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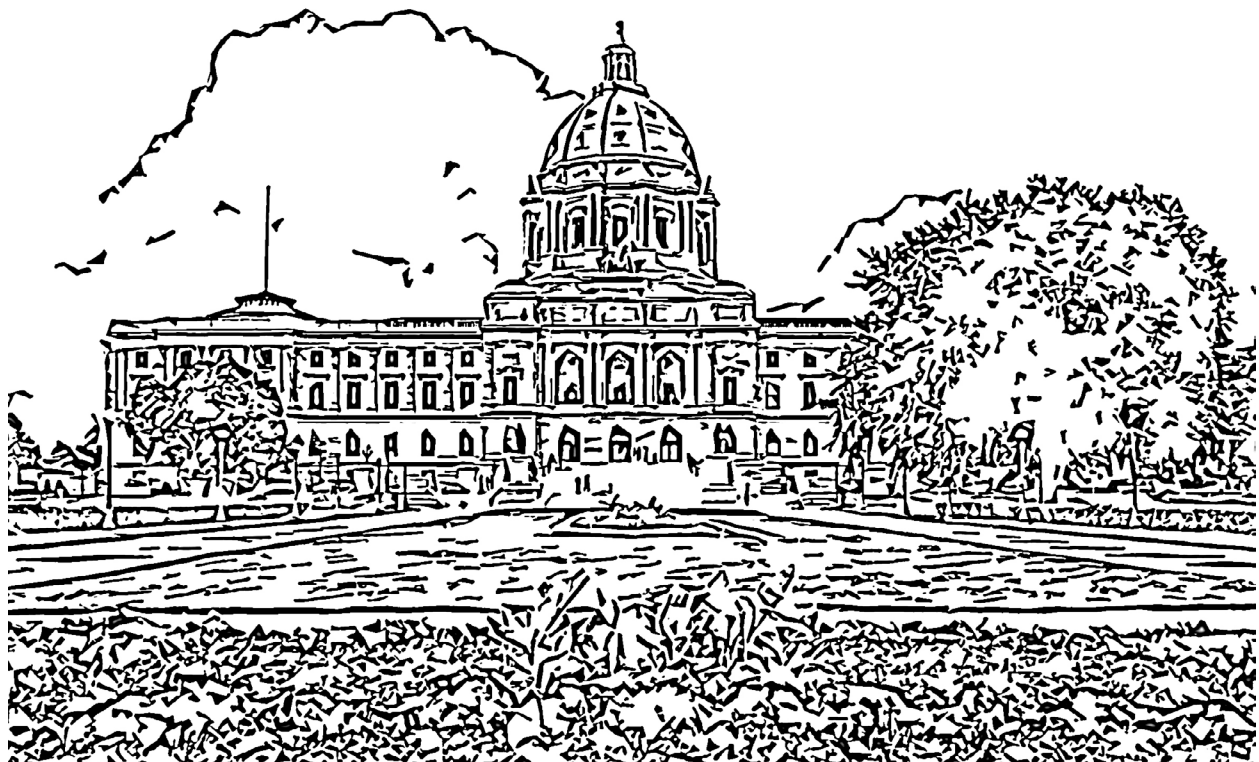
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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Expedited Emergency Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited emergency rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for emergency rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the emergency conditions. Expedited emergency rules are effective upon publication in the *State Register*, and may be effective up to seven days before publication under certain emergency conditions.

Expedited emergency rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited emergency rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Mille Lacs Lake Fishing

Notice is hereby given that the above-entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.045, subds. 1 through 3; 97C.005, subd. 3; and 97C.401.

The conditions that do not allow compliance with *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459 and require use of the Commissioner's expedited emergency rule authority set forth in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 84.027, subd. 13a are as follows:

