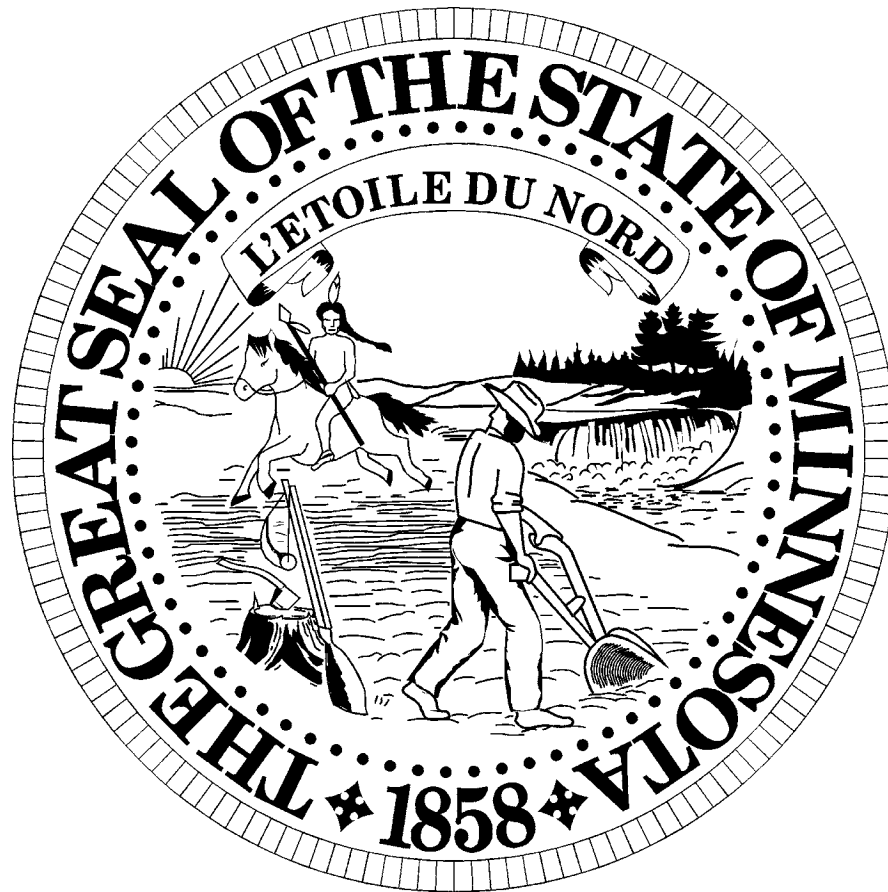

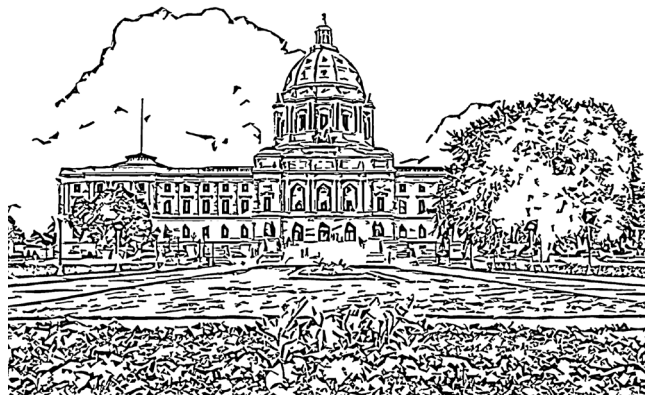

# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. # Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
- (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
- (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

**Subject of Rules.** The Minnesota Board of Accountancy requests comments on its possible amendment to rules governing examination credit requirements and continuing professional education late processing fees. The Board is

considering rule amendments to:

- change the Uniform CPA Examination section validity from 18 months to 36 months, in keeping with recommendations in the Uniform Accountancy Act to substantially extend the validity of exam credits;
- to cap late processing fees related to CPE to no more than the applicable accrued fee for the three-year CPE reporting cycle associated with the renewal that would reestablish an individual's license as "valid"; and
- make housekeeping modifications including plain language changes and removing obsolete language.

**Persons Affected.** The amendment to and repeal of the rules would likely affect applicants and licensees.

**Statutory Authority.** *Minnesota Statutes*, section 326A.02, subdivision 5 authorizes the Board to adopt rules "governing its administration and enforcement of this chapter and the conduct of licensees and persons registered under section 326A.06, paragraph (b)..."

