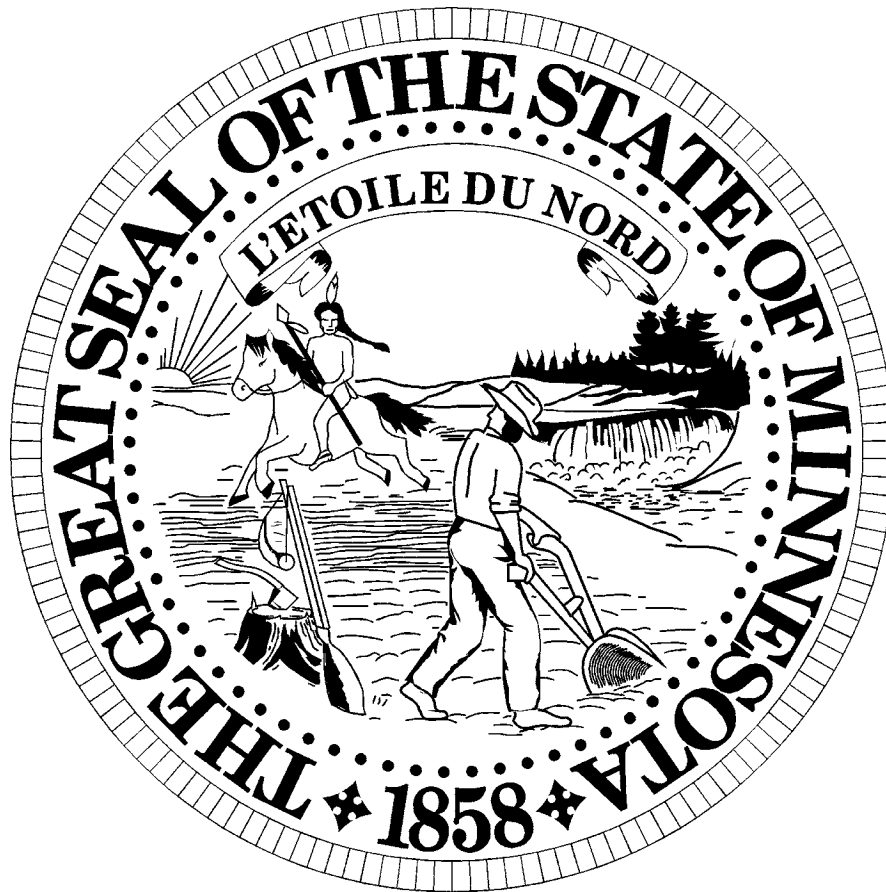

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NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Emergency Executive Order 21-15: Modifying Emergency Executive Order 20-42 and Continuing to Protect Eligibility for Essential Human Services Programs

I, **Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota**, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, issue the following Executive Order:

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to present an unprecedented and rapidly evolving challenge to our State. Minnesota has taken extraordinary steps to prevent and respond to the pandemic.

On March 13, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-01 and declared a peacetime emergency because this pandemic, an act of nature, threatens the lives of Minnesotans, and local resources are inadequate to address the threat. Since declaring the peacetime emergency, I have extended it every 30 days.

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused many Minnesotans to suffer economic hardship as the result of job loss, reduction in hours of employment, and a reduction in available employment opportunities. In Executive Order 20-42, I ordered that when determining eligibility for programs administered by the Minnesota Department of Human Services (“DHS”), payments to eligible individuals and families made under the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”), as well as payments made by state, local, and tribal government entities to relieve the adverse economic impact caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, must not be counted as income, assets, personal property, or resources, subject to any necessary approval.

In Executive Order 21-03, I ordered that, when determining eligibility for programs administered by DHS, payments to eligible individuals and families made under the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (“CAA”), as well as Pandemic Unemployment Assistance payments made to high school students under the CARES Act and extended by the CAA must not be counted as income, assets, personal property, or resources, subject to any necessary approval.

To provide additional economic security, the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (“ARPA”) enacted on March 11, 2021, authorized relief in the form of stimulus payments of up to \$1,400 per eligible individual, advance payments of the child tax credit, emergency rental assistance payments, homeowner assistance funds, and pandemic relief payments for tribal members. Emergency rental assistance payments were also authorized under the CAA but were not originally included in Executive Order 21-03. Under the ARPA, as under the CAA and the CARES Act, these relief payments are not counted as income for federally funded assistance programs. Under current state law and as noted in Executive Order 20-42, receipt of federal, tribal, state, county, or local government COVID-19 relief payments may make individuals ineligible for certain human services programs administered by DHS. Counting the receipt of certain federal, tribal, state, county, or local government payments provided for COVID-19 relief as income, assets, personal property, or resources when determining eligibility for human services programs administered by DHS would endanger the public health and cause severe hardship to Minnesotans who need these programs at this difficult time.

In Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 12.02, the Minnesota Legislature conferred upon the Governor emergency powers to “(1) ensure that preparations of this state will be adequate to deal with disasters, (2) generally protect the public peace, health, and safety, and (3) preserve the lives and property of the people of the state.” Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 12.21, subdivision 1, the Governor has general authority to control the state’s emergency

management as well as carry out the provisions of the Minnesota Emergency Management Act. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 12.21, subdivision 3(1), the Governor may “make, amend, and rescind the necessary orders and rules to carry out the provisions” of the Minnesota Emergency Management Act. When approved by the Executive Council and filed in the Office of the Secretary of State, such orders and rules have the force and effect of law during the pendency of a peacetime emergency. Any inconsistent rules or ordinances of any agency or political subdivision of the state are suspended during the pendency of the emergency.

For these reasons, I order as follows:

1. Paragraph 1 of Executive Order 20-42, as amended by Executive Order 21-03, is further amended to add the following sub-paragraphs g, h, i, j, and k (indicated by underlined text):
 - g. Federal stimulus payments of up to \$1,400 to eligible individuals authorized under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.
 - h. Advance payments of the child tax credit authorized under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.
 - i. Emergency rental assistance payments authorized under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Division N, Title V, Subtitle A, section 501, and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, section 3201, subject to any necessary federal approval.
 - j. Homeowner assistance funds authorized under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, section 3206, subject to any necessary federal approval.
 - k. Payments issued to tribal members to relieve the adverse economic impact caused by the COVID-19 pandemic authorized under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, sections 11002 and 11003, subject to any necessary federal approval.
2. All other provisions of Executive Orders 20-42 and 21-03 remain in full force and effect.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 4.035, subdivision 2, and section 12.32, this Executive Order is effective immediately upon approval by the Executive Council. It remains in effect until the peacetime emergency declared in Executive Order 20-01 is terminated or until it is rescinded by proper authority.

A determination that any provision of this Executive Order is invalid will not affect the enforceability of any other provision of this Executive Order. Rather, the invalid provision will be modified to the extent necessary so that it is enforceable.

Emergency Executive Order 21-16: Rescinding Emergency Executive Orders 20-03, 20-25, 20-41, 20-57, and 20-102; Amending Emergency Executive Order 20-82

I, **Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota**, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, issue the following Executive Order:

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to present an unprecedented and rapidly evolving challenge to our State. Since I first declared a peacetime emergency in response to this pandemic, my administration has taken proactive measures using the authority granted by the Legislature to the Governor under the Minnesota Emergency Management Act, Minnesota Statutes 2020, Chapter 12. We have used that authority to take bold actions to protect our friends and neighbors from contracting COVID-19, build hospital capacity, secure critical care and personal protective equipment for healthcare providers, launch an aggressive testing strategy, and implement an effective and efficient vaccine delivery system. These actions have slowed the spread of the virus and have saved lives. It is important for us to assess the continued need for existing executive orders. In this Executive Order, I am rescinding executive orders that are no longer necessary.

On March 16, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-03, providing the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs (“MDVA”) the authority to restrict visitation at Minnesota Veterans Homes of all visitors and non-essential health care personnel. Executive Order 20-03 was an important first step in protecting our veterans, and those who care for them, from contracting COVID-19. With the introduction of safe and effective vaccines to Minnesota, we can celebrate that over 97 percent of the residents and over 81 percent of the staff of Minnesota Veterans Homes have been vaccinated. Our collective action and the successful prioritization of vulnerable communities for vaccination has mitigated the risk of contracting COVID-19 in these congregate living facilities. For these reasons, MDVA no longer needs the authority to restrict visitation. Executive Order 20-03 is no longer necessary and can be rescinded.

On March 31, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-25, permitting the Department of Public Safety to suspend continuing education requirements for peace officers and to extend the license renewal requirements for firefighters, detectives, and protective agents. We took this action to ensure that essential workers could continue to provide services needed to maintain public safety and that help was immediately available for those who needed it during the COVID-19 pandemic. Since issuing Executive Order 20-25, most peace officers have completed their continuing education requirements, and firefighters, detectives, and protective agents have either completed their licensing or do not need renewal extensions. For these reasons, Executive Order 20-25 is no longer necessary and can be rescinded.

