

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Expedited Rules

Provisions exist for the Commissioners of some state agencies to adopt expedited rules when conditions exist that do not allow the Commissioner to comply with the requirements for normal rules. The Commissioner must submit the rule to the attorney general for review and must publish a notice of adoption that includes a copy of the rule and the conditions. Expedited rules are effective upon publication in the State Register, and may be effective up to seven days before

publication under certain conditions.

Expedited rules are effective for the period stated or up to 18 months. Specific *Minnesota Statute* citations accompanying these expedited rules detail the agency's rulemaking authority.

Proposed Expedited Permanent Game and Fish Rules on Fishing in Inland Waters; Notice of Intent to Adopt Expedited Rules without a Public Hearing

Proposed Amendment to Rules Governing Fishing Regulations for Inland Waters, *Minnesota Rules*, part 6262.0200; Revisor's File Number R-4955

Introduction. The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) intends to adopt rules under the expedited rulemaking process following the rules of the Court of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2410, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.389. You may submit written comments on the proposed expedited rules until Thursday, October 23, 2025.

Agency Contact Person. Subject of the Expedited Rules. The proposed expedited rules adjust Minnesota's regulations for fishing largemouth and smallmouth bass.

Minnesota Rules, part 6262.0200, subpart 1, item A. The proposed changes would create a new catch-and-release season for largemouth and smallmouth bass covering all portions of the annual calendar not already covered by either a harvest season or an existing catch-and-release season.

Statutory Authority. The statutory authorities to adopt these rules are:

- Minnesota Statutes, section 97C.395, subdivision 1, paragraph (a), clause (1), established the season for largemouth and smallmouth bass. In 2025, the legislature modified § 97C.395 and moved the largemouth and smallmouth bass season into subdivision 2 for species with a continuous season.
- Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.045, subdivision 1, directs the commissioner to do all things the commissioner
 determines necessary to preserve, protect, and propagate desirable species of wild animals, and to make special
 provisions for the management of fish and wildlife to ensure recreational opportunities for anglers and hunters.
- Minnesota Statutes, section 97A.045, subdivision 4, provides that the commissioner may regulate the taking, possession, and transportation of wild animals from state and international boundary waters.

The statutory authority to adopt the rules under the expedited rulemaking process is Minnesota Statutes, section 84.027, subdivision 13a, paragraph (b). The DNR is using the expedited permanent rulemaking procedure to complete the rules changes before the opening of Minnesota's spring fishing season on March 1, 2026, and to include the changes in the 2026 fishing regulations handbook.

Expedited Rules:

Publication of proposed rules. A copy of the proposed rules is published in the State Register and attached to this notice as mailed. A free copy of the rules is available upon request from the Agency Contact Person listed above. The proposed expedited rules may be viewed on the **DNR rulemaking webpage** at **mndnr.gov/input/rules**.

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 23, 2025, to submit written comment in support of or in opposition to the proposed expedited rules and any part or subpart of the rules. Your comment must be in writing and received by the Agency Contact Person by the due date. The DNR encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed expedited rules addressed and the reason for the comment. In addition, you are encouraged to propose any change desired. You must also make any comments that you have on the legality of the proposed rules during this comment period. If the proposed expedited rules affect you in any way, the DNR encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Request for Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. You must make your request in writing and the Agency Contact Person must receive it by 4:30 p.m. on October 23, 2025. Your written request must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed rules to which you object or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the DNR cannot count it for determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Withdrawal of Requests. If 50 or more persons submit a valid written request for a hearing, a public hearing will be held unless a sufficient number withdraw their requests in writing. If enough requests for hearing are withdrawn to reduce the number below 50, the DNR must give written notice of this to all persons who requested a hearing, explain the action the DNR took to effect the withdrawal, and ask for written comments on this action. If the DNR is required to hold a public hearing, it will follow the procedures in *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20.