**Public Comment.** Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing or orally until further notice is published in the *State Register* that the Board intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Board will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The Board does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

**Rules Drafts.** The Board has drafted the possible rules amendments.

**NOTE:** Comments received in response to this notice will not necessarily be included in the formal rulemaking record submitted to the administrative law judge if and when a proceeding to adopt rules is started. The agency is required to submit to the judge only those written comments received in response to the rules after they are proposed. If you submitted comments during the development of the rules and you want to ensure that the Administrative Law Judge reviews the comments, you should resubmit the comments after the rules are formally proposed.

## Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) Notice of Increase in Fertilizer Fee

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture, by Order dated October 23rd, 2023, is hereby giving notice that, pursuant to Minnesota Statute 18C.425, subdivision 6(e), the fertilizer inspection fee will be increased by \$.05 cents per ton, so that the new inspection fee is \$0.44 per ton beginning January 1, 2024.

The fertilizer inspection fee applies to each specialty fertilizer or soil and plant amendment registrant as well as fertilizer licensees unless they distribute fertilizer solely by custom application. The fertilizer inspection fee is paid on a per tonnage basis on the annual tonnage report due by July 31st of each year.

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is accepting comments on the current state emergency quarantine for emerald ash borer, *Agrilus planipennis* (Fairemaire), for Morrison County and the proposed formal quarantine to be implemented January 19, 2024.

## Minnesota Department of Health Notice of Reportable Data Items to Minnesota Cancer Reporting System

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to cancer registries, medical laboratories, hospitals, medical clinics, physicians, and dentists of the list of data items reported to Minnesota Cancer Reporting System (MCRS).

Minnesota Statute, chapter 144, section 144.672, subdivision 1, gives the Commissioner of Health authority to collect cancer incidence information, analyze the information, and conduct special studies designed to determine the potential public health significance of an increase in cancer incidence.

### MCRS Required Data Items for 2024

R= required, R\* = if available, RH = required to be reported for historic records within date range given, RH\* = if available, RS = Required, Site Specific, RS\* = if available, D = derived, DH = historically derived. Unless otherwise noted, staging and treatment data items are required on all cancers diagnosed in or after 1995.

#### Request for Comments on the Minnesota Prepaid Medical Assistance Project Plus Section 1115 Medicaid Demonstration Waiver Amendments

DHS is announcing a 30-day comment period on two proposed amendments to the Prepaid Medical Assistance Project Plus (PMAP+) Section 1115 Medicaid demonstration waiver.

The PMAP+ waiver was first approved by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services in July 1995. The PMAP+ waiver currently provides federal authority to:

- Cover children under Medical Assistance who are 12 to 23 months old with income eligibility above 275% and at or below 283% of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- Waive the federal requirement to redetermine the basis of Medical Assistance eligibility for caretaker adults with incomes at or below 133% of the FPL who assume responsibility and live with children age 18 who are not full-time secondary school students.
- Provide Medical Assistance benefits to pregnant people during the period of presumptive eligibility.

Effective January 2024, the federal SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act requires states to provide 12-months of continuous Medicaid coverage for children from birth to age 18, with some limited exceptions. The first PMAP+ amendment extends the number of months of continuous Minnesota Medicaid eligibility from 12- to 72-months for children up to age six and extends the 12-months of continuous Minnesota Medicaid eligibility to people age 19 and 20.

Effective January 2023, the federal SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act requires states to provide Medicaid coverage for people up to age 26, with some limited exceptions, if they were enrolled in Medicaid and receiving foster care services in another state when they turned age 18 and their birth date was on or after January 1, 2023. The second PMAP+ amendment provides the same Minnesota Medicaid coverage for people who turned age 18 before January 1, 2023. Minnesota has time-limited authority to cover this group related to the public health emergency. The PMAP+ authority would permit Medicaid coverage for this group through December 31, 2030, at which time all individuals in the group will have reached age 26. See Minnesota Statutes, section 256B.055, subd. 17.

#### REQUEST FOR COMMENTS for Planned New Rules Governing Currently Unavoidable Use Determinations about Products Containing Per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), Revisor’s ID Number R-4837

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is requesting comments on planned new rules for the MPCA’s determination of Currently Unavoidable Uses of PFAS in products. This rulemaking is referred to as the **PFAS in Products Currently Unavoidable Use Rule**. The main purpose of this rulemaking is to establish criteria and processes through which the MPCA will make decisions on what if any uses of intentionally added PFAS will qualify as currently unavoidable uses in products sold, offered for sale, or distributed in Minnesota. Any such determinations must be published by rule by the MPCA by January 1, 2032, as required by *Minnesota Statutes 116.943, subdivision 5(c)*.

Comments are requested from affected or interested parties. Comments should be submitted in writing as described in the **Comments** section below.

