

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Proposed Amendment to Rules Governing the Minnesota Accessibility Code; DUAL NOTICE: Notice of Intent to Adopt Rules Without a Public Hearing Unless 25 or More Persons Request a Hearing, and Notice of Hearing if 25 or More Requests for Hearing Are Received; Revisor's ID Number R-04514

Proposed Amendment to Rules Governing the Minnesota Accessibility Code, Minnesota Rules, Chapter 1341

Introduction. The Department of Labor and Industry intends to adopt rules without a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Office of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2300 to 1400.2310, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.22 to 14.28. If, however, 25 or more persons submit a written request for a hearing on the rules by 4:30 p.m. on August 28, 2019, the Department will hold a public hearing in Minnesota Room, Department of Labor and Industry, 443 Lafayette Road North, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155, starting at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, October 4, 2019. To find out whether the Department will adopt the rules without a hearing or if it will hold the hearing, you should contact the agency contact person after August 28, 2019 and before October 4, 2019.

Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules contain modifications to Minnesota Rules, Chapter 1341, the Minnesota Accessibility Code, to incorporate by reference, with amendments, Chapter 11 of the 2018 International Building Code ("IBC") and Section 305 of the 2018 International Existing Building Code ("IEBC"). The Minnesota Accessibility Code provides direction as to which building elements in newly designed and constructed buildings or existing buildings undergoing renovation are required to be accessible, the minimum number of required accessible elements, and the technical design of those elements to make commercial and public buildings readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities. The proposed rule amends IBC provisions regarding the following topics: general requirements; scoping requirements; accessible routes; accessible entrances; dwelling units and sleeping units; other features and facilities; recreational facilities; and signage. Due to reformatting of the 2018 IBC, the proposed rules also repeal existing Minnesota Rules amending Chapter 11 of the IBC in connection with the following topics: definitions; terms not defined; requirements for additions to existing buildings; requirements for alterations to existing buildings; and requirements for change of occupancy. Modifications are proposed to amend Section 305 of the 2018 IEBC, which includes the following topics: references to other International Code Council codes; complete change of occupancy; alterations affecting an area containing a primary function; and scoping for alterations. Modifications are further made to the amendments for the 2009 edition of the ICC/ANSI A117.1 Standard, which include the following topics: parallel curb ramps and blended transitions; sales and service counters; and the height of beds in accessible units.

The statutory authority to adopt the rules is in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 326B.02, subdivision 5, 326B.101, and 326B.106, subdivision 1(a). A copy of the proposed rules is published on the Department's web site at: *http://www.dli.state.mn.us/about-department/rulemaking/rulemaking-docket-minnesota-rules-chapter-1341*. A free paper copy of the proposed rules is available upon request from the agency contact person listed above.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, August 28, 2019, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules or any part or subpart of the rules. Your comments must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. Comment is encouraged. Your comments should identify the portion of the proposed rules addressed, the reason for the comment, and any change proposed. You are encouraged to propose any change that you desire. Any comments that you have about the legality of the proposed rules must also be made during this comment period.

Request for a Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that the Department hold a hearing on the rules. You must make your request for a public hearing in writing, which the agency contact person must receive by 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, August 28, 2019. You must include your name and address in your written request. In addition, you must identify the portion of the proposed rules that you object to or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it when determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 25 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, the Department will hold a public hearing unless a sufficient number of persons withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 25, the agency must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the actions the agency took to effect the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If a public hearing is required, the agency will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Alternative Format/Accommodation. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request or if you need an accommodation to make this hearing accessible, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Modifications. The Department might modify the proposed rules, either as a result of public comment or as a result of the rule hearing process. It must support modifications by data and views submitted to the agency or presented at the hearing. The adopted rules may not be substantially different than these proposed rules unless the Department follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the Department

encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Cancellation of Hearing. The Department will cancel the hearing scheduled for October 4, 2019, if the agency does not receive requests for a hearing from 25 or more persons. If you requested a public hearing, the agency will notify you before the scheduled hearing whether the hearing will be held. You may also call the agency contact person at (651) 284-5006 after August 28, 2019 to find out whether the hearing will be held. Notice of Hearing. If 25 or more persons submit valid written requests for a public hearing on the rules, the Department will hold a hearing following the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. The Department will hold the hearing on the date and at the time and place listed above. The hearing will continue until all interested persons have been heard. Administrative Law Judge LauraSue Schlatter is assigned to conduct the hearing. Judge Schlatter's Legal Assistant, Lisa Armstrong, can be reached at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 600 North Robert Street, P.O. Box 64620, Saint Paul, Minnesota 55164-0620, telephone (651) 361-7888, and fax (651) 539-0310, or *lisa.armstrong@state.mn.us*.

