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# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

## NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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# Proclamations

# PROCLAMATION FOR SPECIAL SESSION 2020

- WHEREAS: The Ninety-First Legislature adjourned its regular session on May 17, 2020; and
- WHEREAS: I called the Legislature into special sessions in June and July, 2020, the Legislature adjourned both of those special sessions, and the Legislature is not currently in session; and
- WHEREAS: The COVID-19 pandemic continues to threaten Minnesotans and burden our State's resources; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Constitution allows the Governor to call a special session of the Legislature on extraordinary occasions; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.31, subdivision 2(b), provides that, if the Governor determines a need to extend a peacetime emergency beyond 30 days and the Legislature is not sitting in session, the Governor must issue a call immediately convening both houses of the Legislature; and
- WHEREAS: An extraordinary occasion, as envisioned by the Minnesota Constitution, has arisen, and it is necessary to extend the COVID-19 Peacetime Emergency originally declared on March 13, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, by the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section 12 of the Minnesota Constitution and Sections 4.03 and 12.31 of the Minnesota Statutes, summon the members of the Legislature to convene in a Third Special Session on Wednesday, August 12, 2020 at 12:00 p.m. at the State Capitol in Saint Paul, Minnesota.

## Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Request for Public Comment on Proposal to Return Five Watercourses to Public Waters Inventory

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is seeking public comments on its proposal to correct errors in the Public Waters Inventory (PWI) by returning four watercourses in Renville County and one in Polk County to the PWI. The PWI identifies which waters are regulated by the DNR for the public's benefit.

The DNR has determined that these five watercourses have characteristics of a natural stream and meet the statutory definition of a public water as an altered or natural watercourse having a total drainage area greater than two square miles. As public waters, these watercourses have been and will remain subject to all applicable public waters regulations, regardless of whether they are included in the PWI. These watercourses are subject to regulation as public waters and should be identified on the PWI. Public water regulations include a requirement to secure public waters work permits for some activities within the watercourse and compliance with the buffer law.

In April of 2017, 640 miles of watercourses in 70 counties were removed from the PWI through a DNR Commissioner's Order. The changes were a result of the DNR buffer mapping project, which revealed that some watercourses were not clearly identified as public waters at the time of the original inventory. Part of the 2017 Commissioner's Order stated, "The DNR may review the subject watercourses for possible inclusion in the PWI in the future, subject to requisite public comment opportunity prior to any additions to the PWI."

The DNR will respond to comments as part of developing the decision document and order. The order will be mailed to all commenters, affected landowners and county officials. Public notification of the decision will also be made through media outlets.

The Minnesota Department of Revenue requests proposals from non-profit organizations that qualify under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to receive grants to coordinate, facilitate, encourage, and provide volunteer taxpayer assistance services. Organizations applying for this grant must be registered with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as part of the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) or Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs.