This Request for Comments is the MPCA's legal notice of its intent to begin rulemaking. This is an opportunity to provide information or comment on any relevant issues related to this rulemaking that we need to consider. For example, we recognize that the definition of "currently unavoidable use" in the law leaves terms such as "reasonably available" alternatives not fully defined. If you have input, information or data related to future MPCA determinations of "currently unavoidable use" of PFAS in products that you wish to share with us to inform our decisions, please submit that information. Draft rule language is not available at this time. We want your written comments on the ideas described under the **Subject of Rules** section.

Submitting your ideas and information at this early stage in rulemaking allows us more time to address issues that may come up and helps to ensure informed decision-making on our part. If the planned rules affect you in any way, the MPCA encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

**Statutory Authority.** Minnesota Statutes 116.943, subdivision 5©; and *Minnesota Statutes* 116.943, subdivision 9.

**Subject of Rules.** The MPCA requests comments on planned new rules governing determinations of currently unavoidable use of PFAS in products. Beginning January 1, 2032, products containing intentionally added PFAS which are sold, offered for sale, or distributed in the state are banned unless the MPCA determines by rule that the use(s) of PFAS they contain are currently unavoidable uses. [See *Minnesota Statutes 116.943* for the complete law.] Related subdivisions in the law include the following:

Several definitions in subdivision 1:

- (j) "Currently unavoidable use"
- (l) "Intentionally added"
- (n) "Manufacturer"
- "Perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances" or "PFAS"
- "Product"
- "Product component"

Prohibitions in subdivision 5(c):

(c) "Beginning January 1, 2032, a person may not sell, offer for sale, or distribute for sale in this state any product that contains intentionally added PFAS, unless the commissioner has determined by rule that the use of PFAS in the product is a currently unavoidable use. The commissioner may specify specific products or product categories for which the commissioner has determined the use of PFAS is a currently unavoidable use. The commissioner may not determine that the use of PFAS in a product is a currently unavoidable use if the product is listed in paragraph (a)." [Ban of certain products containing intentionally added PFAS as of January 1, 2025.]

Rulemaking authority in subdivision 9:

"The commissioner may adopt rules necessary to implement this section. *Section 14.125* does not apply to the commissioner's rulemaking authority under this section." Subdivision 9 gives authority to the MPCA commissioner to adopt rules necessary to implement the entirety of Minnesota Session Law – 2023, chapter 60, article 3, section 21. The MPCA reads this to provide authority to make any clarifications or define any processes necessary to implement the law, including the currently unavoidable use definition and the determination process.

The definitions in subdivision 1 listed above are a starting point of related terms possibly requiring clarification. You may believe that other terms should be defined or require additional clarification to make clear whether any products and product components sold by your organization, or its suppliers may be considered a currently unavoidable use of intentionally added PFAS. We invite you to submit comments and suggestions to that effect, with as much specificity and supporting information as you are able to share.

In developing the currently unavoidable use rule, the MPCA would appreciate comments on the following questions:

1. Should criteria be defined for “essential for health, safety, or the functioning of society”? If so, what should those criteria be?
2. Should costs of PFAS alternatives be considered in the definition of “reasonably available”? What is a “reasonable” cost threshold?
3. Should unique considerations be made for small businesses with regards to economic feasibility?
4. What criteria should be used to determine the safety of potential PFAS alternatives?
5. How long should PFAS currently unavoidable use determinations be good for? How should the length of the currently unavoidable use determination be decided. Should significant changes in available information about alternatives trigger a re-evaluation?
6. How should stakeholders request to have a PFAS use be considered for currently unavoidable use determination by the MPCA? Conversely, could stakeholders request a PFAS use not be determined to be currently unavoidable? What information should be submitted in support of such requests?
7. In order to get a sense of what type of and how many products may seek a currently unavoidable uses determination, please share what uses and products you may submit a request for in the future and briefly why. There will be a future opportunity to present your full argument and supporting information for a possible currently unavoidable uses determination.
8. Should MPCA make some initial currently unavoidable use determinations as part of this rulemaking using the proposed criteria?
9. Other questions or comments relating to defining currently unavoidable use criteria and the process MPCA uses to make currently unavoidable use determination.

**Parties Affected.** The new rule could affect any manufacturer of a product sold, offered for sale, or distributed in the state that contains intentionally added PFAS. The definition of manufacturer is provided in *subdivision 1(n)*:

““Manufacturer” means the person that creates or produces a product or whose brand name is affixed to the product. In the case of a product imported into the United States, manufacturer includes the importer or first domestic distributor of the product if the person that manufactured or assembled the product or whose brand name is affixed to the product does not have a presence in the United States.”

Manufacturers may be located in Minnesota or anywhere outside the State, as long as their product containing intentionally added PFAS is being sold , offered for sale, or distributing a product (or product component) in the state by a person.

