

Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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Comments on Planned Rules or Rule Amendments. An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the *State Register* at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, and within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

Rules to be Adopted After a Hearing. After receiving comments and deciding to hold a public hearing on the rule, an agency drafts its rule. It then publishes its rules with a notice of hearing. All persons wishing to make a statement must register at the hearing. Anyone who wishes to submit written comments may do so at the hearing, or within five working days of the close of the hearing. Administrative law judges may, during the hearing, extend the period for receiving comments up to 20 calendar days. For five business days after the submission period the agency and interested persons may respond to any new information submitted during the written submission period and the record then is closed. The administrative law judge prepares a report within 30 days, stating findings of fact, conclusions and recommendations. After receiving the report, the agency decides whether to adopt, withdraw or modify the proposed rule based on consideration of the comments made during the rule hearing procedure and the report of the administrative law judge. The agency must wait five days after receiving the report before taking any action.

Rules to be Adopted Without a Hearing. Pursuant to *Minnesota Statutes* § 14.22, an agency may propose to adopt, amend, suspend or repeal rules without first holding a public hearing. An agency must first solicit **Comments on Planned Rules** or **Comments on Planned Rule Amendments** from the public. The agency then publishes a notice of intent to adopt rules without a public hearing, together with the proposed rules, in the *State Register*. If, during the 30-day comment period, 25 or more persons submit to the agency a written request for a hearing of the proposed rules, the agency must proceed under the provisions of §§ 14.1414.20, which state that if an agency decides to hold a public hearing, it must publish a notice of intent in the *State Register*.

Proposed Rules Governing K-12 Academic Standards in Health, Minnesota Rules, Chapter 3501

Introduction. The Department of Education (Department) intends to adopt rules after a public hearing following the procedures in the rules of the Court of Administrative Hearings, *Minnesota Rules*, parts 1400.2200 to 1400.2240, and the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, sections 14.131 to 14.20. A Dual Notice was originally published on December 15, 2025, which included the rule text and set hearing dates in March 2026. The proposed rules were posted and available for comments through the *Court of Administrative Hearings (CAH) Rulemaking eComments website* until 4:30 p.m. on February 9, 2026. Because more than 25 requests for hearing were received during the comment period, a hearing will be held on the proposed rules.

Due to a technical issue, the public hearings originally scheduled on March 16 and 17, 2026, are hereby **RESCHEDULED** as set forth below. This Notice of Hearing sets forth the new date, times, and information to join the public hearings. Please note that the pre-hearing comment period has closed but **the comment period will be reopened on the date of the hearing and will remain open for 20 days following the last hearing.**

Proposed Rules

The Department will hold two public hearings via WebEx video conferencing technology. The Honorable Ann O'Reilly, Administrative Law Judge, will preside.

Public Hearing. The Department will hold a virtual public hearing on the above-named rules **on April 13, 2026 at 2:00 pm and April 14, 2026 and 9:30 am.** You can participate in the virtual hearing, which will be conducted by the Administrative Law Judge via WebEx, by using the link along with the associated access code and password. The details for joining the hearings are set forth below.

The hearing on **April 13, 2026**, will commence at **2:00 p.m.** and will end at 6:00 p.m., or when the last person present has the opportunity to be heard, whichever comes first.

The hearing on **April 14, 2026**, will commence at **9:30 a.m.** and will end at 4:00 p.m., or when the last person present has the opportunity to be heard, whichever comes first.

Please note that because the hearings will end when the last person present has the opportunity to be heard, it is important that you attend at the start of the hearing. An electronic sign-up to speak at the hearing will open at the start of each hearing and will remain open during the hearing. Commenters will be heard in the order they sign up in the queue. **Because commenters are called in the order they sign up in the queue, it is important to attend at the start of the hearing to enter the queue when it is first opened.**

The agency will schedule additional days of hearing if necessary. All interested or affected persons will have an opportunity to participate by submitting either oral or written comments, statements, or arguments. Statements may be submitted without appearing at the hearing.

If the public hearing is postponed or rescheduled, the agency will send a notice of such a change to all persons and organizations listed on its additional notice plan, including those on the agency's rulemaking list. The agency will also post the notice of such a change on **Department's website** at <https://education.mn.gov/MDE/about/rule/rule/health>.