Modifications. The DNR may modify the proposed expedited rules using either of two avenues: The DNR may modify the rules directly so long as the modifications do not make them substantially different as defined in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.05, subd. 2, paragraphs (b) and (c). Or the DNR may adopt substantially different rules if it follows the procedure under *Minnesota Rules*, part 1400.2110. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the State Register, the DNR will publish a notice of adoption in the State Register. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the State Register, the DNR must publish a copy of the changes in the State Register.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request, please contact the Agency Contact Person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Lobbyist Registration. *Minnesota Statutes*, chapter 10A, requires each lobbyist to register with the State Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board. Adoption and Review of Expedited Rules. If no hearing is required, the DNR may adopt the rules at the end of the comment period. The DNR will then submit rules and supporting documents to the Court of Administrative Hearings for review for legality. You may ask to be notified of the date that the DNR submits the rules. If you want to be so notified or want to receive a copy of the adopted rules or want to register with the DNR to receive notice of future rule proceedings, submit your request to the Agency Contact Person listed above.

Expedited Rules

6262.0200 FISHING REGULATIONS FOR INLAND WATERS.

Subpart 1. **General inland fishing regulations.** Fish may be taken in inland waters by angling during the time specified for each of the following species; however, certain waters of the state are subject to experimental or special regulations or are closed for taking and possessing fish. When the closing date of a season falls on a Saturday, the season extends through the following Sunday.

	Species and Open Season	Daily and Possession Limits
A.	Largemouth and smallmouth bass.	6 in aggregate.
(1)	In all waters lying east and north of U.S. Highway 53 from Duluth to International Falls and Pelican and Ash Lakes, St. Louis County.	
	From the Monday following the last Sunday in February through 11:59 p.m. the Friday two weeks before the Friday of Memorial Day weekend, angling for bass is limited to catch and release only. Any bass must be immediately returned to the water. It is unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any bass while on or fishing in these waters.	
	The Saturday two weeks before the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend through 11:59 p.m. the last Sunday in February is the harvest season.	
(2)	In all other waters.	
	From the Saturday two weeks before the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend Monday following the last Sunday in February through 11:59 p.m. the Friday before Memorial Day, angling for bass is limited to catch and release only. Any bass must be immediately returned to the water. It is unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any bass while on or fishing in these waters. The Saturday of Memorial Day weekend through 11:59 p.m. the last Sunday in February is the harvest season for largemouth bass.	
	The Saturday of Memorial Day weekend through 11:59 p.m. the second Sunday in September is the harvest season for smallmouth bass.	
	From the second Monday in September through the end of the season 11:59 p.m. the last Sunday in February, angling for smallmouth bass is limited to catch and release only. Any smallmouth bass must be immediately returned to the water and it is unlawful for anyone to have in possession, regardless of where taken, any smallmouth bass while on or fishing in these waters.

Modification of Revenue Notice # 06-08: Sales and Use Tax - Motor Vehicle Leases - Taxes and Fee

Background

Leases or rentals of most passenger automobiles, vans, and pickup trucks to customers in Minnesota for periods of no more than 28 days are subject to the 6.5 percent state and local sales tax and an additional 6taxes, the 9.2 percent motor vehicle rental tax. The transaction may also be subject to a and the 5 percent motor vehicle rental fee if the lessor does not meet a statutory exemption based upon sales activity in the previous calendar year. These leases may also be subject to a local sales tax if the vehicles are leased in a political subdivision with a local sales tax. This revenue notice sets forth the department's position on which amounts must be included in the tax base on which state and local sales taxes and the sales price of short-term motor vehicle rental fee are computed leases and rentals under Minnesota Statutes, section 297A.64.

Department Position

The taxes and fee on short-term vehicle leases and rentals are imposed upon the <u>sales price</u>, <u>which is the</u> total amount of consideration paid by the customer to the lessor subject to any exclusions from the sales price as defined under *Minnesota Statutes*, section 297A.61, subdivision 7. When computing state and local sales taxes, the <u>rental 9.2 percent motor</u> vehicle <u>rental tax</u>, and the 5 percent motor vehicle rental fee, the lessor would compute the taxes and fees on the <u>sales price</u>, <u>which would be the same base amount for each transaction that is subject to taxationtax or fee</u>.

