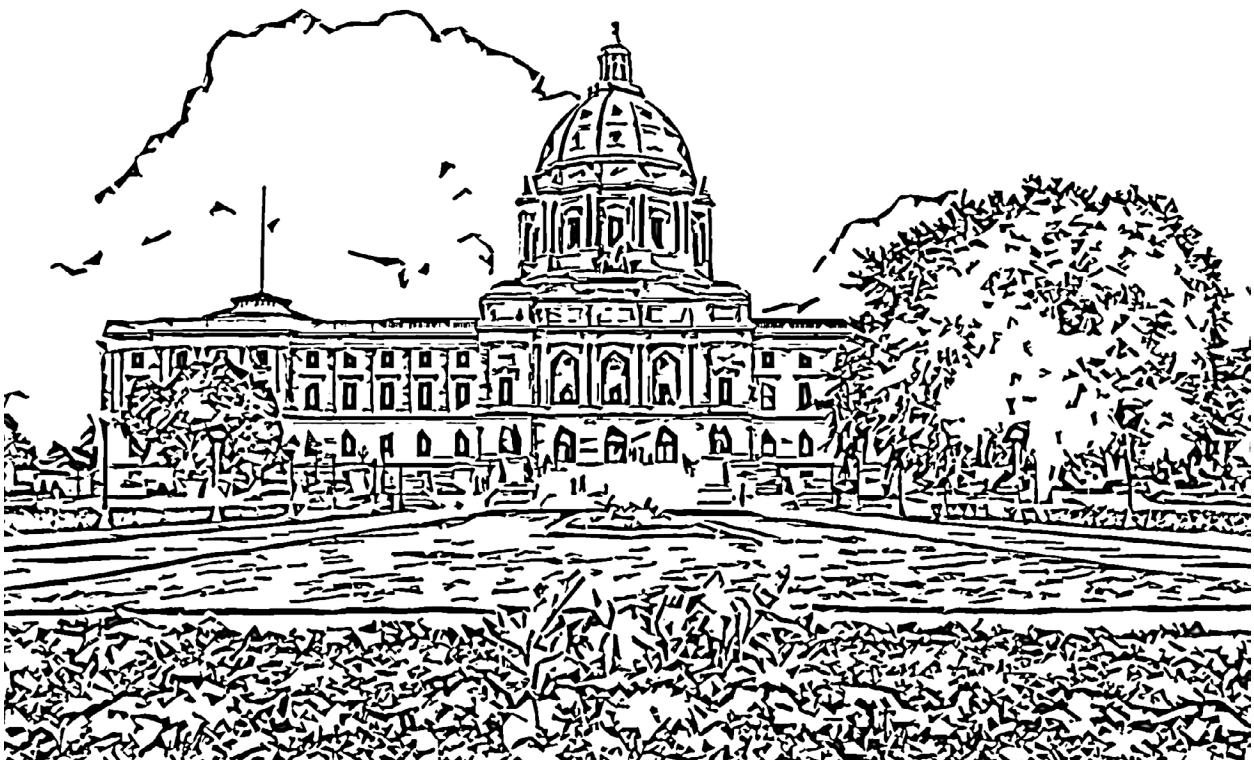

# Minnesota Rules: Amendments and Additions

NOTICE: How to Follow State Agency Rulemaking in the State Register

The State Register is the official source, and only complete listing, for all state agency rulemaking in its various stages. State agencies are required to publish notice of their rulemaking action in the State Register. Published every Monday, the State Register makes it easy to follow and participate in the important rulemaking process. Approximately 80 state agencies have the authority to issue rules. Each agency is assigned specific Minnesota Rule chapter numbers. Every odd-numbered year the Minnesota Rules are published. Supplements are published to update this set of rules. Generally speaking, proposed and adopted exempt rules do not appear in this set because of their short-term nature, but are published in the State Register.

An agency must first solicit Comments on Planned Rules or Comments on Planned Rule Amendments from the public on the subject matter of a possible rulemaking proposal under active consideration within the agency (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.101). It does this by publishing a notice in the State Register at least 60 days before publication of a notice to adopt or a notice of hearing, or within 60 days of the effective date of any new statutory grant of required rulemaking.

