

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

Board of Architecture, Engineering, Land Surveying, Landscape Architecture, Geoscience, and Interior Design

Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Architect and Landscape Architect Licensure Requirements and Examination Requirements

The rules proposed and published at State Register, Volume 47, Number 45, pages 1059-1082, May 08, 2023 (47 SR 1059), are adopted with the following modifications:

1800.0200 CLASSES OF LICENSEES.

The classes of licensees consist of:

A. individuals who are licensed under Minnesota Statutes, section 326.10, subdivision 1, clause (2); and

1800.0600 CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

Certification of an applicant's technical qualifications by NCARB, NCEES, CLARB, or CIDQ may be accepted by the board as establishing such qualifications, and the applicant, in such instances, is not required to pass further examination.

1800.1000 EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE.

Subp. 6. Experience requirement.

- A. An applicant for licensure must present evidence of completion of the experience requirement. Qualifying credits for experience must be granted as described in subitems (1) and (2).
 - (2) Experience must comply with either:
- (a) the Architectural Experience Program Guidelines (AXP) published by (NCARB), May 2020, which is incorporated by reference, is available on the NCARB website, and is subject to frequent change; or

1800.1200 EXAMINATION.

Subpart 1. Architect Registration Examination.

B. An applicant is required to pass all sections of the ARE examination in order to qualify for licensure. The applicant shall attain the uniform passing grade established by the board through a psychometrically acceptable standard-setting procedure.

Adopted Rules

1800.1500 EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE.

- Subp. 4. Experience requirement. An applicant for licensure as a landscape architect shall present evidence of completion of the experience requirement in items A to D.
- B. An applicant must acquire qualifying experience after graduation from one of the education eurriculum curricula listed in subpart 3. The applicant must acquire qualifying experience under the direct supervision of a licensed landscape architect.

1800.2100 EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE.

Subp. 2. Education and experience requirement.

- A. To qualify for certification as a certified interior designer, an applicant must present evidence that the applicant has completed the education and experience requirements in this subpart.
- (2) Experience must be under the direct supervision of a certified interior designer, NCIDQ certificate holder, or licensed architect. Experience gained prior to June 1, 2013, may be under the direct supervision of an interior designer.
- (a) If the applicant meets the educational requirements of item A, subitem (1), units unit (a), (d), or (e), the experience required is completion of the Interior Design Experience Program (IDEP), as provided by CIDQ or its successor, or a minimum of two years of qualifying interior design experience.

The proceeds of the Obligations will be used to (i) finance the acquisition, construction, replacement, improvement, and equipping of the facilities described herein (collectively, the "Projects") which are owned by the Obligated Group Members described below; (ii) finance capitalized interest during the construction of the Projects, if necessary; (iii) pay required reserves, if necessary; and (iv) pay costs of issuance of the Obligations.

A portion of the proceeds of the Obligations in the estimated principal amount not to exceed \$400,000,000 will be used to finance the acquisition, construction, and equipping of a replacement of Lakeview Hospital with a new facility, located at 12239 62nd Street North, Stillwater, Minnesota, which is owned by Lakeview Memorial Hospital Association, Inc., a Minnesota nonprofit corporation.

A portion of the proceeds of the Obligations in the estimated principal amount not to exceed \$100,000,000 will be used to finance the acquisition, construction, and equipping of a replacement of HealthPartners Como Clinic, located at 2501 Como Avenue, Saint Paul, Minnesota, which is owned by Group Health Plan, Inc., a Minnesota nonprofit corporation.

A portion of the proceeds of the Obligations in the estimated principal amount not to exceed \$55,000,000 will be used to finance the acquisition, construction, and equipping of HealthPartners Specialty Center Woodbury, located at 233 Radio Drive, Woodbury, Minnesota, which is owned by Group Health Plan, Inc., a Minnesota nonprofit corporation.

A portion of the proceeds of the Obligations in the estimated principal amount not to exceed \$100,000,000 will be used to finance all or a portion of certain costs related to master facility projects including but not limited to the acquisition, construction, and equipping of improvements to Park Nicollet Methodist Hospital, located at 5050 Excelsior Boulevard, 6500 Excelsior Boulevard, 3931 Louisiana Avenue South, and 3525 Monterey Drive, St. Louis Park, Minnesota, which sites are owned by Park Nicollet Methodist Hospital, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation.