On April 23, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-41, authorizing the Minnesota Department of Education (“MDE”) to extend the distance learning period to the remainder of the 2019-2020 school calendar year. Executive Order 20-41 authorized school districts and charter schools to transfer operating funds from programs that were not already assigned to or encumbered by staff salary and benefits, or otherwise encumbered by federal law, to help cover additional costs incurred for nutrition services, community education programs, and technology supports for underserved students. Because the 2019-2020 school year has passed and distance learning in the current school year has been authorized under subsequent executive orders, Executive Order 20-41 is no longer necessary and can be rescinded.

On May 14, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-57, authorizing MDE to provide public school districts and charter schools the option to offer summer learning through a hybrid model of distance learning and in-school learning, or to continue distance learning, during the 2020 summer school session. Because the 2020 summer school session has passed and distance and hybrid learning has been authorized under subsequent executive orders, Executive Order 20-57 is no longer necessary and can be rescinded.

On December 14, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-102, amending Executive Order 20-05 and allowing the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (“DEED”) an extended timeframe to calculate employers’ experience ratings from December 15, 2020 to January 30, 2021. This action allowed DEED to focus on providing financial relief to Minnesotans during the pandemic, and it allowed time for DEED to work with the Legislature to enact a broader solution. DEED worked collaboratively with the Legislature to codify important changes to protect Minnesota businesses and our unemployment system in Minnesota Laws 2021, Chapter 2, Section 2. Due to

this recent legislation, Executive Order 20-102 is no longer necessary and can be rescinded.

For these reasons, I order as follows:

1. Executive Order 20-03 is rescinded.
2. Executive Order 20-25 is rescinded.
3. Executive Order 20-41 is rescinded.
4. Executive Order 20-57 is rescinded.
5. Executive Order 20-102 is rescinded. All other provisions of Executive Order 20-05, as amended by Executive Order 20-29, remain in effect.
6. Effective immediately, paragraph 15 of Executive Order 20-82 is amended by the following additions (indicated by underlined text) and deletions (indicated by strikethrough):
 15. ~~Pursuant to paragraph 17 of Executive Order 20-57~~, I direct the Commissioner, in consultation with the Commissioner of Health, to continue to update guidance for in-person learning, hybrid-learning, and distance learning during the 2020-21 school year to protect the health and safety of students, their families, school staff, or the public.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 4.035, subdivision 2, and section 12.32, this Executive Order is effective immediately upon approval by the Executive Council.

A determination that any provision of this Executive Order is invalid will not affect the enforceability of any other provision of this Executive Order. Rather, the invalid provision will be modified to the extent necessary so that it is enforceable.

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Board of Dentistry requests comments on its proposed amendments to rules creating a more user-friendly guide listing all the different types of standard licensure or registration options in dentistry. Each standard licensure or registration option will be consistent throughout making for easy reading and interpretation. Moreover, each standard licensure or registration option lists other relevant information like renewal, reinstatement, and professional development. The proposed rules also focus on achieving a major housekeeping throughout by streamlining, eliminating all non-relevant requests, and updating areas.

Persons Affected. The amendments to the rules would affect dentists, dental therapists, dental hygienists, and licensed dental assistants.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 150A.04, subdivision 5, authorizes the Board to adopt rules to carry out and make effective the provisions and purposes of sections 150A.01 to 150A.12, in accordance with Chapter 14.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information to the Board's contact person listed below on these possible rules in writing until 4:30p.m. on May 28, 2021. The contact person shall direct all comments to the Board's Executive Committee for review. Any open meetings held by the Board's Executive Committee will be properly announced to the public prior to the meeting.

Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) Notice of Public Hearing by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development with Respect to a Proposed Project and the Provision of Funds from the Minnesota Job Creation Fund Program under Minnesota Statutes 116J.8748

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (“DEED”) will conduct a public hearing on Friday, April 9, 2021 at 1:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as reasonable via teleconference on a proposal to provide funding through the Minnesota Job Creation Fund Program pursuant to authority granted under *Minnesota Statutes* 116J.8748 and *Minnesota Rules* Chapter 4301. This hearing is conducted in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes* 116J.994, Subd. 5.

The Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development has determined that an in-person meeting is not practical because of the current health pandemic and ongoing peacetime emergency declared under Chapter 12 of Minnesota Statutes. As is permitted under the Open Meeting Law in these conditions, this public hearing to consider a potential Job Creation Fund (JCF) award and rebate to Boston Scientific Corporation for an expansion project in Arden Hills, Minnesota will be conducted via teleconference.

Description of Project and Proposed JCF Funding:

Boston Scientific Corporation may expand in Arden Hills (Ramsey County), Minnesota. The company is a worldwide developer, manufacturer and marketer of medical devices. The Arden Hills location is the primary site for the manufacturing of battery components for the company’s cardiac rhythm and neuromodulation devices. The proposed project would consist of adding 17,450 sf to an existing building on the Arden Hills campus in order to expand production capacity, as well as site improvements and the purchase of machinery and equipment related to the expansion. The total project cost is \$20,000,000. The company expects to create 150 jobs within three (3) years at an average cash wage of \$26.20 per hour. All jobs will qualify for a job creation award. The project is eligible for a job creation award of up to \$850,000, which may be reduced depending on the project’s final program evaluation score.

Every six months, the Minnesota Department of Health reviews the list of analytes available for accreditation and publishes revisions to the list. The department revises the list based on recommendations from the state and federal agencies utilizing the environmental laboratory accreditation program. Minnesota Department of Health Division of Environmental Health REQUEST FOR COMMENTS for Possible Amendments to Rules Governing Residential Lead Abatement, *Minnesota Rules*, Part 4761.2510; Revisor's ID Number R-4694

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Health requests comments on its possible amendments to rules governing residential lead abatement. The Department is considering rule amendments that lower the dust-lead hazard standards (DLHS) and dust-lead clearance standards (DLCL) from 40 micrograms of per square foot ($\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$) to 10 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for floors, and from 250 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ to 100 $\mu\text{g}/\text{ft}^2$ for window sills. These changes are consistent with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) final rule 84 FR 32632, effective January 6, 2020 (<https://www.federalregister.gov/documents/2019/07/09/2019-14024/review-of-the-dust-lead-hazard-standards-and-the-definition-of-lead-based-paint>) and final rule 86 FR 983, effective March 8, 2021 (<https://www.federalregister.gov/d/2020-28565>).

The DLHS is used to identify when a lead hazard is present in a property affected by the residential lead abatement rules. The DLCL is used for determining when a project is free of lead hazards after an abatement activity is complete. The EPA's original DLHS and DLCL standards, which are identical to the current Department residential lead abatement standards, were developed in 2001. Medical and scientific knowledge of lead exposure has evolved over the last 20 years and now indicates that lead poses risks (particularly to children) at lower blood levels than previously understood. The EPA published the DLHS and DLCL changes to update these outdated standards and provide a greater degree of protection against childhood lead exposure. The Department is seeking to do the same.

As time allows, the Department may also consider revisions to the list of "documented methodologies" for conducting regulated lead work in Minn. R. 4761.2000, subp. 15. Further, the Department may consider other amendments that come up, but only as time permits. States that administer residential lead abatement programs funded by EPA must update their rules within two years of the effective date of the final EPA DLHS and DLCL rules, so the Department expects this rule change to move quickly.

Official Notices

Persons Affected. The amendments to the rules would likely affect lead-based paint activities, accredited training programs, engineering services, lead or dust sampling technicians, other lead abatement professionals who must be certified to conduct lead-based paint activities, or rehabilitations or maintenance activities conducted in properties affected by the residential lead abatement rules (i.e., certain residential properties, schools, child-occupied facilities, and play areas). Testing laboratories that are recognized by EPA's National Lead Laboratory Accreditation Program may also be affected. Finally, this change would impact tenants, property owners, and managers of residential buildings and dwellings, schools, child-occupied facilities, and certain child play areas.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 144.9508, subdivisions 1 and 2, authorize the Department to adopt rules for regulated lead work standards and for lead in paint, dust, drinking water, and soil in a manner that protects public health and the environment for all residences, including residences also used for a commercial purpose, childcare facilities, playgrounds, and schools.

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Department intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Department will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The Department may appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 temporarily increases the SNAP benefits by raising maximum allotments from January 1st to September 30th, 2021. The MFIP Transitional Standard and cash and food portions temporarily in effect from January 1st, 2021 to September 30th, 2021 are listed below.
