

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Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
 - (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
 - (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Expedited Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for normal rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the conditions. Expedited rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before

publication under certain conditions.

Expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific Minnesota Statute citations accompanying these expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Adopted Expedited Rules: Electronic Licensing System

The rules proposed and published at State Register, Volume 49, Number 21, pages 534-548, November 18, 2024 (49 SR 534), are adopted with the following modifications:

EFFECTIVE DATE. The amendments to Minnesota Rules, parts 6100.5002, 6213.0100, 6213.0400, 6213.0500, 6232.0200, 6232.0300, 6232.0400, 6232.0500, 6232.0900, 6232.1250, 6232.1300, 6232.1600, 6232.1950, 6232.1970, 6232.1980, 6232.2550, 6232.2800, 6232.3100, 6232.4400, 6234.1600, 6234.1700, 6234.2000, 6234.2600, 6236.0300, 6236.0500, 6236.0950, 6237.0200, 6262.1000, 6262.3200, 6264.0400, and 6266.0700, and the repealer are effective upon full implementation of the replacement electronic license system. The commissioner of natural resources must notify the revisor of statutes when the replacement electronic license system is fully implemented.

Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, Article V, and in Minnesota Statutes § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the State Register as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the State Register and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

Office of the Governor

Emergency Executive Order 25-06: Declaring a Peacetime Emergency and to Provide **Storm Recovery Assistance in Beltrami County**

I, Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, issue the following executive order:

On Saturday, June 21, 2025, Beltrami County experienced a severe storm that included top windspeeds of approximately 120 miles per hour - the equivalent of a Category Three hurricane. The severe weather displaced approximately one hundred people, damaged many buildings, knocked out power for thousands of people, caused gas leaks, and downed hundreds of thousands of trees throughout Beltrami County.

Executive Orders

On June 23, 2025, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners declared a state of emergency due to the storm damage. Conditions from the storm continue to endanger life and property in Beltrami County and local resources are inadequate to address the threat. On June 26, 2025, Beltrami County requested additional state resources to respond to the emergency. The Department of Public Safety's Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management ("HSEM") continues to work with local governments and organizations to support the response to the conditions caused by this emergency.

For these reasons, I declare a peacetime emergency pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 12.31 and order as follows:

- 1. HSEM will continue to support the coordination of onsite resources and assistance to affected local governments and determine the need for supplemental emergency assistance.
- 2. All relevant state agencies will provide the assistance necessary to help local units of government respond to and recover from this emergency.

This Executive Order and declaration of peacetime emergency are effective immediately under Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 4.035, subd. 2. The peacetime emergency declared in this Executive Order expires in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 12.31, subd. 2.

A determination that any provision of this Executive Order is invalid will not affect the enforceability of any other provision of this Executive Order. Rather, the invalid provision will be modified to the extent necessary so that it is enforceable.

Background

The draft FFY2026 Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) State Plan describes how federal LIHEAP funds will be used to help low-income households reduce their energy burdens. Commerce uses comments received at the public hearing and during the comment period to develop the final state plan.

Submit Comments

Please share your comments about the FFY2026 State Plan and about Minnesota's Energy Assistance Program (EAP). We are especially interested in these topics.

- What part of applying for Energy Assistance is most difficult? If you could change one thing about the application process, what would it be?
- Are Energy Assistance applications readily available in your community? What is the easiest way to get one? What is one thing that would make getting an application easier?
- Minnesota's Energy Assistance Program plans to transfer approximately 10% of its FFY26 award to the Weatherization program, which is similar to the amount transferred over the past several years. This amount may need to be reduced if federal funding is cut. Please comment on any impacts that this change may have.