Subject of Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed rules are about adding K-12 Academic Standards in Health to Minnesota Rules Chapter 3501. Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.021 and **Laws of Minnesota 2024, chapter 115, article 2, section 21** authorize the Department to adopt rules for statewide K-12 academic standards in Health Education.

Proposed Rules

Minnesota has K-12 academic standards in several legislative-required content areas, including Health. Academic standards are essential because they help identify the student learning requirements for graduation and they serve as a guide for local curriculum adoption, development, and improvement. Student mastery of the academic standards is generally measured through local assessments.

In 2024, the Minnesota Legislature directed the Department to initiate rulemaking for statewide Academic Standards in Health Education. The proposed standards are based on extensive national research, committee experience, expert guidance, discussion, and stakeholder feedback. The proposed standards were developed in consultation with the Health Standards Committee, a committee of more than 30 members, which included parents of school-age children; members of the public from across the state; licensed health teachers; licensed elementary and secondary school principals; current members of local school boards and charter school boards; postsecondary faculty teaching core subjects; representatives from the Minnesota business community; representatives from Tribal Nations, the Tribal Nations Education Committee, and communities in Minnesota, including Anishinaabe and Dakota; and current students, with input from the Minnesota Youth Council. The proposed K-12 academic standards in Health Education form the foundation of skills-based health education by combining functional health knowledge with the development of essential health skills.

Publication of Proposed Rules. The proposed rules were published in the *State Register* on December 15, 2025. The proposed rules may be viewed at https://mn.gov/admin/assets/SR50_24_tcm36-716250.pdf and <https://education.mn.gov/MDE/dse/stds/hpe/healthstand/>. If mailed, a copy of the proposed rules is attached to this Notice. A free copy of the proposed rules is also available upon request from the agency contact person listed below.

Statement of Need and Reasonableness. The Statement of Need and Reasonableness (SONAR) summarizes the justification for the proposed rules, including a description of who will be affected by the proposed rules and an estimate of the probable costs of the proposed rules. The SONAR is now available from the agency contact person. You may review or obtain copies for the cost of reproduction by contacting the agency contact person. It is available at no cost on the *Department's website* at <https://education.mn.gov/MDE/about/rule/rule/health> and on the CAH Rulemaking Website at [<https://minnesotaoah.granicusideas.com/discussions>].

Public Comment and Hearing Procedure. All interested or affected persons, including representatives of associations or other interested groups, will have an opportunity to participate. You may present your views orally at the hearing or in writing at any time before the hearing record closes. All evidence presented should relate to the proposed rules. The Administrative Law Judge will hold the hearing record open for **20 calendar days following the hearing** to allow additional public comments and written material to be added to the hearing record. Following the post-hearing comment period, there is a five-working-day rebuttal period when the Department and any interested person may respond in writing to any new information submitted. However, **new evidence may not be submitted during the five-day rebuttal period.** The rebuttal period is only for rebuttal to previously submitted information.

All post-hearing comments and responses must be submitted to the Administrative Law Judge before 4:30 p.m. on the due date, which will be announced at the public hearing. The Court of Administrative **Hearings strongly encourages** all persons submitting comments and responses to do so using the *Court of Administrative Hearings Rulemaking eComments website* at <https://minnesotaoah.granicusideas.com/discussions>. If using the eComments website is not possible, you may submit post-hearing comments in person, via U.S. mail, or by facsimile to the agency contact person listed above. The agency contact person will upload all comments received to the CAH eComments website. All comments and responses will be available for public review on the eComment website and at the Department of Education. Comments will not be edited to remove identifying information or content.

The rule hearing procedure is governed by Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.131 to 14.20, and by the rules of the Court of Administrative Hearings, Minnesota Rules, parts 1400.2000 to 1400.2240. Alternative Format/Accommodation. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request or if you need an accommodation to make this hearing accessible, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Modifications. The Department might modify the proposed rules due to public comment or the rule hearing process. The Department must support modifications by data and views submitted to the Department or presented at the hearing. The adopted rules may not differ substantially from those proposed rules unless the Department follows the procedure under Minnesota Rules, part 1400.2110. If the proposed rules affect you in any way, the Department encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Adoption Procedure after the Hearing. After the close of the hearing record, the Administrative Law Judge will issue a report on the proposed rules. You may ask to be notified of the date that the Administrative Law Judge's report will become available and can make this request at the hearing or in writing to the Administrative Law Judge. You may also ask to be notified of the date that the agency adopts the rules and the rules are filed with the Secretary of State, or register with the agency to receive notice of future rule proceedings by requesting this at the hearing or by writing to the agency contact person stated above.