1. Each year a harvestable surplus is set for walleye in Mille Lacs Lake pursuant to the procedures set forth in the 1996 Stipulated Settlement and Federal Consent Decree adopted by the Minnesota Federal District Court in 1997 settling *Minnesota v. Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa*, 526 U.S. 172 (1999). The harvestable surplus is the volume of fish that can be harvested safely from Mille Lacs Lake while ensuring sufficient remaining walleye in the lake for a healthy fishery. The harvestable surplus is then divided between the State of Minnesota and the eight Chippewa Tribal Bands that were signatories of the 1837 Treaty, including the Mille Lacs Band, Fond Du Lac Band, and six Wisconsin Bands of Chippewa (Bands). The state share of the harvestable surplus is determined in January of each year, and modeling of viable regulations and gathering public input is not completed until March. The harvestable surplus for 2023 is 175,000 pounds and the state's share of the harvestable surplus is 100,300 pounds.
2. Walleye angling regulations are generally designed to maximize sustainable fishing opportunities while remaining within the state's share of the harvestable surplus. When possible, this includes providing some opportunity for harvest, while minimizing the likelihood of an unplanned closure of the fishery should the state approach taking its share of the harvestable surplus prior to the end of the season. Specific regulations are developed using applicable biological data, including the previous year's angler harvest, hooking mortality estimates, and walleye population status.
3. On a recurring annual basis, there is not enough time between the steps necessary to develop the recommended fishing regulation and the beginning of the open water angling season to set angling regulations following Minn. Stat. section 14.05 through 14.36 governing the adoption of state rules.
4. Management of northern pike, yellow perch, cisco, and burbot follow the same timeline and collaborative approach with the Bands as walleye management. Therefore, the same time constraints exist for setting angling regulations for northern pike, yellow perch, cisco, and burbot.

Expedited Emergency Rules

6264.0400 DESIGNATED SPECIAL MANAGEMENT WATERS.

[For text of subparts 1 to 3, see Minnesota Rules]

Subp. 4. Mille Lacs Lake and associated tributaries special management regulations.

A. This item applies while a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries. The angling season for northern pike begins at 12:01 a.m. May 13, 2023, and continues to 11:59 p.m. on March 31, 2024. The daily and possession limit for northern pike is three. All northern pike in possession must be less than 24 30 inches in length or greater than 36 inches in length. All northern pike that are 24 to 36 30 inches or greater in length, inclusive, must be immediately returned to the water. A person's possession limit may not include more than one northern pike over 36 inches in length.

B. The possession limit for smallmouth bass is one. This item applies while a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries. Unless otherwise authorized by special permits for fishing tournaments, the angling season for largemouth and smallmouth bass begins at 12:01 a.m. May 13, 2023, and continues to 11:59 p.m. February 25, 2024. All largemouth and smallmouth bass caught before the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend must be immediately returned to the water. Beginning at 12:01 a.m. September 11, 2023, all smallmouth bass must be immediately returned to the water. Except as otherwise provided in this subpart, the daily and possession limit for largemouth and smallmouth bass in aggregate is three. All largemouth and smallmouth bass in possession must be 21 inches or greater less than 17 inches in length. All largemouth and smallmouth bass less than 21 inches 17 inches or greater in length must be immediately returned to the water. Waiver of the size, possession, and season restrictions for largemouth and smallmouth bass under this item is permitted for a limited number of bass-fishing tournaments each year. When determining whether to grant a waiver for a tournament, the commissioner must consider:

- (1) tournament size;
- (2) expected participation;
- (3) potential to generate public interest and local economic activity; and
- (4) conservation and biological health of the fishery.

C. Except as provided in items D and E, this item applies for night fishing on Mille Lacs Lake. Mille Lacs Lake is closed to the taking of fish between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. daily during the period commencing beginning at 10 p.m. on the Monday following the Saturday two weeks prior to the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend May 15, 2023, and ending at 12:01 a.m. on Monday, four weeks after the date of commencement 6:00 a.m. September 1, 2023. During the closure, no person shall be on the waters of Mille Lacs Lake while having in possession any equipment whereby fish may be taken. Spearfishing is prohibited from December 1 through April 30. A person may not have a spear in possession while on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake during this period. Beginning September 2, 2023, at 12:01 a.m., Mille Lacs Lake is closed to taking fish between the hours of 12:01 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. daily until 11:59 p.m. November 30, 2023, at which time the ban on night fishing is lifted.

D. Beginning June 3, 2023, at 10:00 p.m., Mille Lacs Lake is open to fishing for muskellunge and northern pike between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. daily. Angling for, harvesting, and possessing species other than muskellunge and northern pike during these hours is prohibited. Only artificial muskellunge and northern pike lures greater than eight inches in length, measured from the front of the eye of the lure to the end of the trailing hook, or sucker minnows greater than eight inches in length may be used or in possession.

E. Beginning June 3, 2023, at 10:00 p.m., Mille Lacs Lake is open to bowfishing for rough fish between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. daily. A person must not have any angling equipment in possession while bowfishing under this item. Angling for, harvesting, and possessing species other than rough fish while bowfishing during these hours is prohibited.