Hearing Procedure. If the Department holds a hearing, you and all interested or affected persons, including representatives of associations or other interested groups, will have an opportunity to participate. You may present your views either orally at the hearing or in writing at any time before the hearing record closes. All evidence presented should relate to the proposed rules. You may also submit written material to the Administrative Law Judge to be recorded in the hearing record for five working days after the public hearing ends. At the hearing the Administrative Law Judge may order that this five-day comment period is extended for a longer period but not more than 20 calendar days. Following the comment period, there is a five-working-day rebuttal period when the agency and any interested person may respond in writing to any new information submitted. No one may submit new evidence during the five-day rebuttal period.

All post-hearing comments and responses must be submitted to the Administrative Law Judge no later than 4:30 p.m. on the due date. The Office of Administrative Hearings strongly encourages all person submitting comments and responses to do so by way of the Office of Administrative Hearings' Rulemaking eComments website at *https://minnesotaoah.granicusideas.com/discussions*. If it is not possible to use the eComments website, post-hearing comments may be submitting in person, via United States mail, or by facsimile addressed to Judge Schlatter at the address or facsimile numbers listed in the section above.

All comments or responses received will be available for review at the Office of Administrative Hearings' eComments website and at the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry or on the agency's website at: *http://www.dli.state.mn.us/about-department/rulemaking/rulemaking-docket-minnesota-rules-chapter-1341*.

This rule hearing procedure is governed by *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2000 to 1400.2240, and *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. You may direct questions about the procedure to the Administrative Law Judge.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. The statement of need and reasonableness summarizes the justification for the proposed rules, including a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules and an estimate of the probable cost of the proposed rules. It is now available from the agency contact person. You may review or obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person. Lobbyist Registration. *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A, requires each lobbyist to register with the State Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board. Adoption Procedure if No Hearing. If no hearing is required, the agency may adopt the rules after the end of the comment period. The Department will submit the rules and supporting documents to the Office of Administrative Hearings for a legal review. You may ask to be notified of the date the rules are submitted to the office. If you want either to

receive notice of this, to receive a copy of the adopted rules, or to register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the agency contact person listed above.

Adoption Procedure after a Hearing. If a hearing is held, after the close of the hearing record, the Administrative Law Judge will issue a report on the proposed rules. The proposed rules are to correct formatting and content errors in the equation that is a simplified method of calculating the net pressure of wind loads applied to the surface of a building. The proposed rules also add the method to convert the values from ultimate wind design to allowable stress design. There are no substantive changes to the rule part because the proposed rules correct an existing equation and add an additional calculation method.

The statutory authority to adopt the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 326B.02, subdivision 5, 326B.101, and 326B.106. A copy of the proposed rules is published in the State Register and attached to this notice as mailed. Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Education requests comments on its possible amendment to and repeal of rules governing the K-12 academic standards in science. Minnesota has K-12 academic standards in several content areas, including science. Academic standards and the supporting benchmarks are important because they identify the knowledge and skills that all students must achieve by the end of a grade level. Standards also help define course credit requirements for graduation and serve as a guide for schools and districts for local curriculum adoption, development and improvement. Student mastery of the academic standards is generally measured through state and local assessments. For the content area of Science, students are assessed using the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCAs) in grades five, eight and at the high school level in biology.

The possible K-12 academic standards in science will replace the state's current K-12 academic standards in science. The existing K-12 academic standards in science were last revised in the 2008-2009 school year and adopted in 2010. The department is proposing rule amendments to the existing K-12 academic science standards to reflect changes in science knowledge and understanding about effective science education for all students. The department has formed a Science Standards Review Committee selected from a group of qualified applicants. This committee has assisted in drafting the proposed K-12 academic standards in science. The Science Standards Drafting Committee has proposed rule language that fits the needs of Minnesota's students and support the goals of Minnesota's science education community. One of the major changes to the proposed rules is the move from grade banded standards to anchor standards that apply to grades K-12. More information about the work of the committee and the guiding assumptions and foundations the committee used in drafting the proposed rules are available on the **department's academic standards in science web-page - https://education.mn.gov/MDE/dse/stds/sci/**.

Persons Affected. The amendment to and repeal of the existing rules would likely affect science teachers, science curriculum specialists, students and parents.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 120B.02, subdivision 1 and 120B.021, subdivision 3 requires the department to adopt rules for the content area of science and to review and revise these rules and the supporting benchmarks beginning in the 2018-19 academic year.

Public Comment.
