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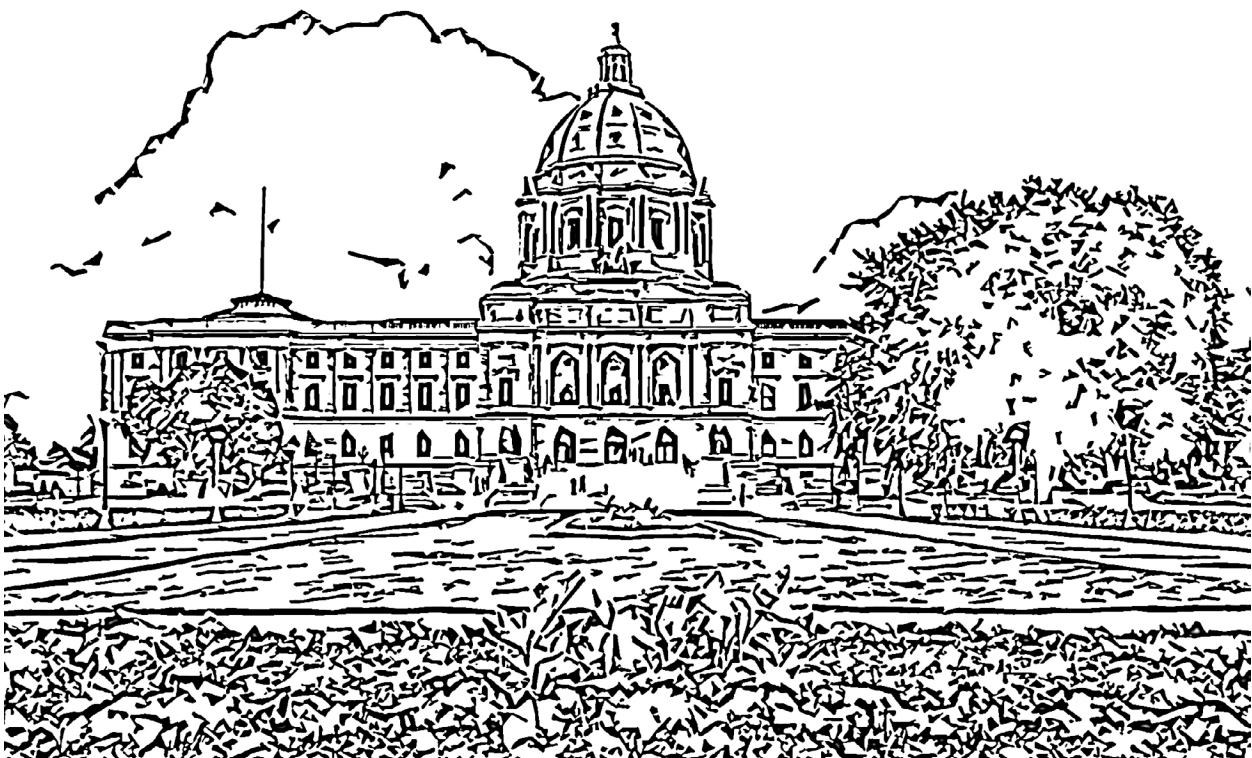

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Official Notices

Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101, an agency must first solicit comments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

The *State Register* also publishes other official notices of state agencies and non-state agencies, including notices of meetings and matters of public interest.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS for Possible Rules Governing Earned Sick and Safe Time, *Minnesota Rules*, 5200.1200; Revisor's ID Number R-04877

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry requests comments on its possible adoption of rules governing Earned Sick and Safe Time ("ESST"). The Department is considering rules that would carry out the purposes of the ESST law in Minnesota pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, sections 177.50 and 181.9445 to 181.9448. ESST is paid leave that employers covered by the law must provide to defined employees that can be used for certain reasons, including when an employee is sick, to care for a sick family member or to seek assistance if an employee or their family member has experienced domestic abuse, sexual assault or stalking.

Persons Affected. The rules would affect employers and employees in Minnesota.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 177.50, subd. 6, authorizes the Department to adopt "rules to carry out the purposes of this section and sections 181.9445 to 181.9448."