3501.1500 HEALTH EDUCATION STANDARDS.

Subpart 1. **Purpose and application.** The purpose of these standards is to establish statewide standards for health that govern instruction of students in kindergarten through grade 12.

Subp. 2. **Functional health.** The student will use functional health knowledge to enhance health and well-being.

Subp. 3. **Analyze influences.** The student will analyze influences that affect health and well-being.

Subp. 4. **Access valid and reliable information.** The student will access valid and reliable information, products, and services to enhance health and well-being.

Subp. 5. **Communication skills.** The student will demonstrate interpersonal communication skills to enhance health and well-being.

Subp. 6. **Decision making.** The student will demonstrate decision-making skills to enhance health and well-being.

Subp. 7. **Goal setting.** The student will demonstrate goal-setting skills to enhance health and well-being.

Subp. 8. **Practices and behaviors.** The student will demonstrate practices and behaviors to enhance health and well-being.

Proposed Rules

Subp. 9. **Promote health, safety, and well-being.** The student will promote health, safety, and well-being of self and others.

Subp. 10. **Apply knowledge and skills.** The student will combine content knowledge with practical skill development, as indicated by subpart 2, and apply what they learn to real-world health situations, as indicated in subparts 3 to 9, on various health-related topics, including but not limited to:

A. cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automatic external defibrillator education that allows districts to provide instruction to students in grades 7 through 12 in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.236;

B. vaping awareness and prevention education that allows districts to provide instruction to students in grades 6 through 8 in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.238, subdivision 3;

C. cannabis use and substance use education that allows districts to provide instruction to students in grades 6 through 12 in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.215;

D. sexually transmitted infections and diseases education that meets the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, section 121A.23; and

E. mental health education for students in grades 4 through 12 that includes prevention of suicide or self-harm and mental health components of the National Education Association standards for students in grades 4 through 12 in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.21.

Subp. 11. **Implementation.** These standards must be implemented by school districts by the beginning of the 2028-2029 school year.

Expedited Rules

The Minnesota Legislature allows for some agencies to use an expedited rulemaking process. Expedited rulemaking allows state agencies to adopt, amend or repeal rules faster than the standard process, generally without a public hearing. The agency must publish notice of the proposed rule in the State Register and must mail the notice by United States mail or electronic mail to persons who have registered with the agency to receive mailed notices (*Minnesota Statutes §14.389*). There must be a 30-day comment period after the notice is published in the *State Register*.

Before publication of the final rule in the *State Register*, the agency must submit the rule to an administrative law judge in the Court of Administrative Hearings. The administrative law judge shall within 14 days approve or disapprove the rule as to its legality and its form to the extent the form relates to legality. If the final rule is approved by the administrative law judge, it can then be published in the *State Register*. The rule is effective upon publication in the *State Register* (*Minnesota Statutes §14.389*).

Minnesota Department of Agriculture Division of Pesticide and Fertilizer Management Notice of Adoption of Revised Pesticide Management Plan

By this notice, the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is adopting the March 2026 revised version of the Minnesota Pesticide Management Plan (PMP). A copy of the newly adopted PMP is available at www.mda.state.mn.us/protecting/waterprotection/pmp. A total of six comments were received after the MDA solicited public comment on proposed revisions to the PMP in July 2025 (**50 SR 58**). The MDA's responses to relevant comments can be found on the *PMP webpage*. No substantial edits were made to the PMP based on comments received.

PMP Background Information. The PMP is a guidance document developed by the MDA to protect Minnesota's water resources from pesticide contamination and is a requirement of the Pesticide Control Law (*Minn. Stat. 18B.045*). In accordance with the law, the plan addresses the prevention, evaluation, and mitigation of occurrences of pesticides or pesticide breakdown products in groundwaters and surface waters of the state. The PMP was published in 1996 and last revised in 2007.

Background:


