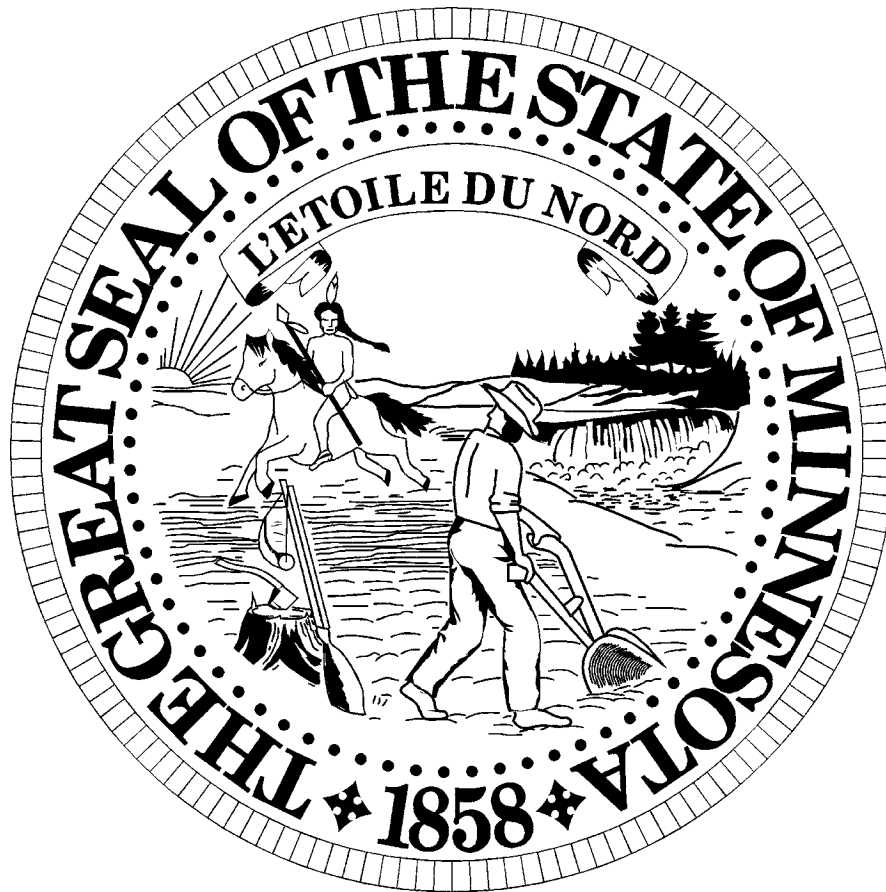

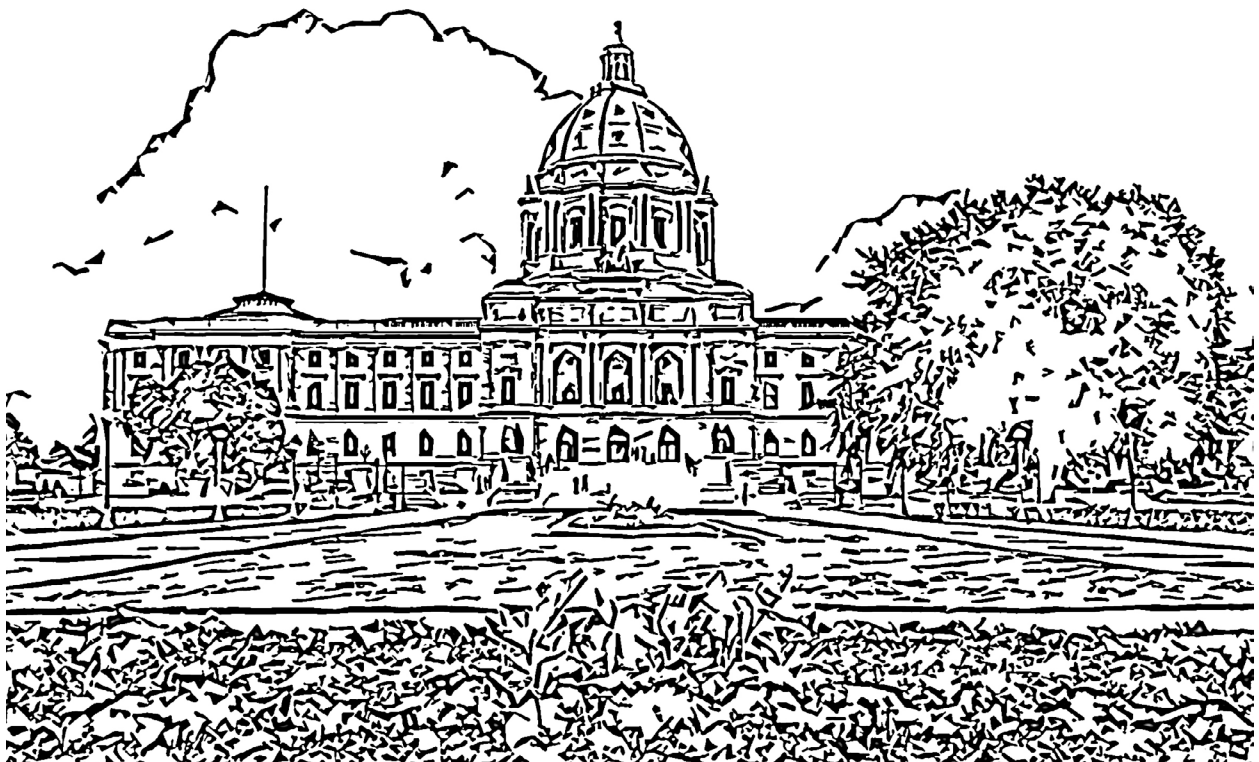

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

Adopted Permanent Rules Regulating the Board of High Pressure Piping

The rules proposed and published at State Register, Volume 47, Number 17, pages 385-390, October 24, 2022 (47 SR 385), are adopted as proposed.

Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Subp. 6a. **Individuals with temporary permit.** An individual with a temporary permit from the Board of Behavioral Health and Therapy may provide chemical dependency treatment services according to the conditions in either item A or B.

B. The individual is supervised by a clinical supervisor approved by the Board of Behavioral Health and Therapy. The supervision must be documented and meet the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, section ~~148C.044~~ 148F.04, subdivision 4.

Subp. 7. **Individuals exempt from licensure.** For an alcohol and drug counselor exempt from licensure under Minnesota Statutes, chapter ~~148C~~ 148F, the department must consider a counselor qualified according to subpart 5, item A, if:

A. the individual has at least a baccalaureate degree including 480 hours of alcohol and drug education in which each of the core functions in Minnesota Statutes, chapter ~~148C~~ 148F, is covered; and has successfully completed 880 hours of supervised experience as an alcohol and drug counselor, either as a student or as an employee;

B. the individual has documented the successful completion of 270 clock hours of alcohol and drug counselor training, 60 hours of which have occurred within the last five years, including completion of 880 hours of supervised experience as an alcohol and drug counselor, either as a student or as an employee. The training must cover the core functions in Minnesota Statutes, chapter ~~148C~~ 148F; or

Subp. 8. **Overnight staff.** The personnel file of overnight staff employed by a residential program must include ~~the documentation of the requirements in subpart 2 and~~ documentation of the individual's competency in the areas in items A to D:

Subp. 9. **Student interns.** A qualified staff person must supervise and be responsible for all treatment services performed by student interns and must review and sign all assessments, progress notes, and treatment plans prepared by an intern. Student interns must ~~meet the requirements in subpart 2, item B,~~ and receive the orientation and training required for permanent staff members.

9530.6565 STAFF QUALIFICATIONS.

Subpart 1. **Qualifications for all staff who have direct client contact.** All staff who have direct client contact must be at least 18 years of age and must, at the time of hiring, document that they meet the requirements in item A or B.

A. Program directors, supervisors, nurses, assessors, and any other persons who have direct client contact must be free of chemical use problems for at least two years immediately preceding hiring and must sign a statement attesting to that fact.

B. Technicians must be free of chemical use problems for at least six months immediately prior to their hiring and must sign a statement attesting to that fact.