• Income Eligibility Guidelines changes – In response to future federal funding uncertainty, EAP must plan for potential funding cuts. Any cuts would require the program to adjust the income eligibility guidelines to accommodate less funding to process applications and provide meaningful benefits, but should not require a reduction in average benefit amounts per eligible applicant. Specifically, EAP plans to reduce the income eligibility guidelines to serve a number of households that is proportionate to any enacted cuts. For example:

Funding Cut % (from current)	Households Served	Income Eligibility Limit (State Median Income Percent)	Maximum Annual Income for Household of 4
0%	130,000	50%	\$71,999
10%	110-115,000	40%	\$57,599
20%	97-102,000	35%	\$50,399

40%	75-80,000	26%	\$37,439

Note that because of limitations on the percent of federal funding that can be spent administering the program, EAP Service Providers would not be able to process the same number of applications as in previous years with significantly less funding. Please comment on how these changes may impact:

Public Notice Regarding Changes to Payment Rates and Methodologies, and Services under the Medical Assistance Program

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to recipients, providers of services, and to the public of certain statutory changes made to the Medical Assistance (MA) Program that the 2025 Minnesota Legislature enacted during the regular session and 1st special session. This notice is published pursuant to 42 United States Code §1396a(a)(13)(A) (§1902(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act), which requires the Department to publish final institutional payment rates, the methodologies underlying the establishment of such rates, and the justification for such rates. It is also published pursuant to Code of Federal Regulations, title 42, part 447, section 205 (42 CFR § 447.205), which requires publication of a notice when there is any significant proposed change in the methods and standards for setting payment rates for Medicaid services.

Effective July 1, 2025, the Department will update the payment rates for inpatient hospital services delivered on a fee for service basis. The rate update is being completed in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 256.969 subd. 2b(h) which requires the Commissioner to update the rates every two years. The base years for this rate update are calendar years 2021 and 2022. This change is not expected to have a fiscal impact.

Effective the day following enactment, Minnesota Statute 256B.0625, subd. 30 is amended to clarify the process for setting a new rate when two existing Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) or Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) merge or when an existing clinic acquires another existing clinic. The rate for the new merged clinic must be developed using the combined costs and caseloads of the two existing clinics. The scope of services for the merged clinic must also be inclusive of the scope of the services of the clinics participating in the merger. This language also includes a provision that clarifies the scope of the mental health targeted case management (MH-TCM) services FQHCs and RHCs may provide. It stipulates that FQHCs and RHCs may not provide MH-TCM services unless they are under contract with a county. The county remains responsible for the non-federal share costs of the MH-TCM services provided by the FQHC or RHC. These changes are authorized by Laws of Minnesota 2025, First Special Session, Chapter 3, Article 8, section

15. These provisions are not expected to have a fiscal impact.

Effective July 1, 2025 the commissioner may make payments for Tribes according to section 256B.0625, subdivision 34, or other relevant federally approved rate setting methodologies for vulnerable adult and developmental disability targeted case management provided by Indian health services and facilities operated by a Tribe or Tribal organization. This change is authorized by Law of Minnesota 2025, First Special Session, Chapter 9, Article 2, section 25, subdivision 6, paragraph (m). It is not expected to have a fiscal impact.

Effective for services delivered on or after July 1, 2025, the fee-for-service payment rate for phototherapy services provided to newborns in the home setting incudes a \$520 service fee per patient episode. The commissioner shall provide an annual inflation adjustment for the service fee based on the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers. This change is authorized by Laws of Minnesota 2025, First Special Session, Chapter 3, Article 8, section 30. This change is estimated to result in a net spending increase of \$9,000 in state fiscal year 2026 and \$9,000 in state fiscal year 2027.

Effective July 1, 2025, Minnesota Statute 256B.0625, subd. 3b has been amended so that audio only telehealth is extended through July 1st 2027. This change is authorized by Laws of Minnesota 2025, First Special Session, Chapter 3, Article 8, Section 9. This change is expected to have a fiscal impact of \$18,861,000 for fiscal year 2026-2027 and \$1,793,000 for Fiscal year 2028-2029.

Effective July 1, 2025 the payment for newborn screening for metabolic disease is increased to \$242.35. This change is authorized by Laws of Minnesota 2025, First Special Session, Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 48. The change is expected to have a fiscal impact of \$500 in fiscal year 2026 and \$500 in fiscal year 2027.

The Minnesota Department of Commerce, Division of Energy Resources seeks applications from qualified Minnesota schools for the *Solar for Schools Grant Program*. Independent and Special School Districts, Tribal Contract Schools, Cooperative School Districts, and Minnesota State Colleges and Universities are eligible to apply for one or more grants valued up to 40-70% of the System's purchase and installation cost. Each district or college/university is eligible for grants up to \$500,000 if outside Xcel territory and \$675,000 if inside Xcel.