D. F. The commissioner may modify seasons and limits under Minnesota Statutes, section 84.027, subdivision 13, or sections 97A.0451 to 97A.0459, to accommodate tribal declarations for fish harvest in the 1837 Ceded Territory in

compliance with the court ruling in Mille Lacs Band of Chippewa v. Minnesota, 119 S.Ct. 1187 (1999). Changes shall be posted at water access sites and the Department of Natural Resources website.

E. G. While a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries, the possession and daily limit for Northern cisco (tullibee) is ~~ten~~ five fish.

H. This item applies while a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries. Beginning at 12:01 a.m. May 13, 2023, the daily and possession limit for walleye is one fish, which must be either between 21 and 23 inches in length or over 28 inches in length. All walleye less than 21 inches in length or greater than 23 inches but less than 28 inches in length must be immediately returned to the water. This item is effective until 11:59 p.m. February 25, 2024.

I. While a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries, angling for burbot is catch and release only. All burbot must be immediately returned to the water.

F. J. While a person is on or fishing in Mille Lacs Lake or its associated tributaries to the posted boundaries, fish that are taken by angling and not immediately released into the water after capture are considered to be in possession and part of the bag limit. Once a fish has been reduced to possession, culling or live-well sorting (the act of exchanging one fish for another) is not allowed, except that culling or live-well sorting before meeting a bag limit of fish reduced to possession is allowed for largemouth and smallmouth bass.

G. K. Unless otherwise specified, this subpart applies to the following waters.

Adopted Expedited Emergency Game and Fish Rules: Upper Red Lake Fishing

Notice is hereby given that the above entitled rules have been adopted through the process prescribed by Minn. Stat. § 84.027, subd. 13(b). This rule is adopted pursuant to the authority set forth in Minn. Stat. § 97C.00S authorizing the commissioner to set seasons and limits and Minn. Stat. § 97C.401 requiring the commissioner to set walleye limits. This rule is adopted as an emergency rule pursuant to the commissioner's authority set forth in Minn. Stat. § 84.027, subd. 13(b) authorizing the commissioner to use expedited emergency rulemaking authority in a timeframe that does not allow compliance with the rulemaking provisions of Minn. Stat. Ch. 14 or the expedited emergency rulemaking procedures set forth in Minn. Stat. §§ 97A.0451 to 97A.0459.

The conditions that do not allow compliance with Minn. Stat. Ch. 14 and Minn. Stat. §§ 97A.0451 to 97A.0459 are as follows:

1. As a result of the joint efforts of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and the Red Lake Band of Chippewa (Red Lake Band), the Red Lake walleye fishery has recovered after near collapse in the mid-1990s. Since the fishery's recovery, the DNR, Red Lake Band, and the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs have jointly developed a harvest plan for Upper Red Lake and its tributaries in accordance with the requirements of their 1999 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), as most recently revised in 2019.
2. The MOU states that both the DNR and the Red Lake Band agree to maintain walleye harvest levels within an annual Target Harvest Range and avoid exceeding an associated Harvest Cap. Walleye possession and size limits for state anglers must be adjusted in accordance with the MOU and harvest plan and cover the harvest year extending from December 1 through November 30.
3. In accordance with the harvest plan, the Target Harvest Range and Harvest Cap are set by the spawning stock biomass of walleye, estimated by fall gill netting conducted in state and tribal waters. On a recurring annual basis, there is not enough time between the conclusion of fall gill netting and the beginning of the winter angling season to set angling regulations following Minn. Stat. Ch. 14. Moreover, a midseason adjustment of open water angling regulations may be necessary to avoid reaching the harvest cap. Midseason adjustments are also incompatible with following the rulemaking process under Minn. Stat. Ch. 14.
4. At least five days prior to the effective date of changes to the fishing regulations as outlined herein, a notice will be posted on the DNR's website and at all public water access sites throughout Upper Red Lake and its tributaries.

6264.0400 DESIGNATED SPECIAL MANAGEMENT WATERS.

Subp. 59. Upper Red Lake and listed tributaries.

[For text of item A, see Minnesota Rules]

B. This item applies while a person is on or fishing in the waters listed under item C. The angling season for walleye begins May 13, 2023, at 12:01 a.m. and continues to February 25, 2024, at 11:59 p.m. The following daily and possession limits apply:

(1) the daily and possession limit for walleye is two fish, of which not more than one walleye shall be over 26 inches in length;

(2) all walleye in possession must be less than 17 inches or greater than 26 inches in length;

(3) all walleye that are 17 inches to 26 inches in length, inclusive, must be immediately returned to the water; and

(4) a person's statewide bag limit shall not include more than two walleye taken from Upper Red Lake and the tributaries listed under item C.

