is prohibited in the counties of Carlton Chisago, Douglas, Isanti, Kanabec, Pine, Pope and Stearns. The placement or distribution of deer feed is prohibited until July 1, 2020 in the counties of Kandiyohi, McLeod, Meeker, and Wright, and that portion of Renville lying north of U.S. Highway 212.

Expedited Emergency Rules

6232.4800 FEEDING DEER PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN COUNTIES.

Subpart 1. **Definitions.** For purposes of this part:

A. “attractants” means liquid food scents, salt, minerals, and other natural or manufactured products that are capable of attracting or enticing deer, including any product that contains or purports to contain cervid urine, blood, gland oil, feces, or other bodily fluid; and

B. “feed” means grains, fruits, vegetables, nuts, hay, and other food that is capable of attracting or enticing deer; and

C. “place” or “placed” means to place, cause to occur, allow, or otherwise distribute attractants or feed on a person’s property with an intent to attract or entice deer, including allowing another individual to place attractants or feed on the landowner’s property.

Subp. 2. **Applicability; prohibition; feed and attractants.**

A. In Aitkin, Cass, Crow Wing, Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Houston, Hubbard, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Mower, Olmsted, Steele, Todd, Wabasha, Wadena, and Winona Counties, a person may not place feed or attractants, except as provided in subpart 3.

B. In Carlton, Chisago, Douglas, Isanti, Kanabec, Pine, Pope, and Stearns Counties, a person may not place feed, except as provided in subpart 3.

C. In Kandiyohi, McLeod, Meeker, and Wright Counties and that portion of Renville County lying north of U.S. Highway 212, a person may not place feed through June 30, 2020, except as provided in subpart 3.

Subp. 3. **Exceptions.** The prohibitions in subpart 2 do not include feed that is:

A. intended to feed wildlife other than deer, if the feed is:

(1) arranged in a manner to exclude access to deer; or

(2) arranged at least six feet above the ground;

B. present solely as a result of normal agricultural, forest management, or wildlife food-planting practices; or

C. for livestock purposes, if the feed is:

(1) present for domestic livestock that are present and actively consuming the feed daily;

(2) covered to deter deer from gaining access to the feed; or

(3) stored consistent with normal agricultural practices.

Subp. 4. **Cleanup.**

A. In addition to any other penalties imposed, a person must immediately remove any feed and attractants that have been placed in violation of subpart 2.

B. Failure to comply with this subpart is a separate violation from and in addition to a violation of subpart 2.

REPEALER. Minnesota Rules, part 6232.4800, published in the State Register, volume 44, page 323, August 26, 2019, is repealed.

Minnesota Agricultural and Economic Development Board Proposed Change in Conduit Bond Issuance Fees

The Minnesota Agricultural and Economic Development Board's (the "Board") fee structure to issue conduit bonds has been unchanged since 2010. The Board currently charges a one-time fee based on the original amount of the conduit bond issues of 1/6th of 1 percent (16.5 basis points) with a minimum of \$10,000 and a maximum of \$50,000.

The Board will be implementing changes in this fee structure so fees are more consistent with rates being charged by similar entities and to better reflect the costs involved with these transactions. The fee for initial issuances will increase to 1/5th of 1 percent (20 basis points) and the minimum fee will increase to \$15,000 but the maximum will be unchanged at \$50,000.

The Board will also increase the fees associated with conduit refund bond issues to 10 basis points (up from 8.25 basis points) with a minimum of \$15,000 (up from \$10,000) and maximum fee of \$50,000 which will be unchanged.

The Board will also establish a \$2,500 fee for required Board action related to approvals necessary to meet the requirements of the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act of 1982 (TEFRA).

The Board reserves the right to be reimbursed for any extraordinary expenses related to conduit issues that exceed these fees.