A portion of the proceeds of the Obligations in the estimated principal amount not to exceed \$100,000,000 will be used to finance all or a portion of certain costs related to master facility projects including but not limited to the acquisition, construction, and equipping of improvements to Park Nicollet Clinic, located at 3800 Park Nicollet Boulevard, 3850 Park Nicollet Boulevard, 3875 Park Nicollet Boulevard, 3900 Park Nicollet Boulevard, and 4951 Excelsior Boulevard, St. Louis Park, Minnesota, which sites are owned by PNMC Holdings, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation.

Following the public hearing, the Board will consider adoption of a resolution approving the issuance of the Obligations. The aggregate face amount of the Obligations proposed to be issued to finance the activities contemplated herein is presently estimated not to exceed \$755,000,000. A draft copy of the proposed application to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development for approval of the Projects, together with all attachments and exhibits required under the Act, shall be available for public inspection at the offices of the Board at 180 Fifth Street East, 12th Floor, Saint Paul, Minnesota, during normal business hours following the publication of this notice.

The Obligations will be issued by the Board and will constitute special, limited obligations of the Board payable solely from the revenues expressly pledged to the payment thereof, will not constitute a general or moral obligation of the Board, the State of Minnesota (the "State"), or any political subdivision thereof, and will not be secured by the taxing power of the Board, the State, or any political subdivision thereof or any assets or property of the Board, the State, or any political subdivision thereof except interests in the Projects that may be granted to the Board in conjunction with the financing.

All persons interested may appear and be heard at the time and place set forth above or may file written comments with the Executive Director of the Board prior to the date of the hearing set forth above.

Notice of Public Meeting Set for December 6, 2023, on Two Proposed Specialty Hospitals in Ramsey County, Minnesota

A public meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. on December 6, 2023, for MDH to obtain public feedback on the establishment of two new specialty hospitals to be located in Ramsey County (the cities of Roseville and Saint Paul, respectively).

- Nobis Rehabilitation Partners of Allen, Texas is seeking to open a freestanding 60-bed inpatient rehabilitation facility in Roseville, Minnesota to primarily serve the seven-county Twin Cities Metro Area.
- Regency Hospital, owned by Select Medical of Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, is seeking to open a second long-term acute care hospital on the Regions Hospital Campus in Saint Paul by relocating 26 hospital beds from an existing hospital in Golden Valley Minnesota.

During the meeting, the Minnesota Department of Health's (MDH) Division of Health Policy is inviting comments on the proposed new hospitals. The proposals and supplemental material can be found at: Hospital Public Interest Review - Minnesota Department of Health (state.mn.us).

This meeting is open to the public, and individuals and organizations potentially affected by the proposals are strongly encouraged to attend and share their views on the new hospitals. In addition to feedback from those who are impacted by the new hospitals, MDH is seeking feedback on:

- Whether the proposed new hospital is needed to provide timely access to care or access to new or improved services
- The financial and staffing impact of the new hospital on existing hospitals in the region
- The extent to which the new hospital will provide services to nonpaying or low-income patients relative to the level of services provided to these groups by existing hospitals in the region

Department of Labor & Industry (DLI)

Notice of Determination of Minimum Truck Rental Rates

The Commissioner of DLI has determined the minimum truck rental rates for state-funded highway projects. The truck rate is determined for each equipment type by adding the hourly average of the costs of operating the vehicle as submitted by survey respondents to the certified prevailing wage rate for the driver.

This year there was insufficient cost data submitted to DLI to determine a new hourly average cost of operating a vehicle. Cost data used in DLI's analysis must be representative of five trucking firms of various sizes and five independent truck owner operators for each type of truck. Therefore, last year's average operational cost has been carried forward and combined with this year's certified prevailing-wage rate for a driver to establish the minimum truck rental rate.

On **Dec. 11, 2023, at 10:00 a.m.**, the Department of Labor and Industry will conduct an informal conference pursuant to Minnesota Rules, part 5200.1105.