Public Comment. The Department is publishing a second request for comments to seek information and comments from interested persons or groups regarding the draft ESST rules available via link below. In particular, the Department is interested in any comments regarding:

1. Whether the cost of complying with any particular rule will exceed \$25,000 in the first year the rule is effective for a business or non-profit with less than 50 full-time employees or a statutory or home rule charter city with less than ten full-time employees;
2. Whether any particular rule might require a local government to adopt or amend an ordinance or other regulation;
3. An assessment of the cumulative effect of the rule with other federal and state regulations related to the specific purpose of the rule; and
4. Whether there are less costly methods or less intrusive methods for achieving the purpose of any particular rule.

Interested persons or groups may submit information or comments on these possible rules until 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, April 2, 2025. Comments must be submitted in writing, to the Agency contact person at the email address below. Comments should identify the portion of the rules addressed and the reason for the comment. Important: Submitted comments are available to the public upon request. Please only submit information that you wish to make available publicly.

Rules Drafts. The Department will consider comments submitted in this comment period to assist in further rule development. A draft of the possible rules can be found *here*.

The agency is required to submit to the judge only those written comments received in response to the rules after they are proposed. If you submitted comments during the development of the rules and you want to ensure that the Administrative Law Judge reviews the comments, you should resubmit the comments after the rules are formally proposed.

Minnesota State Lottery

Request for Comments on Possible Amendment to Rules Relating to Lost and Stolen Lottery Tickets, Minnesota Rules, 7856; Revisor ID Number R-04925

Subject of Rules. The Minnesota State Lottery (the “Lottery”) requests comments on possible rule amendments that govern the financial responsibility for the theft or loss of unsold Lottery tickets and other related matters. Lottery retailers sell scratch tickets on consignment and are charged when a pack of tickets is sold. *See* Minn. R. 7856.7060. There is ambiguity in the existing rules regarding whether Lottery retailers are *financially* responsible when unsold tickets are lost or stolen. *See* Minn. R. 7856.7040 and 7050. Currently, when tickets are reported lost or stolen by a retailer prior to sale, the Lottery deactivates the tickets, investigates the theft, and often does not charge the retailer. *Id.* This amendment to the rules will clarify the circumstances in which retailers are charged to increase predictability for current and prospective retailers.

Persons Affected. Whether the risk of loss for unsold tickets falls on the Lottery or on the retailer impacts retailer profitability, and therefore impacts Lottery beneficiaries. Amendments to the rules would affect current Lottery retailers, prospective Lottery retailers, and Lottery beneficiaries.

Statutory Authority. *Minnesota Statutes*, section 349A.05 authorizes the Lottery to adopt rules “governing the . . . procedures needed to ensure the integrity and security of the lottery.”

Public Comment. Interested persons or groups may submit comments or information on these possible rules in writing until further notice is published in the State Register that the Lottery intends to adopt or to withdraw the rules. The Lottery will not publish a notice of intent to adopt the rules until more than 60 days have elapsed from the date of this request for comments. The Lottery does not plan to appoint an advisory committee to comment on the possible rules.

Rules Drafts. The Lottery has not yet drafted the possible rules amendments. The Lottery does not anticipate that a draft of the rules amendments will be available before the publication of the proposed rules.

Public Data. Comments submitted during formal rulemaking proceedings are public government data. This means that anyone can request to see the information. The Minnesota Government Data Practices Act prohibits sharing private data about a third party without the third party’s permission. Please only submit comments that include personal information about yourself if you are comfortable with your comments being classified as public data.

Formal Rulemaking Record. Comments received in response to this notice will not necessarily be included in the formal rulemaking record submitted to the administrative law judge if a proceeding to adopt rules is started. The agency must submit to the judge only those written comments received in response to the rules after they are proposed. If you submitted comments during the development of the rules and you want to ensure that the administrative law judge reviews your comments, resubmit the comments after the rules are formally proposed.

Minnesota Racing Commission Request for Proposals for Racehorse Aftercare Grant

PROJECT NAME: Racehorse Aftercare Grant

DETAILS: The Minnesota Department of Minnesota Racing Commission, is requesting proposals for the purpose of providing aftercare for racehorses. The Minnesota Racing Commission is soliciting proposals from possible grantees for grant funds for facilities that provide racehorse aftercare. Any organization that intends to submit a grant application must notify the Commission of its intent to do so by April 15, 2025.