9530.6570 PERSONNEL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES.

Subpart 1. **Policy requirements.** A license holder must have written personnel policies and must make them available to staff members at all times. The personnel policies must:

D. describe behavior that constitutes grounds for disciplinary action, suspension, or dismissal, including policies that address chemical use problems and meet the requirements of part 9530.6565, subparts 1 and 2. (1) receiving treatment for chemical use or substance use disorder within the period specified for the position in the staff qualification requirements;

(2) chemical use that has a negative impact on the staff member's job performance;

(3) chemical use that affects the credibility of treatment services with clients, referral sources, or other members of the community; and

(4) symptoms of intoxication or withdrawal on the job;

D. describe the process for disciplinary action, suspension, or dismissal of a staff person for violating the drug and alcohol policy described in Minnesota Statutes, section 245A.04, subdivision 1, paragraph (c);

Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Taking Bats Under Federal Incidental Take Permit

Notice is hereby given that the above-entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subdivision 13(b). The statutory authority for the content of the rules is *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 84.027, subdivision 13(a)(l) to allow taking of wild animals to protect a species and to prevent or control wildlife disease, together with the Commissioner's authority in *Minnesota Statutes* section 97A.045, subd. 1(a) to do all things necessary to preserve, protect, and propagate desirable species of wild animals; *Minnesota Statutes* section 97A.045, subd. 11 to undertake action necessary to prevent or control a wildlife disease; and *Minnesota Statutes* section 97A.025 to retain ownership of the wild animals of the state in the state's sovereign capacity for the benefit of all the people of the state.

The following conditions do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459.

The rule allows taking of three species of bat that would otherwise be protected under state game and fish laws: northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), little brown bat (*Myotis lucifugus*), and tricolored bat (*Perimyotis subflavus*). Each of these species has experienced rapid population decline due to white nose syndrome (WNS), a fungal disease. The disease has no known treatment or control method. As a result, northern long-eared bat is proposed for November 2022 up-listing to endangered under the federal Endangered Species Act (ESA), and little brown bat and tricolored bat are likely to be federally listed soon as well. Measures to conserve these species are urgently needed.

In response, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, collectively referred to as the State DNRs, developed the Lake States Forest Management Bat Habitat Conservation Plan (Bat HCP) to provide long-term benefits to these bat species and their habitats through forest management activities that may also result in incidental taking of the species. The Bat HCP will result in issuance of a federal incidental take permit (ITP) pursuant to section 10(a)(1)(B) of the federal ESA. The Bat HCP addresses sustainable forest management practices, prescribed fire, bat roost protection, hibernacula protection and maintenance, and bat conservation outreach.

A component of the Bat HCP conservation strategy is providing a Landowner Enrollment Program (LEP) that allows the State DNRs to extend their federal take authorization (through a Certificate of Inclusion) to eligible landowners, who implement bat conservation measures on enrolled lands. The LEP provides crucial conservation benefits because most Minnesota forests across the Bat HCP area are in county, municipal, tribal, and private ownership. The State DNRs manage only a portion (17% overall) of the forested lands across the three states. Enrollment will provide limited take authorization to these landowners in exchange for their commitment to implement applicable conservation measures in the Bat HCP. This will encourage sustainable forest management on the landscape among non-state land owners in the region.

Expedited Emergency Rules

Under Minnesota law, these bat species are not currently listed as endangered or threatened (*Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.0895) and are instead considered protected wild animals under the game and fish laws (*Minnesota Statutes*, section 97A.015, subd. 39). As such, any take, even when done as part of a

covered activity under the LEP, could be considered a violation of state law. This rule is therefore necessary to implement the LEP and achieve the sustainable forest management practices described above, and to best combat the spread of WNS by applying a uniform approach to state and federal bat conservation. The Minnesota DNR will simultaneously pursue state legislative changes to provide permanent authority to take protected wild animals when done pursuant to a federal incidental take permit. The Minnesota DNR expects that the federal listings and ITP permit will be implemented before such legislation could be enacted.