When rules are first drafted, state agencies publish them as Proposed Rules, along with a notice of hearing, or a notice of intent to adopt rules without a hearing in the case of noncontroversial rules. This notice asks for comment on the rules as proposed. Proposed emergency rules, and withdrawn proposed rules, are also published in the State Register. After proposed rules have gone through the comment period, and have been rewritten into their final form, they again appear in the State Register as Adopted Rules. These final adopted rules are not printed in their entirety, but only the changes made since their publication as Proposed Rules. To see the full rule, as adopted and in effect, a person simply needs two issues of the State Register, the issue the rule appeared in as proposed, and later as adopted.

The State Register features partial and cumulative listings of rules in this section on the following schedule: issues #1-26 inclusive (issue #26 cumulative for issues #1-26); issues #27-52 inclusive (issue #52, cumulative for issues #27-52 or #53 in some years). A subject matter index is updated weekly and is available upon request from the editor. 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# Adopted Rules

A rule becomes effective after the requirements of *Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.05-14.28 have been met and five working days after the rule is published in the *State Register*, unless a later date is required by statutes or specified in the rule. If an adopted rule is identical to its proposed form as previously published, a notice of adoption and a citation to its previous *State Register* publication will be printed. If an adopted rule differs from its proposed form, language which has been deleted will be printed with strikeouts and new language will be underlined. The rule's previous *State Register* publication will be cited.

**KEY: Proposed Rules** - Underlining indicates additions to existing rule language. ~~Strikeouts~~ indicate deletions from existing rule language. If a proposed rule is totally new, it is designated "all new material."  
**Adopted Rules** - Underlining indicates additions to proposed rule language. Strikeout indicates deletions from proposed rule language.

# Executive Orders

The governor has the authority to issue written statements or orders, called Executive Orders, as well as Emergency Executive Orders. The governor's authority is specified in the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, Article V, and in *Minnesota Statutes* § 4.035. Emergency Executive Orders, for protection from an imminent threat to health and safety, become effective immediately, are filed with the secretary of state, and published in the *State Register* as soon as possible after they are issued. Other Executive Orders become effective 15 days after publication in the *State Register* and filing with the secretary of state. Unless otherwise specified, an executive order expires 90 days after the date the governor who issued the order vacates office.

## Office of the Governor Emergency Executive Order 26-06: Providing Assistance to Winona County

I, Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, issue the following executive order:

On Monday, April 6, 2026, the County of Winona experienced a cyberattack that targeted critical systems and digital services. This cyberattack persisted overnight into Tuesday April 7, causing significant disruptions and impairing Winona County's ability to provide vital emergency and critical services.

Winona County officials have been working around the clock since discovering the cyberattack, closely coordinating with Minnesota Information Technology Services, the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, the League of Minnesota Cities, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and an external cybersecurity vendor. Unfortunately, the scale and complexity of this incident has exceeded both internal and commercial response capabilities. As a result, Winona County has requested cyber protection support from the Minnesota National Guard to help address this incident and make sure that vital municipal services continue without interruption.

For these reasons, I order as follows:

1. The Adjutant General is authorized to order to state active duty the personnel, equipment, facilities, and

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resources needed to provide assistance throughout Minnesota.

2. The Adjutant General is authorized to procure the goods and services needed to accomplish the mission.
3. The costs of this assistance shall be paid from the general fund as allowed by Minnesota Statutes 2025, section 192.52.

This Executive Order is effective immediately under Minnesota Statutes 2025, section 4.035, subd. 2, and remains in effect until the emergency conditions caused by the cyberattack subside or until it is rescinded by proper authority, whichever occurs first.

A determination that any provision of this Executive Order is invalid will not affect the enforceability of any other provision of this Executive Order. Rather, the invalid provision will be modified to the extent necessary so that it is enforceable.

### Notice of Public Hearing on a Proposal to Finance and Refinance Projects and the Issuance of Obligations Under Minnesota Statutes, Sections 41A.01 to 41A.08 and Sections 469.152 Through 469.165

**NOTICE IS GIVEN** that the Minnesota Agricultural and Economic Development Board (the “Issuer”) will meet on Monday, April 27, 2026 at 11a.m., or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible, at the offices of the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development located at Great Northern Building, 180 5<sup>th</sup> Street East, Suite 1200, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55101 to conduct a public hearing on the proposed plan of finance and refinance described in the following paragraphs of this notice.