Definition of Aftercare: Aftercare is the care, retraining, and rehoming of a racehorse once the horse leaves the racetrack. An aftercare organization is an organization whose mission is provide rehabilitation, retraining, sanctuary and/or adoption of a racehorse. The organization adopts out horses using a set of criteria to ensure the best possible home is chosen for the transitioning racehorse, performs a background check of the individual, boarding facility (if applicable), and references. The organization has a rehoming policy succession plan, disaster preparedness plan, and other policies.

Definition of Eligibility: An applicant must provide aftercare for eligible horses. Eligible horses are defined as Thoroughbred, Standardbred, and Quarter Horses who are Minnesota-bred and Minnesota-raced race horses of any breed, age, or status, as well as broodmares enrolled in the Minnesota Breeders' Trust.

Thank you for your interest in applying for racehorse aftercare funds provided by the Minnesota Racing Commission (MRC). The MRC is dedicated to preserving and protecting the quality of life of racehorses once their racing careers have ended and assisting with finding a safe and productive post-racing career. The MRC allocates all racing-related to money from fines to a special revenue fund dedicated exclusively to the aftercare of a retired racehorse. There is also some funding available from the Advanced Deposit Wagering (ADW) Breeders Fund fees account. The limited funds available dictate that the MRC reserve these funds for horses that have participated at racetracks in Minnesota or horses registered in the Minnesota Bred Breeders Fund program.

Work is anticipated to start after August 2025.

Minnesota Lottery Request for Proposals for Minnesota State Lottery Sponsorship Agreements

Description of Opportunity

The Minnesota State Lottery ("Lottery") develops sponsorship agreements throughout the year with organizations, events, and sports teams to create excitement for lottery players, to interest new players and increase the visibility of lottery games. The Lottery encourages and continually seeks new sponsorship agreements to help achieve current Lottery marketing goals.

The Minnesota Lottery finds sponsorship opportunities in two ways. First, the Minnesota Lottery marketing staff locates and approaches potential sponsors to negotiate directly. Second, the Minnesota Lottery accepts incoming potential sponsors through this proposal process. Employing both strategies allows the Minnesota Lottery to find the best sponsorship opportunities, including opportunities that are not already known by staff. Both strategies are evaluated using the same criteria.

If you feel your organization, event, sports team, or other opportunity is a good fit for the Minnesota Lottery to sponsor, we encourage you to prepare and submit a proposal.

State Contracts

Proposal Content

A sponsorship proposal presented to the Lottery should meet the following three criteria:

1. Maximize Lottery Visibility - the event, sports team, or venue sponsorship proposal should draw a large number of attendees (typically 20,000 or more) whose demographics match the Lottery's target audience. The Lottery is interested in effectively delivering its message of fun and entertainment to Minnesota adults, ages 25-64, with a household income of \$75,000+ and an educational background of some college or higher. The Lottery does not market to those under the age of 18, and events with large numbers of children present are generally not accepted. Attendance numbers, on-site signage availability, sales and engagement opportunities, and media exposure are critical components that will be evaluated in the proposal. List and define all assets, value, and benefits that the Lottery would receive as part of the sponsorship, such as PR inclusions, social media posts, prize support, promotional activities, and signage.
2. Enhance Lottery Image - the event, sports team, or venue should be a reputable, safe, and well-run event and organization that enhances the Lottery's brand. The Lottery's presence should fit well within the lineup of other sponsors and participants. The Lottery is interested in sponsorships that can promote Lottery products, either via on-site sales from a Lottery booth, from sales-generating promotions with Lottery retailers, or from joint programs with the sponsor's media or other sponsorship partners.
3. Provide Promotional Extensions - the event, sports team, or venue proposal should offer exciting, value-added ways to interact with attendees and have opportunities to motivate attendees, listeners, and viewers to participate in and purchase Lottery games. The proposal must include staffing support, or other considerations to help the Lottery implement any appropriate promotional extension ideas.