Subp. 10. Taking bats under federal incidental take permit. Northern long-eared bats, little brown bats, and tricolored bats may be taken by landowners conducting activities covered under a federal incidental take permit issued under section 10(a)(1)(B) of the federal Endangered Species Act, including landowners whose activities are covered under a certificate of inclusion issued by the commissioner under Code of Federal Regulations, title 50, section 13.25(e).

State Grants & Loans

In addition to requests by state agencies for technical/professional services (published in the State Contracts Section), the *State Register* also publishes notices about grants and loans available through any agency or branch of state government. 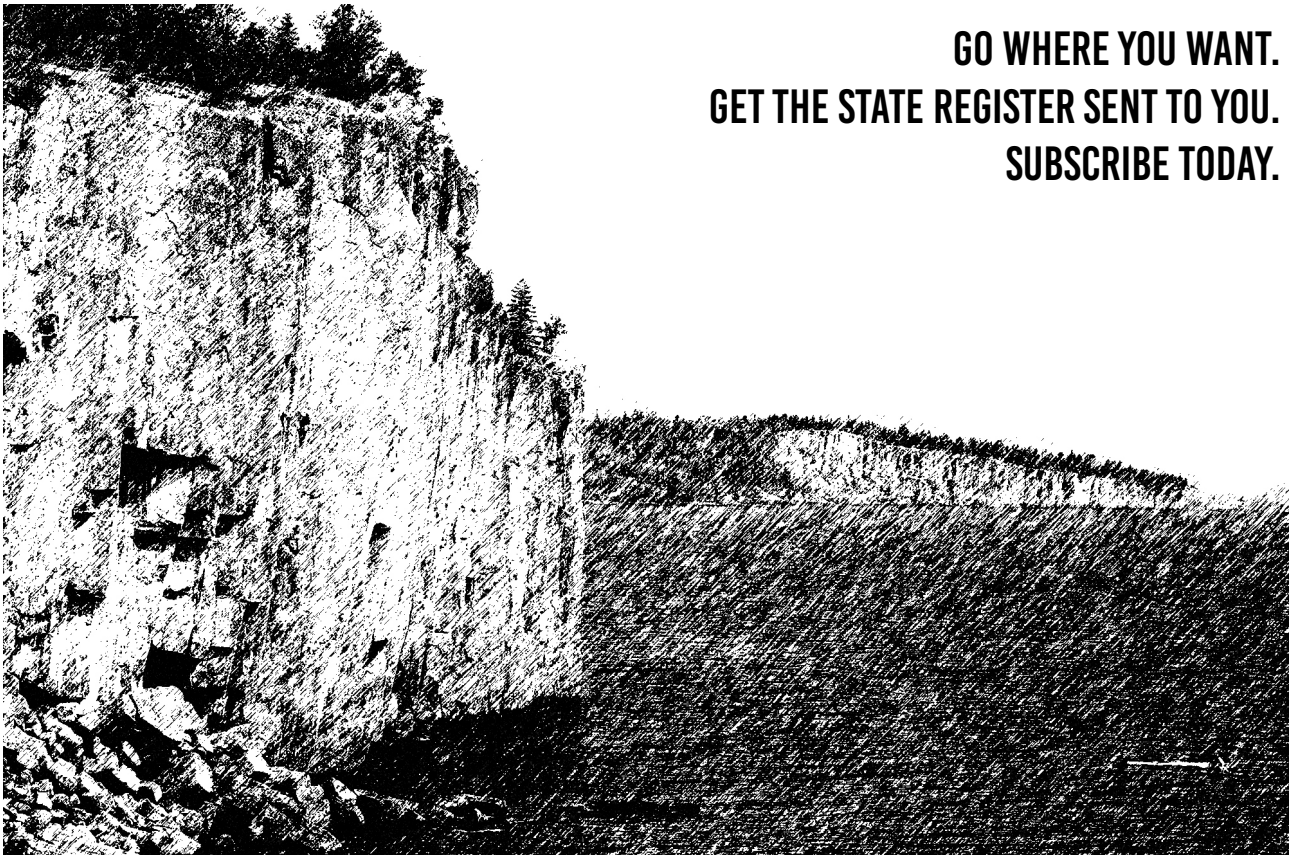