Note that in some cases manufacturer may include people or entities not typically thought of as manufacturers, such as retailers which have their brand name or a private label brand name, they own affixed to products. Manufacturer does not include any person who sells, offers for sale, or distributes in Minnesota:

- Products for which federal law governs the presence of PFAS in the product in a manner that preempts state authority;
- A product regulated under section 325F.072 (firefighting foam) or 325F.075 (food packaging);
- A used product; or
- Products which contain a pesticidal or soil amending ingredient regulated by and reported to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture, unless the commissioner of agriculture approves the action.

While subdivision 8 of the law also exempts them from prohibitions and testing and certificate of compliance requirements, “manufacturers” of prosthetic or orthotic devices or any products that are medical devices or drugs or that are otherwise used in a medical setting or in medical applications regulated by the United States Food and Drug Administration are not exempted from information submittal requirements.

**Subject of Rules.** The Office of the Secretary of State requests comments on its possible amendments to rules governing the address confidentiality program of the Office, known as "Safe at Home." The Office is considering rule amendments that relate to the Safe at Home Division generally, including but not limited to amendments to reflect statutory changes made in recent years as well as: the manner, format, content and procedures relating to applications to become a program participant; the requirements for, term of, renewal of, or withdrawal of, certification as a program participant; the use of the designated address and the use or restrictions upon the use of the actual address of the participant; service of process upon program participants; the effect of reaching age of majority upon program participants who are minors; changes in program participant information on file at the address confidentiality program or failure to notify the program of changes in that information; the transferring of school records of program participants; and application assistant certification and requirements, as well as other address confidentiality program related rule provisions that may arise but only as time permits, as well as changes suggested by the recipients of this request for comments, or the general public.

**Persons Affected.** The amendment to the rules would likely affect program participants, government offices, private businesses, landlords, law enforcement, and the general public.

**Statutory Authority.** *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 5B.03, subd. 3 and 5B.08, authorize the Office to adopt rules for the administration of the program generally and to establish a renewal procedure.

**Public Comment.** Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until 4:30 p.m. on February 16, 2024. The Office of Secretary of State does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

The Office of Secretary of State is also interested in whether local governments might be required to adopt or amend an ordinance or other regulation to implement these rules and therefore requests that local governments provide us with relevant information about their ordinances.

The Office of the Secretary of State also requests comments about the "cumulative effect of the rule with other federal and state regulations," as required by *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.131(8) or whether the cost of complying with the rule in the first year after the rule takes effect will exceed \$25,000 for one small city or business under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.127.

### Request for Proposals for 2023 Ice Arena Grant Program – Information and Guidelines

#### GENERAL INFORMATION

The State of Minnesota, acting through its agency, the Minnesota Amateur Sports Commission (MASC), is seeking proposals from interested communities to improve ice arenas. Minnesota communities will be eligible to be awarded grants for improving indoor air quality in ice arenas or eliminating R-22 refrigerant.

Grant applications must come from a local government unit (LGU), a political subdivision of the State. The LGU will be the fiscal agent for the grant funds and will execute the application form and resolution. Other entities can be the owner and/or operator of the ice arena, thus the beneficiary of the grant award. The grants are for reimbursement of costs for completed projects.

The MASC reserves the right to cancel or amend this solicitation if it is considered to be in its best interest.

#### LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Applicants should note the specific statutory authority found in *Minnesota Statutes Section 240A.09*, as amended in 2020.

#### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS & EXCLUSIONS

- Replacement of ice-making systems in existing public facilities that use R-22 as a refrigerant with systems that use an alternative non-ozone-depleting refrigerant; OR
- Indoor air quality improvements:
  - “Indoor air quality improvements,” is defined in Minnesota Statute 240A.09 as the renovation or replacement of heating, ventilating, and air conditioning systems in existing indoor ice arenas whose ice resurfacing and ice edging equipment are not powered by electricity in order to reduce concentrations of carbon monoxide and nitrogen dioxide. The new or renovated systems may include continuous electronic air monitoring devices to automatically activate the ventilation systems when the concentration of carbon monoxide or nitrogen dioxide reaches a predetermined level.

# State Grants & Loans

- Proposals that come from more than one local government unit (LGU).

## GRANT TYPES

There are three types of grants to assist Minnesota communities in:

1. Eliminating R-22 refrigerant for direct systems;
2. Eliminating R-22 refrigerant for indirect systems; and
3. Improving indoor air quality.

The result of a successful grant shall be to establish and improve ice arenas capable of hosting competition and training in ice sports in addition to hockey; as well as maximize the community's ability to generate economic benefits by promoting ice sports programming for females and males.

## GOALS

MASC will give priority to projects who address and support the following goals:

1. Encourage communities and organizations to work in partnership to develop and operate ice arenas.