The proposed plan of finance is for the Issuer to issue revenue obligations (the “Obligations”) in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$32,000,000 in one or more series, whether taxable or tax exempt, under Minnesota Statutes, Sections 41A.01 to 41A.08 and 469.152 through 469.165, as amended (collectively, the “Act”), to finance and refinance projects owned, operated and managed by Benedictine Health System d/b/a Benedictine, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation and organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the “Code”) and its affiliates, including without limitation: Benedictine Living Community Anoka LLC, Madonna Meadows of Rochester, Madonna Towers of Rochester, Inc., and Mother of Mercy (together, the “Borrower”). The Obligations will

be “qualified 501(c)(3) bonds” under the Code. The obligations of the Borrower will be secured by Master Notes issued by Benedictine under a Master Trust Indenture between Benedictine as obligated group agent and U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association, successor in interest to U.S. Bank National Association, as master trustee, on behalf of an obligated group consisting of Benedictine Care Centers, Benedictine Health Center, Benedictine Living Communities, Inc., Benedictine Living Community of Wahpeton, Benedictine Living Community of Wahpeton, LLC, Bridges Care Center, City of Lakes Care Center, Ellendale Evergreen Place, Inc., Benedictine Living Community Owatonna, Madonna Meadows of Rochester, Madonna Summit of Byron, LLC, Madonna Towers of Rochester, Inc., Regina Senior Living, Saint Anne of Winona, St. Gertrude’s Health Center, Steeple Pointe Senior Living Community, Villa St. Vincent, Benedictine Living Community-Anoka and Mother of Mercy and other members that may be added to the obligated group in the future, if approved by Benedictine, as obligated group agent.

Proceeds of the Obligations in the approximate amount of \$19,000,000 are expected to be used to finance, refinance and reimburse all or a portion of the costs for the constructing, improving, renovating, furnishing and equipping senior housing, other than independent living facilities, and related health care facilities in the approximate principal amounts at the locations indicated below (the “New Money Projects”):

- (1) \$11,000,000 for facilities of Madonna Towers of Rochester, Inc., at 4001 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW, Rochester, Minnesota;
- (2) \$1,200,000 for facilities of Madonna Meadows of Rochester at 3035 Salem Meadows Drive SW, Rochester, Minnesota; and
- (3) \$6,800,000 for facilities of Mother of Mercy at 230 Church Avenue, Albany, Minnesota.

In addition, proceeds of the Obligations in the approximate amount of \$13,000,000 are expected to be used to refinance the following debt obligations in the approximate outstanding principal amounts shown below, issued for the benefit of the Borrower, the proceeds of which were used to finance, refinance and reimburse the costs of constructing, improving, renovating, furnishing and equipping senior housing, other than independent living facilities, and health care facilities, at the locations indicated below:

- (1) \$5,018,000 Health Care Facilities Revenue Refunding Note, Series 2013 (Mother of Mercy Campus of Care Project) and a loan from the United States Department of Agriculture - Rural Development both issued to finance capital improvements at facilities of Mother of Mercy located at 230 Church Avenue, Albany, Minnesota with a combined current balance of approximately \$4,750,000; and
- (2) Refinance taxable debt in the approximate amount of \$8,250,000 incurred by Benedictine Living Community Anoka LLC at 910 Western Street, Anoka, MN 55303.

The “Refinanced Projects” together with the New Money Projects are referred to as the “Projects”

The Borrower, at its discretion, may allocate up to the entire maximum principal amount of the Obligations to any of the above described projects to finance, refinance or reimburse all, a part, or none of the improvements at each location. Proceeds of the Obligations may also be used to pay costs of issuance of the Obligations.

The Obligations and the interest thereon will be limited obligations of the Issuer. The Obligations and the interest thereon will be payable solely from the revenue pledged to the payment thereof and other forms of security to be provided by or on behalf of the Borrower. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no holders of any of the Obligations will ever have the right to compel any exercise of the taxing powers of the State of Minnesota or any political subdivision thereof to pay the Obligations or the interest thereon or to enforce payment against any property of the State of Minnesota or any political subdivision thereof.

### Substance Use Disorder changes

This change is expected to have a savings of \$4,169,224 in fiscal year 2027 and \$6,050,940 in fiscal year 2028.