(1) beginning at 12:01 a.m. May 13, 2023, the daily and possession limit for walleye is five fish, of which not more than one walleye may be over 17 inches in length. This subitem is effective until 11:59 p.m. October 31, 2023; and

(2) beginning at 12:01 a.m. November 1, 2023, the daily and possession limit for walleye is four fish, of which not more than one walleye may be over 17 inches in length. This subitem is effective until 11:59 p.m. February 25, 2024.

REPEALER. The expedited emergency amendment to Minnesota Rules, part 6264.0400, subpart 59, published in the State Register, volume 46, page 1306, May 9, 2022, is repealed.

Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Office of the Governor

Executive Order 23-06: Rescinding Executive Order 21-25; Amending Executive Orders 22-16 and 23-03

I, **Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota**, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, issue the following Executive Order:

On July 15, 2021, I issued Executive Order 21-25, protecting Minnesotans from a range of unsafe and discredited therapeutic practices commonly known as “conversion therapy.” Executive Order 21-25 required collective work from state agencies to protect Minnesotans, particularly minors and vulnerable adults, from these practices, which have been rejected by every leading scientific, medical, and educational association. Executive Order 21-25 recognized that everyone in Minnesota deserves protection from these practices.

When I signed Executive Order 21-25, I called on the Legislature to implement a comprehensive ban on conversion therapy in Minnesota. Today I was proud to sign a bill into law that prohibits conversion therapy. Because Minnesota Laws 2023, Chapter 28, prohibits conversion therapy in Minnesota, Executive Order 21-25 is no longer necessary.

On June 25, 2022, I issued Executive Order 22-16, clarifying that, in the wake of the United States Supreme Court’s decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health Organization*, reproductive freedom remained a right in Minnesota. Executive Order 22-16 states that Minnesota is committed to protecting access to reproductive health care services. In addition to requiring state agency actions, Executive Order 22-16 also explained that, to the maximum extent possible, I would exercise my discretion and decline requests to extradite individuals accused of crimes related to seeking, securing, or providing reproductive health care services.

When I signed Executive Order 22-16, I asked the Legislature to make Minnesota’s constitutional right to reproductive freedom law. Earlier this year, I signed the PRO Act, which ensures that Minnesotans have the freedom to make their own health care decisions and protects Minnesotans’ rights to vital reproductive health care services. Today I was proud to sign a bill into law that further protects Minnesotans’ reproductive health care rights. Because Minnesota Laws 2023, Chapter 31, codifies the duties of the Governor in extradition matters relating to reproductive health care services, the part of Executive Order 22-16 related to extraditions is no longer necessary.

On March 8, 2023, I issued Executive Order 23-03, aiming to ensure that LGBTQIA+ Minnesotans could seek and receive gender affirming health care services. Executive Order 2303 makes clear that every person in Minnesota should feel valued, seen, heard, and respected. In addition to requiring state agency actions, Executive Order 23-03 also explained that, to the maximum extent possible, I would exercise my discretion and decline requests to extradite individuals accused of crimes related to seeking, securing, or providing gender affirming health care services.

When I signed Executive Order 23-03, I urged the Legislature to codify protections and help make all members of Minnesota’s LGBTQIA+ community feel safe and welcome. Today I was proud to sign a bill into law that expands Minnesota’s protections of gender affirming health care. Because Minnesota Laws 2023, Chapter 29, codifies the duties of the Governor in extradition matters relating to gender affirming health care services, the part of Executive Order 23-03 related to extraditions is no longer necessary.

For these reasons, I order as follows:

1. Executive Order 21-25 is rescinded.
2. Paragraph 4 of Executive Order 22-16 is rescinded. All other provisions of Executive Order 22-16 remain in full force and effect.
3. Paragraph 6 of Executive Order 23-03 is rescinded. All other provisions of Executive Order 23-03 remain in full force and effect.

This Executive Order is effective fifteen days after publication in the State Register and filing with the Secretary of State.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (“DEED”) will conduct a public hearing on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, at 1:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible at 180 East Fifth Street, 12th Floor, St. Paul, Minnesota 55101 on two (2) proposals to provide funding through the Minnesota Job Creation Fund Program (“JCF”) pursuant to authority granted under *Minnesota Statutes* 116J.8748 and *Minnesota Rules* Chapter 4301. This hearing is conducted in accordance with *Minnesota Statutes* 116J.994, Subd. 5.

Description of Projects and Proposed JCF Funding:

Spectro Alloys Corporation (NAICS 331314) is looking to expand in Rosemount (Dakota County), Minnesota.