The sales price includes any charges by the lessor for goods or services that are necessary to complete the transaction. Any mandatory charges are <u>also</u> part of the sales price when computing the taxes and fee. However, damage waiver fees and optional personal accident liability insurance are not part of the sales price.

The sales price also includes any taxes, charges, fees, or assessments that are legally imposed upon the lessor but that are passed on to the lessecustomer, even when separately stated on the invoice or bill to the lessecustomer. Any fees or charges, such as a facility usage fee or a franchise fee, that are imposed upon the lessor are part of the lessor's cost of doing business and are therefore part of the sales price. Examples of charges that are imposed upon the lessor, and included in the sales price, are the Concession Recovery Fee and the Rental Auto Facility Charge imposed by the Metropolitan Airports Commission. Any taxes imposed directly on the lessecustomer are excluded from the sales price if they are separately stated on the billing or invoice to the lessecustomer.

However, damage waiver fees and optional personal accident liability insurance are not part of the sales price.

Examples

A car rental firm leases a vehicle to a customer at its Minneapolis location. The lease is for a period of four days at the rate of \$30 per day. The total lease payment of \$120 would be subject to the state and local sales taxes, the 9.2 percent motor vehicle rental tax, and the 5 percent motor vehicle rental fee. 6.5 percent state sales tax, the 6.2 percent motor vehicle rental tax, the .15 percent Hennepin County tax, the .25 percent transit improvement tax, the 5 percent motor vehicle rental fee and the 0.5 percent Minneapolis city sales tax.

A car rental firm leases a vehicle to a customer at the Mpls.-St.Paul airport Minneapolis-St. Paul International

Airport for a day. The one-day rental rate is \$30. In addition to the daily rental charge there is a \$25.90 per day facility usage fee or Rental Auto Facility Charge and a Concession Recovery Fee of 9.511.11 percent which equals \$2.85 rounds to \$3.33. The total rental charge to the customer of \$39.23 is subject to state and local sales taxes, the 9.2 percent motor vehicle rental tax, and the 5 percent motor vehicle rental fee. The total rental tax, the .15 percent Hennepin County tax, the .25 percent transit improvement tax and the 5 percent motor vehicle rental fee.

Note: The Metropolitan Airports Commission sets rental auto facility charges and concession recovery fees under the authority of *Minnesota Statutes*, section 473.651 by ordinance. Thus, the rates for these charges and fees provided in the example are accurate only as of the date of publication of this Revenue Notice and are subject to change. Note should be made that the motor vehicle rental fee was increased from 3 to 5 percent effective July 1, 2008 and as of July 1, 2009, the 6.5 percent state sales tax rate will be increased to 6.875 percent.

Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI) Occupational Safety and Health Division Notice of Penalty Amounts

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry (DLI), pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes*, section 182.666, subdivision 6a, that the minimum and maximum penalties for violations of the Minnesota Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1973 listed in *Minnesota Statutes*, section 182.666, subdivisions 1 to 5, except

for the fine for a serious violation under section 182.653, subdivision 2, that causes or contributes to the death of an employee, will be increased as listed in the Federal Register, volume 90, published on January 10, 2025, to the corresponding federal penalties for occupational safety and health violations. The increase will become effective in Minnesota on October 1, 2025, and apply to all fines assessed on or after that date.

This will increase the maximum penalty for a willful or repeated violation from \$161,323 to \$165,514. The minimum penalty for a willful violation will increase from \$11,524 to \$11,823. The maximum penalty for failing to correct a violation will increase from \$16,131 to \$16,550 per day beyond the required abatement date. Maximum penalties for serious violations, non-serious violations, and posting requirement violations will increase from \$16,131 to \$16,550.

State Grants & Loans

Requirements: There are no statutes or rules requiring contracts to be advertised for any specific length of time, but the Office of State Procurement strongly recommends meeting the following requirements: \$0 - \$5000 does not need to be advertised; \$5,000 - \$25,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a period of at least seven calendar days; \$25,000 - \$50,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a period of at least 14 calendar days; and anything above \$50,000 should be advertised in the *State Register* for a minimum of at least 21 calendar days.
